A bill to provide for a capital outlay program; to set forth the provisions for its implementation within the budgetary process; to make appropriations for planning and construction at state institutions and the acquisition of land; to provide for the elimination of fire hazards at the institutions; to provide for certain special maintenance, remodeling, alteration, renovation, or demolition of and additions to projects at state institutions; to provide for elimination of occupational safety and health hazards at state agencies and institutions; to provide for the award of contracts; to provide for expenditures under the supervision of the director of the department of management and budget and the state administrative board; to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for various state departments and agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2007; and to provide for the

11     Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures  
 12 authorized under this part and the departments, agencies,  
 13 commissions, boards, offices, and programs for which an  
 14 appropriation is made under part 1 are subject to the management  
 15 and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

16     Sec. 203. If it appears to the principal executive officer of  
 17 a department or branch that state spending to local units of  
 18 government will be less than the amount that was projected to be  
 19 expended under this act, the principal executive officer shall  
 20 immediately give notice of the approximate shortfall to the state  
 21 budget director.

22     Sec. 204. As used in this act:

23         (a) "ADA" means the Americans with disabilities act.

24         (b) "Board" means the state administrative board.

25         (c) "Community college" does not include a state agency or  
 26 university.

27         (d) "Department" means the department of management and

1 budget.

2 (e) "Director" means the director of the department of  
3 management and budget.

4 (f) "DAG" means the United States department of agriculture.

5 (g) "DOD" means the United States department of defense.

6 (h) "DOI" means the United States department of interior.

7 (i) "DOT" means the United States department of  
8 transportation.

9 (j) "Fiscal agencies" means the senate fiscal agency and the  
10 house fiscal agency.

11 (k) "ICF/MR" means intermediate care facilities for the  
12 mentally retarded.

13 (l) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.

14 (m) "JCOS" means the joint capital outlay subcommittee of the  
15 appropriations committees.

16 (n) "Self-liquidating project" means a project constructed by  
17 a community college or university with money raised through the use  
18 of a debt instrument or other fund sources including, but not  
19 limited to, gifts, grants, federal funds, or institutional sources,  
20 that is expected to generate revenues to amortize the loan. A self-  
21 liquidating project may or may not be a self-supporting project.  
22 Examples of a self-liquidating project include dormitories, parking  
23 facilities, and stadia.

24 (o) "Self-supporting project" means a project of a community  
25 college or university that will house a function or activity from  
26 which revenue is generated that will cover all the direct and  
27 indirect operating costs of the project without the additional

1 transfer of any other general fund money of the community college  
2 or university.

3 (p) "State agency" means an agency of state government. State  
4 agency does not include a community college or university.

5 (q) "State building authority" means the authority created  
6 under 1964 PA 183, MCL 830.411 to 830.425.

7 (r) "University" means a 4-year university supported by the  
8 state. University does not include a community college or a state  
9 agency.

10 (s) "Utility system" means a utility supply or distribution  
11 system, or a combination utility supply and distribution system.

12 Sec. 205. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for  
13 the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if  
14 competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods,  
15 services, or both, are available. Preference should be given to  
16 goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan  
17 businesses if they are competitively priced and of comparable  
18 quality.

19 Sec. 206. Unless otherwise specified, departments and agencies  
20 receiving appropriations in part 1 shall use the Internet to  
21 fulfill the reporting requirements of this act. This requirement  
22 may include transmission of reports via electronic mail to the  
23 recipients identified for each reporting requirement or it may  
24 include placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.

25 **DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE**

26 Sec. 301. Of the amounts appropriated in part 1 for farmland

1 and open space development acquisition, the funds shall be used for  
2 the purchase of development rights and the awarding of grants by  
3 the agriculture preservation fund board under the natural resources  
4 and environmental protection act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.101 to  
5 324.90106.

#### 6 **DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS**

7       Sec. 401. A maximum security prison that is constructed or  
8 completed after October 1, 1986 shall have operating staffed  
9 watchtowers equipped with the weaponry, lighting, sighting, and  
10 communications devices necessary for effective execution of its  
11 function. The watchtowers shall be constructed pursuant to the  
12 American correctional association standards for watchtowers.

13       Sec. 402. (1) An appropriation and authorization contained in  
14 this act or a previous appropriations act for the construction of a  
15 new correctional facility, including a correctional camp, for which  
16 a specific site was not identified with the appropriation shall not  
17 be expended until approved by JCOS.

18       (2) For the purposes of this section, "site" means a city,  
19 village, township, or county in which a correctional facility may  
20 be located.

#### 21 **CAPITAL OUTLAY PROCESSES, PROCEDURES, AND REPORTS**

22       Sec. 501. Each capital outlay project authorized in this act  
23 or any previous capital outlay act shall comply with the procedures  
24 required by the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101  
25 to 18.1594.

1       Sec. 502. A statement of a proposed facility's operating cost  
2 shall be included with the facility's program statement and  
3 planning documents when the plans are presented to JCOS for  
4 approval.

5       Sec. 503. (1) Before proceeding with final planning and  
6 construction for projects at community colleges and universities  
7 included in an appropriations bill, the community college or  
8 university shall sign an agreement with the department that  
9 includes the following provisions:

10       (a) The university or community college agrees to construct  
11 the project within the total authorized cost established by the  
12 legislature pursuant to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,  
13 MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594, and an appropriations act.

14       (b) The design and program scope of the project shall not  
15 deviate from the design and program scope represented in the  
16 program statement and preliminary planning documents approved by  
17 the department.

18       (c) Any other items as identified by the department that are  
19 necessary to complete the project.

20       (2) The department retains the authority and responsibility  
21 normally associated with the prudent maintenance of the public's  
22 financial and policy interests relative to the state-financed  
23 construction projects managed by a community college or university.

24       Sec. 504. (1) The department shall provide JCOS and the fiscal  
25 agencies with reports as considered necessary relative to the  
26 status of each planning or construction project financed by the  
27 state building authority, by this act, or by previous acts.

1 (2) Before the end of each fiscal year, the department shall  
2 report to JCOS and the fiscal agencies for each capital outlay  
3 project other than lump sums all of the following:

4 (a) The account number and name of each construction project.

5 (b) The balance remaining in each account.

6 (c) The date of the last expenditure from the account.

7 (d) The anticipated date of occupancy if the project is under  
8 construction.

9 (e) The appropriations history for the project.

10 (f) The professional service contractor.

11 (g) The amount of a project financed with federal funds.

12 (h) The amount of a project financed through the state  
13 building authority.

14 (i) The total authorized cost for the project and the state  
15 authorized share if different than the total.

16 (3) Before the end of each fiscal year, the department shall  
17 report the following for each project by a state agency,  
18 university, or community college that is authorized for planning  
19 but is not yet authorized for construction:

20 (a) The name of the project and account number.

21 (b) Whether a program statement is approved.

22 (c) Whether schematics are approved by the department.

23 (d) Whether preliminary plans are approved by the department.

24 (e) The name of the professional service contractor.

25 (4) As used in this section, "project" includes appropriation  
26 line items made for purchase of real estate.

27 Sec. 505. (1) If a capital outlay appropriation is contained

1 in a public act that was not reviewed by JCOS during the  
2 legislative process, the director shall notify JCOS of an  
3 expenditure of that capital outlay appropriation not less than 60  
4 days before the expenditure.

5 (2) For the purposes of this section, "capital outlay  
6 appropriation" means an appropriation that provides for the  
7 construction, renovation, or repair of a capital facility or  
8 acquisition or development of land and that is normally reviewed by  
9 JCOS.

10 Sec. 506. A state agency, college, or university shall take  
11 steps necessary to make available federal and other money indicated  
12 in this act, to make available federal or other money that may  
13 become available for the purposes for which appropriations are made  
14 in this act, and to use any part or all of the appropriations to  
15 meet matching requirements that are considered to be in the best  
16 interest of this state. However, the purpose, scope, and total  
17 estimated cost of a project shall not be altered to meet the  
18 matching requirements.

19 Sec. 507. (1) Before money is released for the construction or  
20 lease of a capital outlay project costing over \$1,000,000.00, at  
21 the request of JCOS the department shall submit to JCOS, with  
22 preliminary planning documents, a detailed comparative cost  
23 analysis. The cost analysis shall include a comparison of the  
24 financial and other benefits of construction, financing, operation,  
25 and maintenance of the proposed facility between all of the  
26 following:

27 (a) The state.

1 (b) The private sector.

2 (c) A combination of the state and the private sector.

3 (d) A lease agreement.

4 (2) If the department's recommendation for financing is  
5 inconsistent with the findings of the comparative cost analysis,  
6 the department shall present written documentation to JCOS  
7 outlining the rationale for the recommendation.

8 (3) For purposes of this section, "capital outlay project"  
9 means a construction project or lease requiring JCOS approval  
10 including, but not limited to, a general office facility, special  
11 use facility, warehouse, institutional facility, or utility system  
12 designed for use by a state agency or university. Capital outlay  
13 project does not include a special maintenance and remodeling  
14 project, grant-in-aid project, prison facility, legislative  
15 facility, judicial facility, community college facility, or self-  
16 liquidating project constructed by a university.

17 Sec. 508. Pursuant to section 242(2) of the management and  
18 budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1242, the department shall submit  
19 5-year capital outlay plans and capital outlay priority requests  
20 developed by state agencies (and as approved by the department of  
21 management and budget), universities, and community colleges to the  
22 chairperson and ranking vice-chairperson of JCOS and the fiscal  
23 agencies upon the release of the executive budget recommendation.

#### 24 **USE AND FINANCE STATEMENTS**

25 Sec. 601. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3),  
26 a university shall not enter into a contract for new construction



1 of a self-funded project estimated to cost more than \$3,000,000.00  
2 unless the project is authorized by JCOS through approval of a use  
3 and finance statement defined by a policy adopted by JCOS. The  
4 request for authorization shall be initially submitted for review  
5 to JCOS, the senate and house fiscal agencies, and the department.  
6 The use and finance statement for a non-state-funded project shall  
7 contain the estimated total construction cost and all associated  
8 estimated operating costs, including a statement of anticipated  
9 project revenues. As used in this subsection, "new construction"  
10 includes land or property acquisition, remodeling and additions,  
11 maintenance projects, roads, landscaping, equipment,  
12 telecommunications, utilities, and parking lots and structures.  
13 Certificate of need forms may be submitted in lieu of a use and  
14 finance form where applicable.

15 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3), a  
16 community college shall not enter into a contract for new  
17 construction of a self-funded project estimated to cost more than  
18 \$2,000,000.00 unless the project is authorized by JCOS through  
19 approval of a use and finance statement defined by a policy adopted  
20 by JCOS. The request for legislative authorization shall be  
21 initially submitted for review to JCOS, the senate and house fiscal  
22 agencies, and the department. The use and finance statement for a  
23 non-state-funded project shall contain the estimated total  
24 construction cost and all associated estimated operating costs,  
25 including a statement of anticipated project revenues. As used in  
26 this subsection, "new construction" includes land or property  
27 acquisition, remodeling and additions, maintenance projects, roads,

1 landscaping, equipment, telecommunications, utilities, and parking  
2 lots and structures. Certificate of need forms may be submitted in  
3 lieu of a use and finance form where applicable.

4 (3) The University of Michigan Hospital and Health Center is  
5 not required to obtain JCOS authorization through approval of a use  
6 and finance statement defined by a policy adopted by JCOS.

7 (4) If health or safety concerns warrant, a project may be  
8 completed without prior approval of a use and finance statement  
9 defined by a policy adopted by JCOS. However, a university or  
10 community college shall submit a use and finance statement as soon  
11 as possible after the project is completed and the health or safety  
12 concerns have abated.

13 (5) A project that is constructed in violation of this section  
14 shall not receive state appropriations for purposes of operating  
15 the project or for support for future infrastructure enhancements  
16 that are necessitated, in whole or in part, by construction of the  
17 project. In addition, a project constructed in violation of this  
18 section shall result in the loss of any state capital outlay  
19 funding for the institution for 2 years and a prohibition of doing  
20 self-funded projects of any kind, except for emergencies where  
21 health or safety concerns warrant, for 1 year.

22 (6) A state agency, including the department of military  
23 affairs, shall not enter into a contract, including those for a  
24 direct federally-funded capital outlay construction or major  
25 maintenance or remodeling project if the total project is estimated  
26 to cost more than \$1,000,000.00 and is to be constructed on state-  
27 owned lands unless the project is approved by the department and

1 JCOS through approval of a use and finance statement defined by a  
2 policy adopted by JCOS, unless the project is otherwise  
3 appropriated in a capital outlay appropriations bill. For projects  
4 not appropriated in a capital outlay appropriations bill that are  
5 over \$1,000,000.00, the state agency shall submit a use and finance  
6 statement defined by a policy adopted by JCOS. As used in this  
7 subsection, "direct federally-funded" refers to a project for which  
8 federal payments are made directly to the construction vendor and  
9 not to the state of Michigan.

10 (7) A public body corporate created under section 28 of  
11 article VII of the state constitution of 1963 and the urban  
12 cooperation act of 1967, 1967 (Ex Sess) PA 7, MCL 124.501 to  
13 124.512, by a contractual interlocal agreement between local  
14 participating economic development corporations formed under the  
15 economic development corporations act, 1974 PA 338, MCL 125.1601 to  
16 125.1636, and the Michigan strategic fund shall not enter into a  
17 contract for new construction estimated to cost more than  
18 \$1,000,000.00 unless the project is authorized by JCOS through the  
19 approval of a use and finance statement defined by a policy adopted  
20 by JCOS. For purposes of this subsection, the use and finance  
21 statement for a project shall contain the estimated total  
22 construction cost and all associated estimated operating costs. As  
23 used in this subsection, "new construction" means land or property  
24 acquisition, remodeling or additions, lease or lease purchase, and  
25 maintenance projects for the corporate office of the public body  
26 corporate described in this subsection.

1    **LUMP SUMS AND SPECIAL MAINTENANCE**

2           Sec. 701. (1) The director shall allocate lump-sum  
3   appropriations made in this act for remodeling and addition,  
4   special maintenance, major special maintenance, energy  
5   conservation, demolition, ICF/MR, air-conditioning, and fire  
6   protection projects. The director shall allocate other lump sums in  
7   order of program priority and need of the various state agencies or  
8   as otherwise based on actual building inspection reports by  
9   regulatory agencies.

10          (2) The state budget director may authorize that funds  
11   appropriated for lump-sum special maintenance shall be available  
12   for no more than 2 fiscal years following the fiscal year in which  
13   the original appropriation was made. Any remaining balance from  
14   allocations made in this section shall lapse to the fund from which  
15   it was appropriated pursuant to the lapsing of funds as provided in  
16   the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

17          (3) Before the end of each fiscal year, the department shall  
18   submit a report to JCOS and the fiscal agencies indicating the  
19   total cost and status of all lump-sum projects funded under this  
20   act and any previous act that have been designated as proposed,  
21   designed, bid, under construction, or completed within the current  
22   fiscal year.

23          Sec. 702. (1) A state agency shall provide notification to  
24   JCOS prior to commencing a demolition project not authorized by  
25   law. The demolition project may be disapproved by JCOS within 30  
26   days after the date of notification, and if disapproved within that  
27   time, the demolition project shall not be authorized. The

1 notification to JCOS shall identify the building or facility to be  
2 demolished and its location, the estimated cost of the demolition  
3 project, estimated project schedule, and the source of financing.

4 (2) The 30-day disapproval period does not apply to any  
5 notifications submitted during a period when the legislature will  
6 not be in session for 15 days or more. In these situations, the 30-  
7 day disapproval period begins on the first scheduled session day.

8 Sec. 703. Pursuant to department policy, state agencies may  
9 expend not more than \$600,000.00 from their operating budget for  
10 special maintenance, remodeling, additions, or other capital outlay  
11 purposes, unless specifically authorized by the legislature, for  
12 those purposes.

13 Sec. 705. Any unexpended and unreserved state general  
14 fund/general purpose remaining in accounts appropriated in sections  
15 103 and 104 of 2002 PA 518 for major special maintenance and  
16 remodeling for the departments of community health, corrections,  
17 human services, management and budget, military affairs, and state  
18 police is hereby reappropriated for the fiscal year ending  
19 September 30, 2007 for maintenance and remodeling projects for the  
20 department of corrections.

#### 21 **COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES**

22 Sec. 801. (1) This section applies only to projects for  
23 community colleges.

24 (2) State support is directed towards the remodeling and  
25 additions, special maintenance, or construction of certain  
26 community college buildings. The community college shall obtain or

1 provide for site acquisition and initial main utility installation  
2 to operate the facility. Funding shall be comprised of local and  
3 state shares, and the state share shall include 50% of any federal  
4 money awarded for projects appropriated in this act. Not more than  
5 50% of a capital outlay project, not including a lump-sum special  
6 maintenance project or remodeling and addition project, for a  
7 community college shall be appropriated from state and federal  
8 funds, unless otherwise appropriated by the legislature.

9 (3) An expenditure under this act is authorized when the  
10 release of the appropriation is approved by the board upon the  
11 recommendation of the director. The director may recommend to the  
12 board the release of any appropriation in part 1 only after the  
13 director is assured that the legal entity operating the community  
14 college to which the appropriation is made has complied with this  
15 act and has matched the amounts appropriated as required by this  
16 act. A release of funds in part 1 shall not exceed 50% of the total  
17 cost of planning and construction of any project, not including  
18 lump-sum remodeling and additions and special maintenance, unless  
19 otherwise appropriated by the legislature. Further planning and  
20 construction of a project authorized by this act or applicable  
21 sections of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101  
22 to 18.1594, shall be in accordance with the purpose and scope as  
23 defined and delineated in the approved program statements and  
24 planning documents. This act is applicable to all projects for  
25 which planning appropriations were made in previous acts.

26 (4) The community college shall take the steps necessary to  
27 secure available federal construction and equipment money for

1 projects funded for construction in this act if an application was  
2 not previously made. If there is a reasonable expectation that a  
3 prior year unfunded application may receive federal money in a  
4 subsequent year, the college shall take whatever action necessary  
5 to keep the application active. If federal money is received, the  
6 state share shall be adjusted accordingly as provided by this act.

7       Sec. 802. If matching revenues are received in an amount less  
8 than the appropriations contained in this act, the state funds of  
9 the appropriation shall be reduced in proportion to the amount of  
10 matching revenue received.

11       Sec. 803. (1) The director may require that community colleges  
12 and universities that have an authorized project listed in part 1  
13 submit documentation regarding the project match and governing  
14 board approval of the authorized project not more than 60 days  
15 after the beginning of the fiscal year.

16       (2) If the documentation required by the director under  
17 subsection (1) is not submitted, or does not adequately  
18 authenticate the availability of the project match or board  
19 approval of the authorized project, the authorization may  
20 terminate. The authorization terminates 30 days after the director  
21 notifies JCOS of the intent to terminate the project unless JCOS  
22 convenes to extend the authorization.

23       Sec. 808. The total project cost for the Wayne State  
24 University engineering development center authorized for  
25 construction in 2006 PA 345 remains \$27,350,000.00. The state  
26 building authority share is increased from \$12,350,000.00 to  
27 \$14,999,800.00, the state general fund/general purpose share

### 3 DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET

4 Sec. 901. (1) The department shall provide JCOS and the fiscal  
5 agencies a report, not more than 15 days after the reporting date,  
6 of privately owned leased space by state agencies, by March 31 and  
7 September 30 of each year, consisting of the following:

8 (a) Department.

9 (b) Agency division and leased number.

10 (c) Building location (address and city).

11 (d) Type of building.

12 (e) County.

13 (f) Name and address of lessor.

14 (g) Square footage and net square footage rate.

15 (h) Monthly and annual cost.

16 (i) Date lease started and expires.

17 (j) Options and services.

18 (k) Total monthly and annual cost for all leases.

19 (2) The lease report shall be summarized for office space,

### 22 DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS

23 Sec. 1001. The appropriations in part 1 for department of  
24 military and veterans affairs design and construction projects are

2 **DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES**

3       Sec. 1101. The appropriation made in this act for the harbors  
4 and docks program is for the purpose of participating with the  
5 federal government and assisting political entities and  
6 subdivisions of this state in the construction and improvement of  
7 recreational boating facilities within this state. Subject to the  
8 approval of the board, this money shall be allocated by the  
9 department of natural resources to the federal government, or to  
10 the political entities or local units of government involved in the  
11 particular projects. An allocation shall not exceed the state  
12 portion as listed with each project description. The department of  
13 natural resources shall take the steps necessary to match federal  
14 money available for the construction and improvement of  
15 recreational boating facilities within this state, and to meet  
16 requirements of the federal government.

17       Sec. 1102. Before the end of each fiscal year, the department  
18 of natural resources shall report each year to JCOS the status of  
19 each project that received an appropriation in any capital outlay

7 **STATE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT**

8 Sec. 1201. (1) From federal-state-local project appropriations  
9 contained in part 1 for the purpose of assisting political entities  
10 and subdivisions of this state in the construction and improvement  
11 of publicly used airports and landing fields within this state, the  
12 state transportation department may permit the award of contracts  
13 on behalf of units of local government for the authorized locations  
14 not to exceed the indicated amounts, of which the state allocated  
15 portion shall not exceed the amount appropriated in part 1.

16 (2) Political entities and subdivisions shall provide not less  
17 than 2.5% of the cost of any project under this section, unless a

21 the total appropriation in part 1 from state funds for airport

22       Sec. 1204. From the appropriations contained in part 1 for  
23 airport improvement programs, no funds shall be allocated for any  
24 runway extensions, taxiway extensions, or apron extensions at the  
25 Detroit-Willow Run airport. Further, it is the intent of the  
26 legislature that no state funds shall be expended to improve or  
27 repair the airport where the purpose of the improvement or repair

1 is to expand the usage of the airport including, but not limited  
2 to, anything approximating a tradeport as that term is defined in  
3 the former international tradeport development authority act,  
4 former 1994 PA 325.

5 Sec. 1205. (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the  
6 state transportation department shall not, directly or indirectly,  
7 expend any funds appropriated in 2006 PA 345, 2005 PA 158, or 2004  
8 PA 361 to continue the Detroit River international crossing study  
9 project nor further participate in any manner whatsoever with the  
10 border transportation partnership.

11 (2) Within 10 days of the effective date of this act, the  
12 department shall submit a report to the senate and house of  
13 representatives appropriations subcommittees on transportation and  
14 to the state transportation commission that identifies the source  
15 and use of all funds attributable to or expended in furtherance of  
16 the Detroit River international crossing study or the border  
17 transportation partnership. The report shall include copies of all  
18 contracts, agreements, and expenses associated with the project  
19 from October 1, 2003 to December 31, 2006.

## 20 **MISCELLANEOUS**

21 Sec. 1301. (1) Revenue collected from licenses issued under  
22 the antenna site management project shall be deposited into the  
23 antenna site management revolving fund created for this purpose in  
24 the department of information technology. The department may  
25 receive and expend funds from the fund for costs associated with  
26 the antenna site management project, including the cost of the

1 third-party site manager. Any excess revenue remaining in the fund  
2 at the close of the fiscal year shall be proportionately  
3 transferred to the appropriate state restricted funds as designated  
4 in statute or by constitution.

5 (2) An antenna shall not be sited pursuant to this section

8 Sec. 1302. (1) A site preparation economic development fund is  
9 hereby created in the department of management and budget. As used  
10 in this section, "economic development sites" means those state-  
11 owned sites declared as surplus property pursuant to section 251 of  
12 the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1251, that would  
13 provide economic benefit to the area or to the state. The Michigan  
14 economic development corporation board and the state budget  
15 director shall determine whether or not a specific state-owned site  
16 qualifies for inclusion in the fund created under this subsection.

17 (2) Proceeds from the sale of any sites designated in  
18 subsection (1) shall be deposited into the fund created in  
19 subsection (1) and shall be available for site preparation  
20 expenditures, unless otherwise provided by law. The economic  
21 development sites authorized in subsection (1) are hereby  
22 authorized for sale consistent with state law. Expenditures from  
23 the fund are hereby authorized for site preparation activities that  
24 enhance the marketable sale value of the sites. Site preparation  
25 activities include, but are not limited to, demolition,  
26 environmental studies and abatement, utility enhancement, and site  
27 excavation.

22           Sec. 1304. It is the intent of the legislature to authorize  
23     regional economic development projects that promote job creation  
24     and increased economic activity. All projects must be submitted to

26     approval by the senate and house of representatives standing  
27     committees on appropriations. It is the intent of the legislature

1 to fund these projects through the state building authority with  
2 the state share not to exceed 75% of the individual project costs.  
3 The total state building authority share for all projects shall not  
4 exceed \$50,000,000.00.

5       Sec. 1305. For fiscal year 2006-2007 only, \$200,000.00 is  
6 appropriated and transferred from the Mackinac Island State Park  
7 operations fees fund to the Mackinac Island State Park commission,  
8 historic projects division, revenue bond fund for infrastructure  
9 improvements.
