HOUSE BILL No. 5543

January 11, 2006, Introduced by Rep. Jones and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending sections 707, 707a, 707c, 707d, and 707e (MCL 257.707, 257.707a, 257.707c, 257.707d, and 257.707e); and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 707. (1) A motor vehicle -, including a motorcycle or
- 2 moped, shall at all times be equipped with AN EXHAUST SYSTEM AND a
- 3 muffler in good working order and in constant operation to prevent
- 4 excessive or unusual noise, -and- annoying smoke, OR NOISE IN
- 5 EXCESS OF THE LIMITS ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 707C. A person shall
- 6 not remove, destroy, or damage any of the baffles contained in the
- 7 muffler , nor shall a person OR use a muffler cutout, MUFFLER

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- 1 bypass, MUFFLER AMPLIFIER, or similar device upon a -motorcycle or
- 2 moped on a highway or street MOTOR VEHICLE.
- 3 (2) The engine, —and—power mechanism, EXHAUST SYSTEM, AND
- 4 MUFFLER of a motor vehicle shall be -so equipped and adjusted -as
- 5 to prevent the escape of excessive fumes or smoke. A PERSON SHALL
- 6 NOT OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE ON A STREET OR HIGHWAY IF THAT MOTOR
- 7 VEHICLE HAS A DEFECT IN THE EXHAUST SYSTEM OR MUFFLER THAT AFFECTS
- 8 SOUND REDUCTION.
- 9 (3) A motor vehicle shall at all times be equipped with a
- 10 properly operating exhaust system which shall include a tailpipe
- 11 and resonator on a vehicle where the original design included a
- 12 tailpipe and resonator AS EQUIPPED IN THE ORIGINAL DESIGN
- 13 SPECIFICATIONS OF THE MANUFACTURER. ANY EXHAUST SYSTEM REPLACEMENT
- 14 EQUIPMENT SHALL SUBSTANTIALLY CONFORM TO THE ORIGINAL DESIGN
- 15 SPECIFICATIONS.
- 16 Sec. 707a. (1) As used in sections 707a to 707e:
- 17 (a) "Decibel" means a unit of sound level on a logarithmic
- 18 scale measured relative to the threshold of audible sound by the
- 19 human ear, in compliance with American national standards institute
- 20 standard S 1.1-1960.
- 21 (b) "Decibels on the a-weighted network" or "DBA" means
- 22 decibels measured on the a-weighted network of a sound level meter,
- 23 as specified in American national standards institute standard S
- **24** 1.4-1971.
- 25 (c) "Fast meter response" means the meter ballistics of meter
- 26 dynamic characteristics as specified by American national standard
- **27** S 1.4-1971.

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- 1 (d) "Maximum noise" means the noise emitted from a vehicle
- 2 during that manner of operation -which THAT causes the highest DBA
- 3 level possible from that vehicle.
- 4 (e) "Muffler" means a device for abating the sound of escaping
- 5 gases of an internal combustion engine.
- 6 (f) "Exhaust system" means the system comprised of a
- 7 combination of components -which THAT provides for enclosed flow
- 8 of exhaust gas from engine parts to the atmosphere.
- **9** (g) "Noise" means any sound.
- 10 (h) "Total noise" means noises radiating from a vehicle but
- 11 does not include noises emitted from a horn, siren, bell or other
- 12 similar device of an authorized emergency vehicle.
- 13 (i) "Gross vehicle weight rating" means the value specified by
- 14 the manufacturer as the loaded weight of a vehicle.
- 15 (j) "Combination vehicle" means any combination of truck,
- 16 truck tractor, trailer, semi-trailer or pole trailer used upon the
- 17 highways or streets in the transportation of passengers or
- 18 property.
- 19 (2) FOR PURPOSES OF SECTIONS 707A TO 707E, "MOTOR VEHICLE"
- 20 DOES NOT INCLUDE SPECIAL MOBILE EQUIPMENT.
- 21 Sec. 707c. (1) After April 1, 1978, a motor vehicle shall not
- 22 be operated or driven on a highway or street if the motor vehicle
- 23 produces total noise exceeding 1 of the following limits at a
- 24 distance of 50 feet except as provided in subdivisions (b)(iii) and
- 25 (c)(iii):
- 26 (a) A motor vehicle with a gross weight or gross vehicle
- 27 weight rating of 8,500 pounds or more, combination vehicle with

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- 1 gross weight or gross vehicle weight ratings of 8,500 pounds or
- 2 more.
- 3 (i) Ninety DBA if the maximum lawful speed on the highway or
- 4 street is greater than 35 miles per hour.
- 5 (ii) Eighty-six DBA if the maximum lawful speed on the highway
- 6 or street is not more than 35 miles per hour.
- 7 (iii) Eighty-eight DBA under stationary run-up test.
- 8 (b) A motorcycle or a moped:
- 9 (i) Eighty-six DBA if the maximum lawful speed on the highway
- 10 or street is greater than 35 miles per hour.
- 11 (ii) Eighty-two DBA if the maximum lawful speed on the highway
- or street is not more than 35 miles per hour.
- 13 (iii) Ninety-five DBA under stationary run-up test at 75 inches.
- 14 (c) A motor vehicle or a combination of vehicles towed by a
- 15 motor vehicle not covered in subdivision (a) or (b):
- 16 (i) Eighty-two DBA if the maximum lawful speed on the highway
- 17 or street is greater than 35 miles per hour.
- 18 (ii) Seventy-six DBA if the maximum lawful speed on the highway
- or street is not more than 35 miles per hour.
- 20 (iii) Ninety-five DBA under stationary run-up test 20 inches
- 21 from the end of the tailpipe.
- 22 (1) -(2) A dealer shall not sell or offer for sale for use
- 23 upon a street or highway in this state AND A PERSON SHALL NOT
- 24 OPERATE UPON A STREET OR HIGHWAY IN THIS STATE a -new motor
- 25 vehicle -manufactured after April 1, 1978, which THAT produces a
- 26 maximum noise exceeding the following limits MEASURED AT A DISTANCE
- 27 OF 50 FEET:

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- 1 (a) A motor vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of
- **2** 8,500 pounds or more—83 DBA.
- 3 (b) A motorcycle or a moped-83 DBA.
- 4 (c) A motor vehicle not covered in subdivision (a) or (b)-80
- 5 DBA.
- 6 (3) A person shall not operate a vehicle on a highway or
- 7 street if the vehicle has a defect in the exhaust system which
- 8 affects sound reduction, is not equipped with a muffler or other
- 9 noise dissipative device, or is equipped with a cutout, bypass,
- 10 amplifier, or a similar device.
- 11 (2) -(4) A person, either acting for himself or herself or as
- 12 the agent or employee of another, shall not sell, install, or
- 13 replace a muffler or exhaust part that causes the motor vehicle to
- 14 which the muffler or exhaust part is attached to exceed the noise
- 15 limits established by this act or a rule promulgated under this
- **16** act.
- 17 (3) $\overline{(5)}$ A person shall not modify, repair, replace, or
- 18 remove a part of an exhaust system causing the motor vehicle to
- 19 which the system is attached to produce noise in excess of the
- 20 levels established by this act, or operate a motor vehicle so
- 21 altered on a street or highway.
- 22 (4) -(6) A dealer shall not sell a used or secondhand motor
- 23 vehicle for use upon a street or highway -which- THAT is not in
- 24 compliance with this act.
- Sec. 707d. (1) A person who violates section $\frac{707c(2)}{(4)}$, or
- 26 (6) 707C is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of
- **27** \$100.00.

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- 1 (2) A person who violates section 707 OR 707b $\frac{\text{or } 707c(1)}{\text{or } 707c(1)}$
- 2 (3), or (5) is responsible for a civil infraction.
- 3 (3) A person who, at the time of installation, knowingly
- 4 installs a muffler or exhaust system which THAT exceeds the
- 5 decibel limits of this act -shall be IS liable to the person who
- 6 receives a citation for violation of 707c for the amount of not
- 7 less than \$100.00, plus reasonable attorney fees and court costs.
- **8** (4) If it is shown that the noise level of a motor vehicle is
- 9 in excess of the DBA levels established in this act, that evidence
- 10 shall be prima facie evidence that the motor vehicle was producing
- 11 excessive noise in violation of this act.
- 12 (5) A violation of section $\frac{707c(4) \text{ or } (6)}{6}$ 707C(2) OR (4) by
- 13 a dealer licensed under this act is prima facie evidence of a
- 14 fraudulent act under section 249.
- 15 Sec. 707e. -(1) Test instrumentation and procedures used for
- 16 implementation and enforcement of sections 707a to 707d shall
- 17 substantially conform —with— TO applicable standards and
- 18 recommended practices established by the society of automotive
- 19 engineers, inc., and the American national standards institute,
- 20 inc., for the measurement of motor vehicle sound levels. Rules
- 21 establishing these test procedures shall be promulgated by the
- 22 department of -state highways and transportation. The rules may
- 23 provide for measurement at other than the distance specified in
- 24 section 707c, provided that IF the decibel limits applied at the
- 25 other distances are adjusted accordingly, to meet the standards in
- 26 section 707c. The rules shall be promulgated pursuant to Act No.
- 27 306 of the Public Acts of 1969, as amended, being sections 24.201

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- 1 to 24.315 of the Michigan Compiled Laws IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE
- 2 ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 TO
- 3 24.328.
- 4 (2) This act occupies the whole field of vehicle noise
- 5 regulation. A city, county, village, or township shall not adopt or
- 6 enforce vehicle noise rules unless the rules are identical to the
- 7 requirements of this act.
- 8 Enacting section 1. Sections 707b and 707f of the Michigan
- **9** vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.707b and 257.707f, are repealed.
