SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 648

A bill to amend 1974 PA 163, entitled "L.E.I.N. policy council act of 1974," by amending the title and sections 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 (MCL 28.211, 28.212, 28.213, 28.214, and 28.215), section 4 as amended by 2000 PA 320, and by adding sections 1a and 3a; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 TITLE
- 2 An act to provide for the creation of a -law enforcement
- 3 information network CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEMS policy
- 4 council; to provide for the establishment of policy and
- 5 promulgation of rules governing the use of the law enforcement

- 1 information network ACCESS, USE, AND DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION IN
- 2 CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEMS; -and- to provide for the
- 3 appointment and compensation REIMBURSEMENT of EXPENSES OF council
- 4 members; AND TO PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES.
- 5 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 6 "L.E.I.N." "C.J.I.S. policy council act". -of 1974".
- 7 SEC. 1A. AS USED IN THIS ACT:
- 8 (A) "COUNCIL" MEANS THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION POLICY
- 9 COUNCIL CREATED IN SECTION 2.
- 10 (B) "NONPUBLIC INFORMATION" MEANS INFORMATION TO WHICH ACCESS,
- 11 USE, OR DISSEMINATION IS RESTRICTED BY A LAW OR RULE OF THIS STATE
- 12 OR THE UNITED STATES.
- Sec. 2. (1) There is created the law enforcement information
- 14 network— THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION policy council —
- 15 hereafter referred to as the council, comprised IS CREATED IN THE
- 16 DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE. THE COUNCIL IS COMPOSED of the
- 17 following members:
- 18 (a) The attorney general —, or his designated representative
- 19 OR HER DESIGNEE.
- 20 (b) The secretary of state or his designated
- 21 representative OR HER DESIGNEE.
- 22 (c) The director of the department of corrections or his
- 23 designated representative OR HER DESIGNEE.
- 24 (d) The <u>commissioner</u> CHIEF of the Detroit police department
- 25 , or his designated representative OR HER DESIGNEE.
- 26 (E) THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE OR HIS OR
- 27 HER DESIGNEE.

- 1 (F) —(e) Three representatives of the department of state
- 2 police -, to be appointed by the director of the department of
- 3 state police.
- 4 (G) $\overline{\text{(f)}}$ Three representatives of the Michigan association of
- 5 chiefs of police -, to be appointed -annually by that
- 6 association.
- 7 (H) -(g) Three FOUR representatives of the Michigan sheriffs'
- 8 association -, to be appointed -annually by that association.
- 9 (I) (h) Three representatives of the prosecuting attorneys
- 10 association of Michigan -to be appointed -annually by that
- 11 association.
- 12 (J) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MICHIGAN DISTRICT JUDGES
- 13 ASSOCIATION APPOINTED BY THAT ASSOCIATION.
- 14 (K) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MICHIGAN JUDGES ASSOCIATION
- 15 APPOINTED BY THAT ASSOCIATION.
- 16 (1) THE STATE COURT ADMINISTRATOR OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE.
- 17 (M) AN INDIVIDUAL APPOINTED BY AND SERVING AT THE PLEASURE OF
- 18 THE GOVERNOR WHO IS EMPLOYED IN OR ENGAGED IN THE PRIVATE SECURITY
- 19 BUSINESS.
- 20 (N) AN INDIVIDUAL APPOINTED BY AND SERVING AT THE PLEASURE OF
- 21 THE GOVERNOR WHO REPRESENTS HUMAN SERVICES CONCERNS IN THIS STATE.
- 22 (O) THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY
- 23 OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE.
- 24 (2) THE APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL SHALL SERVE 2-YEAR
- 25 TERMS AND MAY BE REAPPOINTED.
- Sec. 3. (1) The council, -shall, at its first meeting, SHALL
- 27 elect from its membership a -chairman CHAIRPERSON, who shall serve

- 1 for 1 year. Elections thereafter AN ELECTION FOR CHAIRPERSON
- 2 shall be held annually. A -chairman may CHAIRPERSON, if reelected,
- 3 MAY succeed himself OR HERSELF. The council shall meet quarterly -
- 4 during the months of January, April, July, AND October -, and at
- 5 other times the chairman deems necessary OR MORE FREQUENTLY AT THE
- 6 CALL OF THE CHAIRPERSON.
- 7 (2) Council members shall serve without compensation, but
- 8 shall be ARE entitled to actual expenses incurred during
- 9 attendance at a regular or special council meeting and in traveling
- 10 to and from a meeting.
- 11 (3) A MAJORITY OF COUNCIL MEMBERS CONSTITUTE A QUORUM FOR
- 12 CONDUCTING THE BUSINESS OF THE COUNCIL
- 13 SEC. 3A. (1) THE COUNCIL SHALL EXERCISE ITS PRESCRIBED POWERS,
- 14 DUTIES, FUNCTIONS, AND RESPONSIBILITIES INDEPENDENTLY OF THE
- 15 DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE. THE BUDGETING,
- 16 PROCUREMENT, AND RELATED MANAGEMENT FUNCTIONS OF THE COUNCIL SHALL
- 17 BE PERFORMED UNDER THE DIRECTION AND SUPERVISION OF THE DIRECTOR OF
- 18 THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE.
- 19 (2) THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY OF THE COUNCIL SHALL BE APPOINTED
- 20 BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE SUBJECT TO THE
- 21 APPROVAL OF THE COUNCIL.
- 22 Sec. 4. (1) The council shall do all of the following:
- 23 (a) Establish policy and promulgate rules -regarding the
- 24 operational procedures to be followed by agencies using GOVERNING
- 25 ACCESS, USE, AND DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE
- 26 INFORMATION SYSTEMS, INCLUDING the law enforcement information
- 27 network, THE AUTOMATED FINGERPRINT INFORMATION SYSTEM, AND OTHER

- 1 INFORMATION SYSTEMS RELATED TO CRIMINAL JUSTICE OR LAW ENFORCEMENT.
- 2 The policy and rules shall do all of the following:
- 3 (i) ENSURE ACCESS TO INFORMATION OBTAINED BY A FEDERAL, STATE,
- 4 OR LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY TO ADMINISTER CRIMINAL JUSTICE OR
- 5 ENFORCE ANY LAW.
- 6 (ii) -(i) Ensure access to -locator information -obtained
- 7 through PROVIDED BY the law enforcement information network by
- 8 state and federal agencies and the friend of the court for OR THE
- 9 AUTOMATED FINGERPRINT IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM BY A GOVERNMENTAL
- 10 AGENCY ENGAGED IN THE enforcement of child support programs as
- 11 provided under state and federal law LAWS, CHILD PROTECTION LAWS,
- 12 OR VULNERABLE ADULT PROTECTION LAWS.
- 13 (ii) Ensure access to information of an individual being
- 14 investigated by a state or county employee who is engaged in the
- 15 enforcement of the child protection laws or rules of this state.
- 16 (iii) Authorize a fire chief of an organized fire department or
- 17 his or her designee to request and receive information obtained
- 18 through the law enforcement information network by a law
- 19 enforcement agency for the following purposes:
- 20 (A) A preemployment criminal convictions history.
- 21 (B) A preemployment driving record.
- 22 (C) Vehicle registration information for vehicles involved in
- 23 a fire or hazardous materials incident.
- 24 (iv) Authorize a public or private school superintendent,
- 25 principal, or assistant principal to receive vehicle registration
- 26 information, of a vehicle within 1,000 feet of school property,
- 27 obtained through the law enforcement information network by a law

- 1 enforcement agency.
- 2 (v) AUTHORIZE THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, THE COURT, OR A
- 3 PROSECUTING ATTORNEY TO DISCLOSE TO A DEFENDANT, OR AN ATTORNEY OF
- 4 RECORD REPRESENTING THAT DEFENDANT, INFORMATION PERTAINING TO THAT
- 5 DEFENDANT.
- 6 (vi) ESTABLISH FEES FOR ACCESS, USE, OR DISSEMINATION OF
- 7 INFORMATION FROM CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEMS.
- 8 (b) Review applications for -network terminals C.J.I.S.
- 9 ACCESS and approve or disapprove the applications and the sites.
- 10 for terminal installations. If an application is disapproved, the
- 11 applicant shall be notified in writing of the reasons for
- 12 disapproval.
- 13 (c) Establish minimum standards for terminal sites EQUIPMENT
- 14 AND SOFTWARE and ITS installation.
- 15 (D) ADVISE THE GOVERNOR ON ISSUES CONCERNING THE CRIMINAL
- 16 JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEMS.
- 17 (2) A PERSON HAVING DIRECT ACCESS TO NONPUBLIC INFORMATION IN
- 18 THE INFORMATION SYSTEMS GOVERNED BY THIS ACT SHALL SUBMIT A SET OF
- 19 FINGERPRINTS FOR COMPARISON WITH STATE AND FEDERAL CRIMINAL HISTORY
- 20 RECORDS TO BE APPROVED FOR ACCESS PURSUANT TO THE C.J.I.S. SECURITY
- 21 POLICY. A REPORT OF THE COMPARISON SHALL BE PROVIDED TO THAT
- 22 PERSON'S EMPLOYER.
- 23 (3) $\frac{(2)}{}$ A person shall not ACCESS, USE, OR disclose
- 24 NONPUBLIC information from the law enforcement information network
- 25 to a private entity for any purpose, including, but not limited to,
- 26 the enforcement of child support programs GOVERNED UNDER THIS ACT
- 27 FOR PERSONAL USE OR GAIN.

- 1 (4) -(3) A person shall not disclose information -from the
- 2 law enforcement information network GOVERNED UNDER THIS ACT in a
- 3 manner that is not authorized by law or rule.
- 4 (5) -(4) A person who **INTENTIONALLY** violates subsection -(2)
- 5 or (3) OR (4) is GUILTY OF A CRIME AS FOLLOWS:
- 6 (a) For a first offense, **THE PERSON IS** quilty of a misdemeanor
- 7 punishable by imprisonment for not more than -90 93 days or a fine
- 8 of not more than \$500.00, or both.
- 9 (b) For a second or subsequent offense, THE PERSON IS guilty
- 10 of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or
- 11 a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or both.
- 12 Sec. 5. The council may -remove terminals DO ANY OF THE
- 13 FOLLOWING:
- 14 (A) AUTHORIZE ACCESS TO PUBLIC RECORD INFORMATION TO ENHANCE
- 15 PUBLIC SAFETY OR CRIMINAL JUSTICE, AS PERMITTED BY LAW.
- 16 (B) SUSPEND OR DENY THE USE OF, AND ACCESS TO, INFORMATION OR
- 17 REMOVE ACCESS FROM AN AGENCY if the agency or entity controlling
- 18 the terminal fails to comply with the established VIOLATES
- 19 policies or promulgated rules of the council.
- 20 (C) SUSPEND OR DENY DIRECT ACCESS TO INFORMATION TO AN
- 21 INDIVIDUAL WHO VIOLATES THIS ACT, POLICIES, OR PROMULGATED RULES OF
- 22 THE COUNCIL.
- 23 Enacting section 1. The following acts and parts of acts are
