HOUSE BILL No. 6364

August 29, 2006, Introduced by Rep. Hummel and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1945 PA 302, entitled

"An act authorizing the governor to proclaim a state of emergency, and to prescribe the powers and duties of the governor with respect thereto; and to prescribe penalties,"

by amending section 1 (MCL 10.31).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) During times of great public crisis, disaster,
- 2 rioting, catastrophe, or similar public emergency within the state,
- 3 or reasonable apprehension of immediate danger thereof OF A
- 4 PUBLIC EMERGENCY OF THAT KIND, when public safety is imperiled,
- 5 either upon application of the mayor of a city, sheriff of a
- 6 county, OR the commissioner of the Michigan state police or
- 7 upon his OR HER own volition, the governor may proclaim a state of
 - emergency and designate the area involved. -Following such AFTER
