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HOUSE BILL No. 5104

August 24, 2005, Introduced by Rep. Caswell and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 627 (MCL 257.627), as amended by 2004 PA 62.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 627. (1) A person driving OPERATING a vehicle on a

highway shall —drive— OPERATE THAT VEHICLE at a careful and prudent speed not greater than nor less than is reasonable and proper, having due regard to the traffic, surface, and width of the highway and of any other condition then existing. A person shall not —drive OPERATE a vehicle upon a highway at a speed greater than that which will permit a stop within the assured, clear distance ahead.

(2) Subject to subsection (1) and except in those instances where a lower speed is specified in this chapter, it is prima facie

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- 1 lawful for the <u>driver</u> **OPERATOR** of a vehicle to <u>drive</u> **OPERATE**
- 2 THAT VEHICLE at a speed not exceeding the following, except when
- 3 this speed would be unsafe:
- 4 (a) 25 miles an hour on all highways in a business or
- 5 residence district as defined in this act.
- 6 (b) 25 miles an hour in public parks unless a different speed
- 7 is fixed and duly posted.
- 8 (3) It is prima facie unlawful for a person to exceed the
- 9 speed limits prescribed in subsection (2), except as provided in
- **10** section 629.
- 11 (4) The driver of A PERSON OPERATING a vehicle in a mobile
- 12 home park as defined in section 2 of the mobile home commission
- 13 act, 1987 PA 96, MCL 125.2302, shall <u>drive</u> OPERATE THAT VEHICLE
- 14 at a careful and prudent speed, not greater than a speed which
- 15 THAT is reasonable and proper, having due regard for the traffic,
- 16 surface, width of the roadway, and all other conditions existing,
- 17 and not greater than a speed -which will permit THAT PERMITS a
- 18 stop within the assured clear distance ahead. It is prima facie
- 19 unlawful for the driver OPERATOR of a vehicle to drive OPERATE
- 20 THAT VEHICLE at a speed exceeding 15 miles an hour in a mobile home
- 21 park as defined in section 2 of the mobile home commission act,
- 22 1987 PA 96, MCL 125.2302.
- 23 (5) A person <u>driving</u> **OPERATING** a passenger vehicle drawing
- 24 another vehicle or trailer shall not exceed a speed of 55 miles per
- 25 hour, unless the vehicle or trailer has 2 wheels or less and does
- 26 not exceed the combined weight of 750 pounds for the vehicle or
- 27 trailer and load, or a trailer coach of not more than 26 feet in

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- 1 length with brakes on each wheel and attached to the passenger
- 2 vehicle with an equalizing or stabilizing coupling unit.
- 3 (6) —A— EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION, A
- 4 truck with a gross weight of 10,000 pounds or more, a truck-tractor
- 5 with a trailer, or a combination of these vehicles shall not exceed
- 6 a speed of 55 miles per hour on highways, streets, or freeways and
- 7 shall not exceed a speed of 35 miles per hour during the period
- 8 when reduced loadings are being enforced in accordance with this
- 9 chapter. HOWEVER, A TRUCK OR TRUCK-TRACTOR DESCRIBED IN THIS
- 10 SUBSECTION SHALL NOT EXCEED A SPEED OF 60 MILES PER HOUR ON A
- 11 FREEWAY IF THE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT ON THAT FREEWAY IS 70 MILES PER
- 12 HOUR.
- 13 (7) A person <u>driving</u> **OPERATING** a school bus shall not exceed
- 14 the speed of 50 miles per hour.
- 15 (8) The maximum rates of speeds allowed pursuant to **UNDER**
- 16 this section are subject to the maximum rate established -pursuant
- 17 to UNDER section 629b.
- 18 (9) A person operating a vehicle on a highway, when entering
- 19 and passing through a work zone described in section 79e(a), or,
- 20 beginning April 8, 2004, described in section 79d(a) -, where a
- 21 normal lane or part of the lane of traffic has been closed due to
- 22 highway construction, maintenance, or surveying activities, shall
- 23 not exceed a speed of 45 miles per hour unless a different speed
- 24 limit is determined for that work zone by the state transportation
- 25 department, a county road commission, or a local authority. The
- 26 state transportation department, a county road commission, or a
- 27 local authority shall post speed limit signs in each work zone

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- 1 described <u>in section 79e(a)</u>, or, beginning April 8, 2004,
- 2 described in section 79d(a) that indicate the speed limit in
- 3 that work zone and shall identify that work zone with any other
- 4 traffic control devices necessary to conform to the Michigan manual
- 5 of uniform traffic control devices. A person shall not exceed a
- 6 speed limit established under this section or a speed limit
- 7 established under section 628 or 629.
- 8 (10) A person who violates this section is responsible for a
- 9 civil infraction.

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
