## **HOUSE BILL No. 4283**

February 15, 2005, Introduced by Rep. Jones and referred to the Committee on Local Government and Urban Policy.

A bill to amend 1956 PA 40, entitled "The drain code of 1956,"

by amending section 72 (MCL 280.72), as amended by 1987 PA 60.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 72. (1) As soon as practicable after the filing of a
- 2 petition UNDER SECTION 71, the DRAIN commissioner authorized to act
- 3 on the petition, if not disqualified under section 381 to make the
- 4 apportionment of benefits, may appoint a board of determination.
- 5 composed of 3 disinterested property owners. If the DRAIN
- 6 commissioner is disqualified or chooses not to appoint the board of
- 7 determination, the DRAIN commissioner shall immediately file a copy
- 8 of the petition with the chairperson of the county board of
- 9 commissioners, together with a statement signed by the DRAIN

- 1 commissioner, showing that he or she is disqualified or chooses not
- 2 to act in appointing a board of determination. Upon AS SOON AS
- 3 PRACTICABLE AFTER receiving a copy of the petition and certificate,
- 4 the chairperson of the county board of commissioners, if not
- 5 privately interested, -as soon as practicable, shall appoint a
- 6 board of determination composed of 3 disinterested property owners
- 7 and shall immediately notify the drain commissioner of the names
- 8 and addresses of those appointed. If the chairperson of the board
- 9 of commissioners has a private interest in the proceedings, the
- 10 drain committee of the county board of commissioners shall appoint
- 11 the board of determination. Members of boards
- 12 (2) A BOARD OF DETERMINATION SHALL CONSIST OF 5 INDIVIDUALS.
- 13 AT LEAST 1 MEMBER OF A BOARD OF DETERMINATION SHALL BE AN ELECTED
- 14 OR APPOINTED OFFICIAL OF A LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT, OTHER THAN A
- 15 CITY, VILLAGE, OR TOWNSHIP ALL OR PART OF WHICH INCLUDED IN THE
- 16 DRAINAGE DISTRICT. EACH MEMBER OF A BOARD of determination shall
- 17 be residents MEET ALL OF THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:
- 18 (A) BE A DISINTERESTED PROPERTY OWNER.
- 19 (B) BE A RESIDENT of the county but not of a township, city,
- 20 or village TO BE affected by the drain. , and may not be members
- 21 (C) NOT BE A MEMBER of the county board of commissioners of
- 22 the county. A meeting of the board of determination shall be
- 23 called within the drainage district at a convenient place to be
- 24 designated by the drain commissioner. The board of determination
- 25 meeting also may be held at a public building within the city,
- 26 village, or township in which the drain is located.
- 27 (3) If 1 of those appointed to the board of determination

- 1 fails or refuses to serve, the drain commissioner shall appoint a
- 2 successor SHALL BE APPOINTED IN THE SAME MANNER AS THE ORIGINAL
- 3 APPOINTEE.
- 4 (4) The per diem compensation, mileage, and expenses of a
- 5 member of the board of determination shall be the same as FOR the
- 6 county board of commissioners of the county. In counties where
- 7 COUNTY commissioners are not paid on a per diem basis, the
- 8 compensation, mileage, and expenses shall be fixed by the drain
- 9 commissioner. The members of the board of determination shall not
- 10 receive more than 1 per diem for a day no matter how many separate
- 11 matters are considered on that day.
- 12 (5) Upon request, the <del>county</del> drain commissioner shall inform
- 13 in writing the requesting state legislator who represents that
- 14 portion of the area in which the proposed drain improvement is
- 15 to be constructed of the names and addresses of the persons
- 16 appointed to a board of determination.
- 17 (6)  $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$  THE DRAIN COMMISSIONER SHALL CALL A MEETING OF THE
- 18 BOARD OF DETERMINATION. THE MEETING SHALL BE HELD WITHIN THE
- 19 DRAINAGE DISTRICT AT A CONVENIENT PLACE. THE BOARD OF DETERMINATION
- 20 MEETING ALSO MAY BE HELD AT A PUBLIC BUILDING WITHIN A CITY,
- 21 VILLAGE, OR TOWNSHIP IN WHICH THE DRAIN IS TO BE LOCATED. The drain
- 22 commissioner shall give public notice of the time, date, and place
- 23 of the A meeting of the board of determination in the manner
- 24 required by the open meetings act, Act No. 267 of the Public Acts
- of 1976, as amended, being sections 15.261 to 15.275 of the
- 26 Michigan Compiled Laws 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 TO 15.275, and by
- 27 publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the county at

- 2 THE DRAIN COMMISSIONER SHALL GIVE NOTICE OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD
- 3 OF DETERMINATION TO the county clerk and -on- the clerk of each
- 4 township, city, and village in the DRAINAGE district, personally or
- 5 by registered mail, at least 10 days before the meeting. The drain
- 6 commissioner also shall send notice, by <del>first class</del> **FIRST-CLASS**
- 7 mail, of the time, date, and place of the A meeting OF THE BOARD
- 8 OF DETERMINATION, to each person whose name appears on the last
- 9 city, village, or township tax assessment roll as owning land
- 10 within the <u>special assessment</u> DRAINAGE district, at the address
- 11 shown on the roll. If an address does not appear on the roll, a

- 20 OF A PERSON to receive a notice by mail -shall DOES not constitute
- 21 a jurisdictional defect invalidating a drain proceeding or tax, or
- 22 both, if notice has been sent by <u>first class</u> FIRST-CLASS mail as
- 23 provided in this section. Expenses of notification shall be paid by
- 24 the drainage district. when created.
- 25 (7) -(3) At the time and place -fixed STATED in the notice,
- 26 the board of determination shall meet, elect a chairperson and
- 27 secretary, and proceed to determine the necessity of the proposed

- 1 drain and whether, CONSIDERING ITS COSTS AND BENEFITS, the drain is
- 2 conducive to public health, convenience, or welfare. The board of
- 3 determination, if it considers it necessary, shall require the
- 4 county drain commissioner to obtain from the county treasurer a
- 5 statement showing the amount of taxes and special assessments
- 6 levied against the land in the proposed drainage district on the
- 7 tax rolls for the immediately preceding 3 years and the amount of
- 8 the taxes and assessments remaining unpaid. If it appears from the
- 9 statement that 25% or more of the taxes are unpaid on the lands,
- 10 further action shall not be taken. After hearing the evidence
- 11 offered, the board of determination shall make its determination on
- 12 the necessity of the drain and whether, CONSIDERING ITS COSTS AND
- 13 BENEFITS, the drain is conducive to public health, convenience, or
- 14 welfare. If the board of determination finds, by a majority vote of
- 15 the members, that the PROPOSED drain is not necessary and conducive
- 16 to public health, convenience, or welfare, the board of
- 17 determination shall file with the DRAIN commissioner an order
- 18 dismissing the petition, and a further petition for the drain shall
- 19 not be entertained within 1 year after the determination. If the
- 20 board of determination, by a majority vote, finds the PROPOSED
- 21 drain <del>proposed</del> to be necessary and conducive to the public
- 22 health, convenience, or welfare, the board of determination shall
- 23 make an order to that effect and file the order with the DRAIN
- 24 commissioner.
- 25 (8) If the board of determination finds that a portion of the
- 26 construction of the proposed drain is necessary for the protection
- 27 of the public health in 1 or more cities, villages, —and—OR

- 1 townships, the order shall set forth the determination giving the
- 2 names of the THAT FINDING AND IDENTIFY THOSE municipalities.
- 3 receiving benefit for health. If the board of determination
- 4 determines FINDS that the whole cost, except that to be levied
- 5 against state or county highways for highway benefits, is necessary
- 6 for the public health IN 1 OR MORE CITIES, VILLAGES, OR TOWNSHIPS,
- 7 the cost shall be levied against the townships, villages, and
- 8 cities THOSE MUNICIPALITIES at large, and it shall IS not be
- 9 necessary, in a subsequent order or notice, to describe or refer to
- 10 land included in or comprising the drainage district. Upon filing
- 11 of the order of determination by the board of determination, the
- 12 drain commissioner, within 10 days of filing, IF THE DRAINAGE
- 13 BOARD FINDS THAT ALL OR A PORTION OF THE COST OF CONSTRUCTION IS
- 14 NECESSARY FOR THE PROTECTION OF PUBLIC HEALTH IN 1 OR MORE
- 15 MUNICIPALITIES, WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER THE DRAINAGE BOARD FILES THE
- 16 ORDER OF DETERMINATION, THE DRAIN COMMISSIONER shall notify each
- 17 SUCH municipality BY REGISTERED MAIL that it is liable to pay a
- 18 percent of the cost of construction of the drain by reason of
- 19 benefits at large for public health. The governing body of the
- 20 township, city, or village, within WITHIN 20 days after receipt of
- 21 the SUCH notification, by registered mail from the drain
- 22 commissioner, THE GOVERNING BODY OF A MUNICIPALITY may appeal the
- 23 order of the board of determination to the -probate- CIRCUIT court
- 24 having jurisdiction in FOR the county. in which the township,
- 25 city, or village is located. Upon WITHIN 20 DAYS AFTER receipt of
- 26 the order of the board of determination, -and OR, if an appeal has
- 27 not been taken by a municipality to the probate CIRCUIT court,

- 1 UPON TERMINATION OF THE APPEAL PROCEEDINGS, the DRAIN commissioner
- 2 , after 20 days, shall make his or her first order of
- 3 determination in writing, giving the name or number of the drainage
- 4 district . The commissioner shall establish AND the commencement,
- 5 route, terminus, and type of construction of the drain. , a copy of
- 6 which WITHIN 15 DAYS AFTER MAKING THE order, he or she THE DRAIN
- 7 COMMISSIONER shall file , within 15 days, A COPY OF THE ORDER in
- 8 his or her office. If an appeal is taken to the probate court by a
- 9 municipality, the commissioner shall file his or her first order of
- 10 determination after the appeal procedures are terminated.
