## **HOUSE BILL No. 6481**

September 14, 2006, Introduced by Reps. Mortimer, David Law, Kooiman, Farhat, Nitz, Baxter, Palsrok, Casperson, Stakoe, Pavlov, Acciavatti, Ball and Pastor and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1939 PA 280, entitled "The social welfare act,"

by amending section 57l (MCL 400.57l), as added by 1999 PA 17.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 57l. (1) Subject to subsection (2), the <u>family</u>
- 2 independence agency DEPARTMENT may require A RECIPIENT TO SUBMIT
- 3 TO substance abuse testing as a condition for family independence
- 4 assistance eligibility under this act IF A DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEE HAS
- 5 REASONABLE SUSPICION OF SUBSTANCE ABUSE BY THE RECIPIENT.
- 6 (2) The <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** shall
- 7 implement a pilot program of **SUSPICION-BASED** substance abuse
- 8 testing as a condition for family independence assistance
  - eligibility in at least 3 counties, including random substance

- 1 abuse testing. It is the intent of the legislature that a statewide
- 2 program of substance abuse testing of family independence
- 3 assistance recipients, including random substance abuse testing, be
- 4 implemented before April 1, 2003. However, statewide implementation
- 5 of the substance abuse testing program shall not begin until all of
- 6 the following have been completed:
- 7 (a) The pilot programs have first been evaluated by the
- 8 department and the evaluation has been submitted to the

- 10 (b) The evaluation under subdivision (a) includes at least the

- 12 analysis of the pilot program.

- 14 subdivision (a) has been submitted to the legislature. ACCORDING
- 15 TO A PROTOCOL THAT INCLUDES ALL OF THE FOLLOWING STEPS:
- 16 (A) THE DEPARTMENT ADMINISTERS A SUBSTANCE ABUSE SURVEY.
- 17 (B) A SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROFESSIONAL SCREENS THE INDIVIDUAL FOR
- 18 SUSPICION OF SUBSTANCE ABUSE USING AN EMPIRICALLY VALIDATED
- 19 SUBSTANCE ABUSE SCREENING TOOL IN A 1-ON-1 CONTACT.
- 20 (C) THE SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROFESSIONAL GATHERS ADDITIONAL
- 21 INFORMATION ABOUT THE INDIVIDUAL, INCLUDING INFORMATION GATHERED
- 22 FROM A DRUG-SCREENING TEST.
- 23 (D) THE SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROFESSIONAL DETERMINES THE LEVEL OF
- 24 TREATMENT NEEDED AND MAKES THE APPROPRIATE REFERRAL.
- 25 (3) An individual described in section 57b shall not be
- 26 considered to have tested positive for substance abuse until the
- 27 sample has been retested to rule out a false positive by gas

- 1 chromatography with mass spectrometry, gas chromatography, high
- 2 performance liquid chromatography, or an equally, or more, specific
- 3 test using the same sample obtained for the original test. An
- 4 individual described in section 57b who tests positive for
- 5 substance abuse under this section shall agree to and participate
- 6 in substance abuse assessment and comply with a required substance
- 7 abuse treatment plan. Failure to comply with a substance abuse
- 8 assessment or treatment plan shall be penalized in the same manner
- 9 as a work first program violation imposed under section 57d or 57g.
- 10 An individual is exempt from substance abuse testing authorized by
- 11 this section if the individual is participating in a substance
- 12 abuse rehabilitation program that the individual was ordered to
- 13 participate in by a circuit court that has established procedures
- 14 to expedite the closing of criminal cases involving a crime
- 15 established under part 74 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368,
- **16** MCL 333.7401 to 333.7461.
- 17 (4) Before implementing substance abuse testing under this
- 18 section, the <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** shall notify
- 19 the senate and house of representatives standing committees having
- 20 jurisdiction over this act and the senate and house of
- 21 representatives appropriations subcommittees having jurisdiction
- 22 over the <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** budget of the
- 23 planned implementation.
- 24 (5) If the <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** implements
- 25 substance abuse testing as authorized and required by this section,
- 26 the <u>family independence agency</u> **DEPARTMENT** shall submit an annual
- 27 report on the testing program to the senate and house of

- 1 representatives standing committees having jurisdiction over this
- 2 act and the senate and house of representatives appropriations
- 3 subcommittees having jurisdiction over the <u>family independence</u>
- 4 agency DEPARTMENT budget. The annual report shall include at least
- 5 all of the following information for the preceding year:
- 6 (a) The number of individuals tested, the substances tested
- 7 for, the results of the testing, and the number of referrals for
- 8 treatment.
- **9** (b) The costs of the testing and the resulting treatment.
- 10 (c) Sanctions, if any, that have been imposed on recipients as
- 11 a result of the testing program.
- 12 (d) The percentage and number of households receiving family
- 13 independence assistance that include an individual who has tested
- 14 positive for substance abuse under the program and that also
- 15 include an individual who has been named as a perpetrator in a case
- 16 classified as a central registry case under the child protection
- 17 law, 1975 PA 238, MCL 722.621 to 722.638.
- 18 (6) The substance abuse testing authorized and required by
- 19 this section does not apply to an individual 65 years old or older.
