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HOUSE BILL No. 4144

February 2, 2005, Introduced by Rep. Moolenaar and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 2000 PA 258, entitled

"Career and technical preparation act,"

by amending section 3 (MCL 388.1903), as amended by 2004 PA 592.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Career and technical preparation program" means a program
- 3 that teaches a trade, occupation, or vocation and that is operated
- 4 by an eligible postsecondary educational institution located in
- 5 this state.
 - (b) "Community college" means a community college established
- 7 under the community college act of 1966, 1966 PA 331, MCL 389.1 to
- 8 389.195, or under part 25 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451,
- 9 MCL 380.1601 to 380.1607, or a federal tribally controlled

- 1 community college located in this state that is recognized under
- 2 the tribally controlled community college assistance act of 1978,
- 3 25 USC 1801 to 1852, and is determined by the department to meet
- 4 the requirements for accreditation by a recognized regional
- 5 accrediting body.
- 6 (c) "Department" means the department of labor and economic
- 7 growth.
- 8 (d) "Eligible charges" means tuition and mandatory course
- 9 fees, material fees, and registration fees required by a career and
- 10 technical preparation program for enrollment in an eligible course.
- 11 Eliqible charges also include any late fees charged by a career and
- 12 technical preparation program due to the school district's failure
- 13 to make a required payment according to the timetable prescribed
- 14 under this act. Eligible charges do not include transportation or
- 15 parking costs or activity fees.
- 16 (e) "Eligible course" means a course offered by a career and
- 17 technical preparation program that is not offered through the
- 18 school district, intermediate school district, or area vocational-
- 19 technical education program in which the eligible student is
- 20 enrolled, or that is offered through the school district,
- 21 intermediate school district, or area vocational-technical
- 22 education program but is determined by its governing board to not
- 23 be available to the eligible student because of a scheduling
- 24 conflict beyond the eligible student's control; that is a career
- 25 and technical preparation course not ordinarily taken as an
- 26 activity course; that is a course that the career and technical
- 27 preparation program normally applies toward satisfaction of

- 1 certificate, degree, or program completion requirements; and that
- 2 is not a hobby craft or recreational course.
- 3 (f) "Eligible postsecondary educational institution" means a
- 4 state university, community college, or independent nonprofit
- 5 degree-granting college or university that is located in this state
- 6 and that chooses to comply with this act.
- 7 (g) "Eligible student" means a student enrolled in at least 1
- 8 high school class in at least grade 11 in a school district in this
- 9 state, except a foreign exchange pupil enrolled in a school
- 10 district under a cultural exchange program. Until the 2006-2007
- 11 school year, to be an eligible student a student must have achieved
- 12 state endorsement in all subject areas under section 1279 of the
- 13 revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1279, AND THE STUDENT
- 14 SHALL NOT HAVE BEEN ENROLLED IN HIGH SCHOOL FOR MORE THAN 4 SCHOOL
- 15 YEARS INCLUDING THE SCHOOL YEAR IN WHICH THE STUDENT SEEKS TO
- 16 ENROLL IN AN ELIGIBLE COURSE UNDER THIS ACT. However, if the
- 17 student has not achieved state endorsement in all subject areas
- 18 under that section, the student is an eligible student if the
- 19 student achieves state endorsement in mathematics and a qualifying
- 20 score on a nationally or industry recognized job skills assessment
- 21 test as determined by the department. Beginning with eligibility to
- 22 participate under this act during the 2006-2007 school year, to be
- 23 an eliqible student a student who has not taken the Michigan merit
- 24 examination must have achieved a qualifying score in all subject
- 25 areas on a readiness assessment and a student who has taken the
- 26 Michigan merit examination must have achieved a qualifying score in
- 27 all subject areas on the Michigan merit examination, AND THE

- 1 STUDENT SHALL NOT HAVE BEEN ENROLLED IN HIGH SCHOOL FOR MORE THAN 4
- 2 SCHOOL YEARS INCLUDING THE SCHOOL YEAR IN WHICH THE STUDENT SEEKS
- 3 TO ENROLL IN AN ELIGIBLE COURSE UNDER THIS ACT. However, if the
- 4 student has not achieved a qualifying score in all subject areas on
- 5 a readiness assessment or the Michigan merit examination, as
- 6 applicable for the student, the student is an eligible student if
- 7 the student achieves a qualifying score in mathematics and a
- 8 qualifying score on a nationally or industry recognized job skills
- 9 assessment test as determined by the superintendent of public
- 10 instruction. FOR THE PURPOSES OF DETERMINING WHETHER A PUPIL HAS
- 11 BEEN ENROLLED IN HIGH SCHOOL FOR MORE THAN 4 SCHOOL YEARS, A PUPIL
- 12 WHO IS ENROLLED IN HIGH SCHOOL FOR LESS THAN 90 DAYS OF A SCHOOL
- 13 YEAR DUE TO ILLNESS OR OTHER CIRCUMSTANCES BEYOND THE CONTROL OF
- 14 THE PUPIL OR THE PUPIL'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN IS NOT CONSIDERED TO BE
- 15 ENROLLED IN HIGH SCHOOL FOR THAT SCHOOL YEAR.
- 16 (h) "Intermediate school district" means that term as defined
- 17 in section 4 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.4.
- 18 (i) "Michigan merit examination" means that examination
- 19 developed under section 1279g of the revised school code, 1976 PA
- **20** 451, MCL 380.1279g.
- 21 (j) "Qualifying score" means a score on a readiness assessment
- 22 or on a nationally or industry recognized job skills assessment
- 23 test that has been determined by the superintendent of public
- 24 instruction to indicate readiness to enroll in a course under this
- 25 act.
- 26 (k) "Readiness assessment" means assessment instruments that
- 27 are aligned with state learning standards; that are used nationally

- 1 to provide high school students with an early indication of college
- 2 readiness proficiency in English, mathematics, reading, social
- 3 studies, and science and may contain a comprehensive career
- 4 planning program; and that are approved by the superintendent of
- 5 public instruction for the purposes of this act.
- (l) "School district" means that term as defined in section 6
- 7 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.6, a local act
- 8 school district as defined in section 5 of the revised school code,
- 9 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.5, or a public school academy organized under
- 10 the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1 to 380.1852.
- 11 (m) "State university" means a state institution of higher
- 12 education described in section 4, 5, or 6 of article VIII of the
- 13 state constitution of 1963.

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
