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HOUSE BILL No. 5995

April 25, 2006, Introduced by Reps. McDowell, Accavitti, Donigan, Alma Smith, Espinoza, Leland, Kathleen Law, Hopgood, Spade, Miller, Polidori, Angerer, Byrnes, Zelenko, Vagnozzi, Kolb, Lipsey, Gonzales, Anderson, Lemmons, Jr., Cushingberry, Waters, Bieda, Gleason, Sak, Meisner and Byrum and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, Great Lakes, Land Use, and Environment.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled

"Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 32701, 32703, 32703a, and 32704 (MCL 324.32701, 324.32703, 324.32703a, and 324.32704), sections 32701 and 32703 as amended and section 32703a as added by 2006 PA 33 and section 32704 as added by 1995 PA 59.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 32701. As used in this part:

- (a) "Adverse resource impact" means either of the following:
- (i) Decreasing the flow of a stream by part of the index flow such that the stream's ability to support characteristic fish populations is functionally impaired.
 - (ii) Decreasing the level of a body of surface water such that

- 1 the body of surface water's ability to support characteristic fish
- 2 populations is functionally impaired.
- 3 (b) "Agricultural purpose" means the agricultural production
- 4 of plants and animals useful to human beings and includes, but is
- 5 not limited to, forages and sod crops, grains and feed crops, field
- 6 crops, dairy animals and dairy products, poultry and poultry
- 7 products, cervidae, livestock, including breeding and grazing,
- 8 equine ANIMALS, fish and other aquacultural products, bees and bee
- 9 products, berries, herbs, fruits, vegetables, flowers, seeds,
- 10 grasses, nursery stock, trees and tree products, mushrooms, and
- 11 other similar products, or any other product, as determined by the
- 12 commission of agriculture, that incorporates the use of food, feed,
- 13 fiber, or fur.
- 14 (c) "Baseline capacity" means either of the following:
- 15 (i) The following applicable withdrawal capacity as reported to
- 16 the department or the department of agriculture, as appropriate, by
- 17 the person making the withdrawal in the April 1, 2007 annual report
- 18 submitted under section 32707 or in the April 1, 2007 water use
- 19 conservation plan submitted under section 32708:
- 20 (A) For a community supply, the total designed withdrawal
- 21 capacity for the community supply under the safe drinking water
- 22 act, 1976 PA 399, MCL 325.1001 to 325.1023, on -the effective date
- 23 of the amendatory act that added this subparagraph FEBRUARY 28,
- 24 2006.
- 25 (B) Unless reported under a different provision of this
- 26 subparagraph, for a quarry or mine that holds an authorization to
- 27 discharge under part 31 that includes a discharge volume, the

- 1 discharge volume stated in that authorization on the effective
- 2 date of the amendatory act that added this subparagraph FEBRUARY
- 3 28, 2006.
- 4 (C) The system capacity used or developed to make a withdrawal
- 5 on the effective date of the amendatory act that added this
- 6 subparagraph FEBRUARY 28, 2006, if the system capacity and a
- 7 description of the system capacity are included in an annual report
- 8 that is submitted under this part.
- 9 (ii) If the person making the withdrawal does not report under
- 10 subparagraph (i), the highest annual amount of water withdrawn as
- 11 reported under this part for calendar year 2002, 2003, 2004, or
- **12** 2005.
- 13 (d) "Community supply" means that term as it is defined in
- 14 section 2 of the safe drinking water act, 1976 PA 399, MCL
- **15** 325.1002.
- 16 (e) "Consumptive use" means that portion of water withdrawn or
- 17 withheld from the Great Lakes basin and assumed to be lost or
- 18 otherwise not returned to the Great Lakes basin due to evaporation,
- 19 incorporation into products or agricultural products, use as part
- 20 of the packaging of products or agricultural products, or other
- 21 processes. Consumptive use includes a withdrawal of waters of the
- 22 Great Lakes basin that is packaged within the Great Lakes basin in
- 23 a container of 5.7 gallons (20 liters) or less. CONSUMPTIVE USE
- 24 DOES NOT INCLUDE THE PACKAGING OF WATER IN BOTTLES OR OTHER
- 25 CONTAINERS.
- 26 (f) "Department" means the department of environmental
- 27 quality.

- 1 (g) "Designated trout stream" means a trout stream identified
- 2 on the document entitled "Designated Trout Streams for the State of
- 3 Michigan", as issued under order of the director of the department
- 4 of natural resources, FO-210.04, on October 10, 2003.
- 5 (h) <u>"Diverted"</u> "DIVERSION" means a transfer of water by
- 6 pipeline, canal, tunnel, aqueduct, channel, modification of the
- 7 direction of a watercourse, tanker ship, tanker truck, rail tanker,
- 8 or similar means from the Great Lakes basin into a watershed
- 9 outside of the Great Lakes basin, Diverted includes a INCLUDING
- 10 THE transfer of water withdrawn from the waters of the Great Lakes
- 11 basin that is removed from the Great Lakes basin in a container
- 12 greater than 5.7 gallons (20 liters). Diverted IN BOTTLES OR OTHER
- 13 CONTAINERS. HOWEVER, DIVERSION does not include any of the
- 14 following:
- 15 (i) A consumptive use.
- 16 (ii) The supply of vehicles, including vessels and aircraft,
- 17 whether for the needs of the persons or animals being transported
- 18 or for ballast or other needs related to the operation of vehicles.
- 19 (iii) Use in a noncommercial project on a short-term basis for
- 20 firefighting, humanitarian, or emergency response purposes.
- 21 (iv) WATER TRANSPORTED FROM THE GREAT LAKES BASIN BY A PERSON
- 22 FOR HIS OR HER PERSONAL, NONCOMMERCIAL USE.
- 23 (i) "Environmentally sound and economically feasible water
- 24 conservation measures" means those measures, methods, technologies,
- 25 or practices for efficient water use and for reduction of water
- 26 loss and waste or for reducing a withdrawal, consumptive use, or
- 27 diversion that meet all of the following:

- 1 (i) Are environmentally sound.
- 2 (ii) Reflect best practices applicable to the water use sector.
- (iii) Are technically feasible and available.
- 4 (iv) Are economically feasible and cost-effective based on an
- 5 analysis that considers direct and avoided economic and
- 6 environmental costs.
- 7 (v) Consider the particular facilities and processes involved,
- 8 taking into account the environmental impact, age of equipment and
- 9 facilities involved, the process employed, energy impacts, and
- 10 other appropriate factors.
- 11 (j) "Farm" means that term as it is defined in section 2 of
- 12 the Michigan right to farm act, 1981 PA 93, MCL 286.472.
- 13 (k) "Generally accepted water management practices" means
- 14 standards or guidelines for water use that ensure water is used
- 15 efficiently.
- 16 (1) "Great Lakes basin" means the watershed of the Great Lakes
- 17 and the St. Lawrence river.
- 18 (m) "Great Lakes charter" means the document establishing the
- 19 principles for the cooperative management of the Great Lakes water
- 20 resources, signed by the governors and premiers of the Great Lakes
- **21** region on February 11, 1985.
- (n) "Great Lakes region" means the geographic region composed
- 23 of the states of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, New York,
- 24 Ohio, and Wisconsin, the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and the
- 25 provinces of Ontario and Quebec, Canada.
- 26 (o) "Index flow" means the 50% exceedance flow for the lowest
- 27 flow month of the flow regime, for the applicable stream reach, as

- 1 determined over the period of record or extrapolated from analyses
- 2 of the United States geological survey stream flow gauges in
- 3 Michigan.
- 4 (p) "Large quantity withdrawal" means 1 or more cumulative
- 5 total withdrawals of over 100,000 gallons of water per day average
- 6 in any consecutive 30-day period that supply a common distribution
- 7 system.
- 8 (q) "New or increased large quantity withdrawal" means a new
- 9 water withdrawal of over 100,000 gallons of water per day average
- in any consecutive 30-day period or an increase of over 100,000
- 11 gallons of water per day average in any consecutive 30-day period
- 12 beyond the baseline capacity of a withdrawal.
- 13 (r) "New or increased withdrawal capacity" means new or
- 14 additional water withdrawal capacity to supply a common
- 15 distribution system that is an increase from the person's baseline
- 16 capacity. New or increased capacity does not include maintenance or
- 17 replacement of existing withdrawal capacity.
- 18 (s) "Political subdivision" means that term as it is defined
- 19 in section 2 of the safe drinking water act, 1976 PA 399, MCL
- **20** 325.1002.
- 21 (t) "Registrant" means a person who registers water withdrawal
- 22 capacity under this part.
- 23 (u) "Waters of the Great Lakes basin" means the Great Lakes
- 24 and all streams, rivers, lakes, connecting channels, and other
- 25 bodies of water, including groundwater, within the Great Lakes
- 26 basin.
- 27 (v) "Waters of the state" means groundwater, lakes, rivers,

- 1 and streams and all other watercourses and waters, including
- 2 WATERS OF the Great Lakes —, BASIN within the territorial
- 3 boundaries of the state. Waters of the state do not include
- 4 drainage ways and ponds designed and constructed solely for
- 5 wastewater conveyance, treatment, or control.
- 6 (w) "Withdrawal" means the removal of water from its source
- 7 for any purpose, other than for hydroelectric generation at sites
- 8 certified, licensed, or permitted by the federal energy regulatory
- 9 commission.
- 10 Sec. 32703. Subject to section 32704, the DIVERSION OF THE
- 11 waters of the Great Lakes basin within the boundaries of this
- 12 state shall not be diverted STATE out of the Great Lakes basin IS
- 13 PROHIBITED.
- 14 Sec. 32703a. (1) If the prohibition in section 32703 is
- 15 determined to be invalid, the DIVERSION OF THE waters of the state
- 16 shall not be diverted OUT OF THE GREAT LAKES BASIN IS PROHIBITED
- 17 unless authorized by law.
- 18 (2) When considering whether to grant legislative approval for
- 19 a diversion, the legislature shall consider sections 51 and 52 of
- 20 article IV of the state constitution of 1963 and whether the
- 21 project serves WILL SERVE a public purpose, whether the project
- 22 will result in no material harm to the waters of the state, the
- 23 public trust, or related purposes, and whether the project -would
- 24 WILL result in any improvement to the waters of the state or the
- 25 water dependent natural resources of the state.
- 26 Sec. 32704. Section 32703 does not apply to $\frac{}{}$ EITHER OF THE
- 27 FOLLOWING:

- 1 (A) A diversion of the waters of the Great Lakes BASIN out of
- 2 the drainage basin of the Great Lakes existing on September 30,
- **3** 1985.
- 4 (B) A DIVERSION BY A PERSON IN BOTTLES OR OTHER CONTAINERS IN
- 5 AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO OR LESS THAN THE AMOUNT OF WATER DIVERTED BY
- 6 THAT PERSON DURING CALENDAR YEAR 2006 IF THE WITHDRAWAL FROM WHICH
- 7 THE DIVERSION OCCURS MEETS ALL OF THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:
- 8 (i) AN ADVERSE RESOURCE IMPACT DOES NOT OCCUR.
- 9 (ii) THE USE OF THE WATER IS REASONABLE UNDER COMMON LAW
- 10 PRINCIPLES OF WATER LAW IN MICHIGAN.
- 11 (iii) RIPARIAN RIGHTS AS DEFINED BY MICHIGAN COMMON LAW ARE
- 12 PROTECTED.
- 13 (iv) HYDROLOGIC IMPACTS COMMENSURATE WITH THE NATURE AND
- 14 EXTENT OF THE WITHDRAWAL ARE ADDRESSED, IF NEEDED, BY THE PERSON
- 15 MAKING THE WITHDRAWAL THROUGH ACTIVITIES RELATED TO STREAM FLOW
- 16 REGIME, WATER QUALITY, AQUIFER PROTECTION, OR OTHER CONSIDERATIONS.
