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HOUSE BILL No. 5756

February 28, 2006, Introduced by Rep. Meyer and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled "Occupational code,"

by amending section 2505 (MCL 339.2505), as amended by 2003 PA 196.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2505. (1) An applicant for a real estate broker's license
- 2 shall file an application setting forth the applicant's present
- 3 address, both of business and residence; the complete address of
- 4 each former place where the applicant has resided or been engaged
- 5 in business, or acted as a real estate salesperson, for a period of
- 6 60 days or more, during the 5 years immediately preceding the date
- 7 of application. An applicant for a real estate broker's license
- 8 shall state the name of the individual, sole proprietorship,
- 9 partnership, association, corporation, limited liability company,
 - common law trust, or a combination of those entities and the

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- 1 location of the place for which the license is desired, and set
- 2 forth the period of time which the applicant has been engaged in
- 3 the business. The application shall be executed by the person, or
- 4 by an officer or member of the applicant. An applicant for a real
- 5 estate broker's license which is a partnership, association,
- 6 corporation, limited liability company, common law trust, or a
- 7 combination of those entities shall designate which individuals who
- 8 are officers or members of the partnership, association, limited
- 9 liability company, or corporation will be performing acts regulated
- 10 by this article as principals.
- 11 (2) The department shall not issue a real estate broker's
- 12 license to a new applicant who has been convicted of embezzlement
- or misappropriation of funds.
- 14 (3) A real estate broker shall maintain a place of business in
- 15 this state. If a real estate broker maintains more than 1 place of
- 16 business within the state, a branch office license shall be secured
- 17 by the real estate broker for each branch office maintained. A
- 18 branch office maintained in excess of -25— 120 miles from the city
- 19 limits in which the broker maintains a main office shall be under
- 20 the personal, direct supervision of an associate broker.
- 21 (4) An applicant for a salesperson's license shall set forth
- 22 the period of time during which the individual has been engaged in
- 23 the business, stating the name of the applicant's last employer and
- 24 the name and the place of business of the individual, partnership,
- 25 association, limited liability company, corporation, common law
- 26 trust, or combination of those entities then employing the
- 27 applicant or in whose employ the applicant is to enter. The

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- 1 application shall be signed by the real estate broker in whose
- 2 employ the applicant is to enter.
- 3 (5) Before issuing a license, the department may require and
- 4 procure satisfactory proof of the business experience, competence,
- 5 and good moral character of an applicant for a real estate broker's
- 6 or salesperson's license or of an officer or member of an
- 7 applicant. The department shall require an applicant for a broker's
- 8 or salesperson's license to pass an examination developed by the
- 9 department or contracted for with a recognized outside testing
- 10 agency establishing, in a manner satisfactory to the department,
- 11 that the applicant has a fair knowledge of the English language,
- 12 including reading, writing, spelling, and elementary arithmetic; a
- 13 satisfactory understanding of the fundamentals of real estate
- 14 practice and of the laws and principles of real estate
- 15 conveyancing, deeds, mortgages, land contracts, and leases; the
- 16 obligations of a broker to the public and a principal; and the law
- 17 defining, regulating, and licensing real estate brokers and
- 18 salespersons. The department may require written examination or
- 19 written reexamination of a broker or salesperson, and in that case
- 20 a passing score satisfactory to the department is required as a
- 21 condition precedent to relicensure of a broker or salesperson. The
- 22 department shall require proof that each applicant for a real
- 23 estate broker's license has the equivalent of 3 years of full-time
- 24 experience in the business of real estate or in a field that is
- 25 determined by the department to be relevant and related to the
- 26 business of real estate.
