HOUSE BILL No. 4195

February 3, 2005, Introduced by Rep. Mayes and referred to the Committee on House Oversight, Elections, and Ethics.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled

"Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 758, 759, and 759b (MCL 168.758, 168.759, and 168.759b), section 758 as amended by 1996 PA 207 and section 759 as amended by 1995 PA 261.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 758. (1) For the purposes of AS USED IN this act, "absent

- 2 voter" means a qualified and registered elector who meets 1 or more 3 of the following requirements: 4 (a) On account of physical disability, cannot without 5 another's assistance attend VOTES WITHOUT ATTENDING the polls on 6 the day of an election. 7

(b) On account of the tenets of his or her religion, cannot

- 1 attend the polls on the day of election.
- 2 (c) Cannot attend the polls on the day of an election in the
- 3 precinct in which he or she resides because of being an election
- 4 precinct inspector in another precinct.
- 5 (d) Is 60 years of age or older.
- 6 (e) Is absent or expects to be absent from the township or
- 7 city in which he or she resides during the entire period the polls
- 8 are open for voting on the day of an election.
- 9 (f) Cannot attend the polls on election day because of being
- 10 confined in jail awaiting arraignment or trial.
- 11 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to ABSENT VOTER DOES NOT
- 12 INCLUDE a person who has moved outside of this state, regardless of
- 13 length of his or her residence outside of this state, and who no
- 14 longer maintains an actual residence in this state. The storage of
- 15 personal effects or household goods, the ownership of property that
- 16 is rented or leased to others, or occasional brief visits to a
- 17 former domicile in this state while residing outside of this state
- 18 for most of the year does DO not constitute a residence for voting
- 19 purposes in this state, except for each of the following:
- 20 (a) A person described in section 1 of article II of the state
- 21 constitution of 1963 and statutes enacted under that section.
- (b) A person described in section 759a.
- 23 Sec. 759. (1) At any time during the 75 days before a primary
- 24 ELECTION or special primary ELECTION, but not later than 2 p.m. of
- 25 the Saturday immediately before the primary **ELECTION** or special
- 26 primary **ELECTION**, an elector who qualifies **WANTS** to vote as an
- 27 absent voter -, as defined in section 758, may apply for an absent

- 1 voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person or by mail with the
- 2 clerk of the township, city, or village in which the elector is
- 3 registered. An application received before a primary **ELECTION** or
- 4 special primary **ELECTION** may be for either that primary **ELECTION**
- 5 only, or for that primary **ELECTION** and the election that follows.
- 6 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (1), at any
- 7 time during the 75 days before an election, but not later than 2
- 8 p.m. of the Saturday before the election, an elector who -qualifies
- 9 WANTS to vote as an absent voter -, as defined in section 758, may
- 10 apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person
- 11 or by mail with the clerk of the township, city, or village in
- 12 which the voter is registered.
- 13 (3) An application for an absent voter ballot under this
- 14 section may be made in any of the following ways:
- 15 (a) By a written request signed by the -voter stating the
- 16 statutory grounds for making the application ELECTOR.
- 17 (b) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for
- 18 that purpose by the clerk of the city, township, or village.
- 19 (c) On a federal postcard application.
- 20 (4) An applicant for an absent voter ballot shall sign the
- 21 application. A clerk or assistant clerk shall not deliver an absent
- 22 voter ballot to an applicant who does not sign the application. A
- 23 person other than SHALL NOT BE IN POSSESSION OF A SIGNED ABSENT
- 24 VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION EXCEPT FOR the applicant; a member of the
- 25 applicant's immediate family; a person residing in the applicant's
- 26 household; a person whose job normally includes the handling of
- 27 mail, but only during the course of his or her employment; a

1 registered elector requested by the applicant TO RETURN THE 2 APPLICATION; or a clerk, assistant of the clerk, or other authorized election official. -shall not be in possession of a 3 4 signed absent voter ballot application. A registered elector who 5 is requested by the applicant to return his or her absent voter 6 ballot application shall sign the certificate on the absent voter 7 ballot application. 8 (5) The clerk of the city, township, or village shall have 9 absent voter ballot application forms available in the office of 10 the clerk at all times and shall furnish an absent voter ballot 11 application form to anyone upon a verbal or written request. 7	A person making a false statement in this absent voter ballet

1	application is guilty of a misdemeanor. It is a violation of
2	Michigan election law for a person other than those listed in the
3	instructions to return, offer to return, agree to return, or
4	solicit to return your absent voter ballot application to the
5	clerk. An assistant authorized by the clerk who receives absent
6	voter ballot applications at a location other than the office of
7	the clerk must have credentials signed by the clerk. Ask to see his
8	or her credentials before entrusting your application with a person
9	claiming to have the clerk's authorization to return your
10	application.

25	(6) The following instructions for an applicant for an absent
26	voter ballot shall be included with each application furnished an

1 INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS FOR ABSENT VOTER BALLOTS

- 2 Step 1. After completely filling out the application, sign and
- 3 date the application in the place designated. Your signature must
- 4 appear on the application or you will not receive an absent voter
- 5 ballot.
- 6 Step 2. Deliver the application by 1 of the following methods:
- 7 (a) Place the application in an envelope addressed to the
- 8 appropriate clerk and place the necessary postage upon the return
- 9 envelope and deposit it in the United States mail or with another
- 10 public postal service, express mail service, parcel post service,
- 11 or common carrier.
- 12 (b) Deliver the application personally to the office of the
- 13 clerk, to the clerk, or to an authorized assistant of the clerk.
- 14 (c) In either (a) or (b), a member of the immediate family of
- 15 the voter including a father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law,
- 16 sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, or
- 17 grandchild or a person residing in the voter's household may mail
- 18 or deliver the application to the clerk for the applicant.
- 19 (d) In the event IF an applicant cannot return the
- 20 application in any of the above methods, the applicant may select
- 21 any registered elector to return the application. The person
- 22 returning the application must sign and return the certificate at
- 23 the bottom of the application.
- 24 (7) A person who prints and distributes absent voter ballot
- 25 applications shall print on the application the warning,
- 26 certificate of authorized registered elector returning absent voter
- 27 ballot application, and instructions required by this section.

- 1 (8) A person who makes a false statement in an absent voter
- 2 ballot application is guilty of a misdemeanor. A person who forges
- 3 a signature on an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a
- 4 felony. A person who is not authorized in this act and who both
- 5 distributes absent voter ballot applications to absent voters and
- 6 returns those absent voter ballot applications to a clerk or
- 7 assistant of the clerk is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 8 Sec. 759b. (1) Any A registered elector may apply for AN
- 9 absent voter ballots BALLOT at any time prior to BEFORE 4 p.m.
- 10 on election day if he shall have become physically disabled or
- 11 shall be absent from the city or township because of sickness or
- 12 death in the family which AN EVENT has occurred at a time which
- 13 has THAT made it impossible to apply for AN absent voter ballots
- 14 BALLOT by the statutory deadline. The application shall be called
- 15 an emergency absent voter BALLOT application.
- 16 (2) Emergency absent voter BALLOT applications may be made by
- 17 letter or on a form PRESCRIBED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE AND
- 18 provided by the clerk. The application shall set forth that the
- 19 voter is qualified to vote in the election -, stating the statutory
- 20 reason for applying for an emergency absent voter ballot and that
- 21 the reason for applying after the statutory deadline AN EVENT
- 22 occurred at such a time to make it impossible to file an
- 23 application for AN absent voter -ballots- BALLOT by the statutory
- 24 deadline.
- 25 (3) Any A person intentionally making a false statement in
- 26 such AN EMERGENCY ABSENT VOTER BALLOT application is guilty of a
- 27 felony. Any A person aiding or abetting any ANOTHER person to

- 1 make a false statement -on such IN AN EMERGENCY ABSENT VOTER
- 2 BALLOT application is guilty of a felony.
- 3 (4) Upon receipt by the clerk of a valid application for an
- 4 emergency absent voter ballot, the clerk may deliver the -ballots
- 5 ABSENT VOTER BALLOT to the applicant in person, through a deputy or
- 6 an election assistant, or the may deliver them at his OR HER
- 7 office to a person named by the applicant in the **EMERGENCY ABSENT**
- 8 VOTER BALLOT application. The ABSENT voter may return the ballots
- 9 ABSENT VOTER BALLOT to the clerk -in the sealed envelope provided
- 10 therefor in any manner. he sees fit. To HOWEVER, TO be valid,
- 11 ballots must be returned THE ABSENT VOTER SHALL RETURN THE ABSENT
- 12 VOTER BALLOT to the clerk IN THE SEALED ENVELOPE PROVIDED FOR THAT
- 13 REASON AND in time to be delivered to the polls -prior to BEFORE 8
- 14 p.m. on election day.
