## **HOUSE BILL No. 5110**

August 31, 2005, Introduced by Rep. Kooiman and referred to the Committee on Family and Children Services.

A bill to amend 1973 PA 116, entitled

"An act to provide for the protection of children through the licensing and regulation of child care organizations; to provide for the establishment of standards of care for child care organizations; to prescribe powers and duties of certain departments of this state and adoption facilitators; to provide penalties; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 1 (MCL 722.111), as amended by 2002 PA 696.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) As used in this act:
  - (a) "Child care organization" means a governmental or nongovernmental organization having as its principal function the receiving of minor children for care, maintenance, training, and supervision, notwithstanding that educational instruction may be given. Child care organization includes organizations commonly described as child caring institutions, child placing agencies, children's camps, child care centers, day care centers, nursery

- 1 schools, parent cooperative preschools, foster homes, group homes,
- 2 or day care homes. Child care organization does not include a
- 3 governmental or nongovernmental organization that does either of
- 4 the following:
- 5 (i) Provides care exclusively to minors who have been
- 6 emancipated by court order -pursuant to UNDER section 4(3) of 1968
- 7 PA 293, MCL 722.4.
- (ii) Provides care exclusively to persons who are 18 years of
- 9 age or older and to minors who have been emancipated by court order
- 10 pursuant to UNDER section 4(3) of 1968 PA 293, MCL 722.4, at the
- 11 same location.
- 12 (b) "Child caring institution" means a child care facility
- 13 that is organized for the purpose of receiving minor children for
- 14 care, maintenance, and supervision, usually on a 24-hour basis, in
- 15 buildings maintained by the child caring institution for that
- 16 purpose, and operates throughout the year. An educational program
- 17 may be provided, but the educational program shall not be the
- 18 primary purpose of the facility. Child caring institution includes
- 19 a maternity home for the care of unmarried mothers who are minors
- 20 and an agency group home, that is described as a small child caring
- 21 institution owned, leased, or rented by a licensed agency providing
- 22 care for more than 4 but less than 13 minor children. Child caring
- 23 institution also includes institutions for mentally retarded or
- 24 emotionally disturbed minor children. Child caring institution does
- 25 not include a hospital, nursing home, or home for the aged licensed
- 26 under article 17 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 27 333.20101 to 333.22260, a boarding school licensed under section

- 1 1335 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1335, a
- 2 hospital or facility operated by the state or licensed under the
- **3** mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1001 to 330.2106, or an
- 4 adult foster care family home or an adult foster care small group
- 5 home licensed under the adult foster care facility licensing act,
- 6 1979 PA 218, MCL 400.701 to 400.737, in which a child has been
- 7 placed pursuant to section 5(6).
- 8 (c) "Child placing agency" means a governmental organization
- 9 or an agency organized pursuant to UNDER the nonprofit
- 10 corporation act, 1982 PA 162, MCL 450.2101 to 450.3192, for the
- 11 purpose of receiving children for placement in private family homes
- 12 for foster care or for adoption. The function of a child placing
- 13 agency may include investigating applicants for adoption and
- 14 investigating and certifying foster family homes and foster family
- 15 group homes as provided in this act. The function of a child
- 16 placing agency may also include supervising children who are 16 or
- 17 17 years of age and who are living in unlicensed residences as
- 18 provided in section 5(4).
- 19 (d) "Children's camp" means a residential, <del>day,</del> troop, or
- 20 travel camp conducted in a natural environment for more than 4
- 21 school-age children, apart from the children's parents, relatives,
- 22 or legal guardians, for 5 or more days in a 14-day period. A
- 23 children's camp provides care and supervision for the same group of
- 24 children for usually not more than 12 weeks.
- (e) "Child care center" or "day care center" means a facility,
- 26 other than a private residence, receiving 1 or more preschool or
- 27 school-age children for care for periods of less than 24 hours a

- 1 day, and where the parents or guardians are not immediately
- 2 available to the child. Child care center or day care center
- 3 includes a facility that provides care for not less than 2
- 4 consecutive weeks, regardless of the number of hours of care per
- 5 day. The facility is generally described as a child care center,
- 6 day care center, day nursery, nursery school, parent cooperative
- 7 preschool, play group, BEFORE- OR AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM, or drop-in
- 8 center. Child care center or day care center does not include any
- 9 of the following:
- 10 (i) A Sunday school, a vacation bible school, or a religious
- 11 instructional class that is conducted by a religious organization
- 12 where children are attending for not more than 3 hours per day for
- 13 an indefinite period or for not more than 8 hours per day for a
- 14 period not to exceed 4 weeks during a 12-month period.
- 15 (ii) A facility operated by a religious organization where
- 16 children are cared for not more than 3 hours while persons
- 17 responsible for the children are attending religious services.
- 18 (iii) Beginning July 1, 2003, a facility or program for school-
- 19 age children that is operated at a school by a public school or by
- 20 a person or entity with whom a public school contracts for
- 21 services, in accordance with section 1285a(2) of the revised school
- 22 code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1285a, if that facility or program has
- 23 been granted an exemption under subsection (2). A PROGRAM THAT IS
- 24 PRIMARILY SUPERVISED, SCHOOL-AGE-CHILD-FOCUSED TRAINING IN A
- 25 SPECIFIC SUBJECT, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DANCING, DRAMA,
- 26 MUSIC, OR RELIGION. THIS EXCLUSION APPLIES ONLY TO THE TIME A CHILD
- 27 IS INVOLVED IN TRAINING. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH,

- 1 SUBPARAGRAPH (iv), AND SUBSECTION (2), "SCHOOL-AGE CHILD" MEANS A
- 2 CHILD WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO BE ENROLLED IN A GRADE OF KINDERGARTEN OR
- 3 ABOVE, BUT IS LESS THAN 13 YEARS OF AGE.
- 4 (iv) A PROGRAM THAT IS PRIMARILY AN INCIDENT OF GROUP ATHLETIC
- 5 OR SOCIAL ACTIVITIES FOR SCHOOL-AGE CHILDREN SPONSORED BY OR UNDER
- 6 THE SUPERVISION OF AN ORGANIZED CLUB OR HOBBY GROUP, INCLUDING, BUT
- 7 NOT LIMITED TO, YOUTH CLUBS, SCOUTING, AND SCHOOL-AGE RECREATIONAL
- 8 OR SUPPLEMENTARY EDUCATION PROGRAMS. THIS EXCLUSION APPLIES ONLY TO
- 9 THE TIME THE CHILD IS ENGAGED IN THE GROUP ATHLETIC OR SOCIAL
- 10 ACTIVITIES AND IF THE CHILD CAN COME AND GO AS HE OR SHE PLEASES.
- 11 (f) "Private home" means a private residence in which the
- 12 licensee or registrant permanently resides as a member of the
- 13 household, which residency is not contingent upon caring for
- 14 children or employment by a licensed or approved child placing
- 15 agency. Private home includes a full-time foster family home, a
- 16 full-time foster family group home, a group day care home, or a
- 17 family day care home, as follows:
- 18 (i) "Foster family home" is a private home in which 1 but not
- 19 more than 4 minor children, who are not related to an adult member
- 20 of the household by blood or marriage, or who are not placed in the
- 21 household -pursuant to UNDER the Michigan adoption code, chapter X
- 22 of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 710.21 to 710.70, are
- 23 given care and supervision for 24 hours a day, for 4 or more days a
- 24 week, for 2 or more consecutive weeks, unattended by a parent or
- 25 legal guardian.
- 26 (ii) "Foster family group home" means a private home in which
- 27 more than 4 but fewer than 7 minor children, who are not related to

- 1 an adult member of the household by blood or marriage, or who are
- 2 not placed in the household -pursuant to UNDER the Michigan
- 3 adoption code, chapter X of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288,
- 4 MCL 710.21 to 710.70, are provided care for 24 hours a day, for 4
- 5 or more days a week, for 2 or more consecutive weeks, unattended by
- 6 a parent or legal guardian.
- 7 (iii) "Family day care home" means a private home in which 1 but
- 8 fewer than 7 minor children are received for care and supervision
- 9 for periods of less than 24 hours a day, unattended by a parent or
- 10 legal guardian, except children related to an adult member of the
- 11 family by blood, marriage, or adoption. Family day care home
- 12 includes a home in which care is given to an unrelated minor child
- 13 for more than 4 weeks during a calendar year.
- 14 (iv) "Group day care home" means a private home in which more
- 15 than 6 but not more than 12 minor children are given care and
- 16 supervision for periods of less than 24 hours a day unattended by a
- 17 parent or legal guardian, except children related to an adult
- 18 member of the family by blood, marriage, or adoption. Group day
- 19 care home includes a home in which care is given to an unrelated
- 20 minor child for more than 4 weeks during a calendar year.
- 21 (g) "Licensee" means a person, partnership, firm, corporation,
- 22 association, nongovernmental organization, or local or state
- 23 government child care organization that has been issued a license
- 24 under this act to operate a child care organization.
- 25 (h) "Provisional license" means a license issued to a child
- 26 care organization that is temporarily unable to conform to all of
- 27 the rules promulgated under this act.

- 1 (i) "Regular license" means a license issued to a child care
- 2 organization indicating that the organization is in compliance with
- 3 all rules promulgated under this act.
- 4 (j) "Guardian" means the guardian of the person.
- 5 (k) "Minor child" means any of the following:
- 6 (i) A person less than 18 years of age.
- 7 (ii) A person who is a resident in a child caring institution,
- 8 children's camp, foster family home, or foster family group home;
- 9 who becomes 18 years of age while residing in the child caring
- 10 institution, children's camp, foster family home, or foster family
- 11 group home; and who continues residing in the child caring
- 12 institution, children's camp, foster family home, or foster family
- 13 group home to receive care, maintenance, training, and supervision.
- 14 However, a minor child under this subparagraph does not include a
- 15 person 18 years of age or older who is placed in a child caring
- 16 institution, foster family home, or foster family group home
- 17 pursuant to an adjudication under section 2(a) of chapter XIIA of
- 18 the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.2, or section 1 of
- 19 chapter IX of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL
- 20 769.1. This subparagraph applies only if the number of those
- 21 residents who become 18 years of age does not exceed the following:
- 22 (A) Two, if the total number of residents is 10 or fewer.
- 23 (B) Three, if the total number of residents is not less than
- 24 11 and not more than 14.
- 25 (C) Four, if the total number of residents is not less than 15
- 26 and not more than 20.
- 27 (D) Five, if the total number of residents is 21 or more.

- 1 (iii) A person 18 years of age or older who is placed in a
- 2 foster family home under section 5(7).
- (l) "Registrant" means a person who has been issued a
- 4 certificate of registration under this act to operate a family day
- 5 care home.
- 6 (m) "Registration" means the process by which the department
- 7 of -consumer and industry HUMAN services regulates family day care
- 8 homes, and includes the requirement that a family day care home
- 9 certify to the department OF HUMAN SERVICES that the family day
- 10 care home has complied with and will continue to comply with the
- 11 rules promulgated under this act.
- 12 (n) "Certificate of registration" means a written document
- issued under this act to a family day care home through
- 14 registration.
- (0) "Related" means a parent, grandparent, brother, sister,
- 16 stepparent, stepsister, stepbrother, uncle, aunt, cousin, great
- 17 aunt, great uncle, or stepgrandparent related by marriage, blood,
- 18 or adoption.
- 19 (p) "Religious organization" means church, ecclesiastical
- 20 corporation, or group, not organized for pecuniary profit, that
- 21 gathers for mutual support and edification in piety or worship of a
- 22 supreme deity.
- 23 (2) A facility or program for school-age children that is
- 24 operated at a school by a public school or by a person or entity
- 25 with whom a public school contracts for services and that
- 26 CURRENTLY OPERATED AND has been in operation and LICENSED OR
- 27 approved for a minimum of -4 2 years may apply to the department

- 1 of -consumer and industry HUMAN services -to be exempt from this
- 2 act FOR DEEMED STATUS. The department of -consumer and industry
- 3 HUMAN services shall respond to a facility or program requesting
- 4 exemption DEEMED STATUS under this subsection within 45 days from
- 5 the date the completed application is received. The department of
- 6 consumer and industry HUMAN services may exempt from this act
- 7 GRANT DEEMED STATUS TO a facility or program that meets all of the
- 8 following criteria:
- 9 (a) The facility or program has been in operation and LICENSED
- 10 OR approved for a minimum of -4 2 years before the application
- 11 date.
- 12 (b) During the -4 2 years before the application date, the
- 13 facility or program has not had a substantial violation of this
- 14 act, rules promulgated under this act, or the terms of A LICENSURE
- 15 OR an approval under this act.
- 16 (c) The school board, —or— board of directors, OR GOVERNING
- 17 BODY adopts a resolution supporting the application for -exemption
- 18 DEEMED STATUS described in this subsection.
- 19 (3) A FACILITY OR PROGRAM GRANTED DEEMED STATUS UNDER
- 20 SUBSECTION (2) IS REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN STATUS AS A LICENSED OR
- 21 APPROVED PROGRAM AND MUST CONTINUE TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS
- 22 ACT, THE RULES PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT, OR THE TERMS OF A
- 23 LICENSE OR APPROVAL UNDER THIS ACT. A FACILITY OR PROGRAM GRANTED
- 24 DEEMED STATUS UNDER SUBSECTION (2) IS SUBJECT TO SPECIAL
- 25 INVESTIGATION BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES WHEN A RULE OR
- 26 ACT VIOLATION IS ALLEGED.
- 27 (4) A FACILITY OR PROGRAM GRANTED DEEMED STATUS UNDER

- 1 SUBSECTION (2) IS NOT SUBJECT TO INTERIM OR ANNUAL LICENSING
- 2 REVIEWS. A FACILITY OR PROGRAM GRANTED DEEMED STATUS UNDER
- 3 SUBSECTION (2) IS REQUIRED TO SUBMIT DOCUMENTATION ANNUALLY
- 4 DEMONSTRATING COMPLIANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS ACT, THE
- 5 RULES PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT, OR THE TERMS OF A LICENSE OR
- 6 APPROVAL UNDER THIS ACT.
- 7 (5) DEEMED STATUS MAY BE RESCINDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN
- 8 SERVICES IF SUBSTANTIAL VIOLATIONS OF THIS ACT, THE RULES
- 9 PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT, OR THE TERMS OF A LICENSE OR APPROVAL
- 10 ARE SUBSTANTIATED.
