- 1 Sec. 491. (1) All official books, papers, or records created
- 2 by or received in any office or agency of the state of Michigan or

- 4 CREATED, GENERATED, SENT, COMMUNICATED, RECEIVED, OR STORED BY
- 5 ELECTRONIC MEANS, are -declared to be public property, -belonging
- 6 AND BELONG to the people of the state of Michigan. All books,
- 7 papers, or records shall be disposed of only as provided in
