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## **HOUSE BILL No. 6641**

November 14, 2006, Introduced by Reps. Gosselin, Garfield, Taub, Ward, Stahl, Marleau, Steil, Acciavatti and Drolet and referred to the Committee on Family and Children Services.

A bill to amend 1973 PA 116, entitled

"An act to provide for the protection of children through the licensing and regulation of child care organizations; to provide for the establishment of standards of care for child care organizations; to prescribe powers and duties of certain departments of this state and adoption facilitators; to provide penalties; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 1 (MCL 722.111), as amended by 2005 PA 202.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Child care organization" means a governmental or
- 3 nongovernmental organization having as its principal function the
  - receiving of minor children for care, maintenance, training, and
    - supervision, notwithstanding that educational instruction may be
- given. Child care organization includes organizations commonly
- 7 described as child caring institutions, child placing agencies,

- 1 children's camps, child care centers, day care centers, nursery
- 2 schools, parent cooperative preschools, foster homes, group homes,
- 3 or day care homes. Child care organization does not include a
- 4 governmental or nongovernmental organization that does either of
- 5 the following:
- 6 (i) Provides care exclusively to minors who have been
- 7 emancipated by court order under section 4(3) of 1968 PA 293, MCL
- 8 722.4.
- 9 (ii) Provides care exclusively to persons who are 18 years of
- 10 age or older and to minors who have been emancipated by court order
- 11 under section 4(3) of 1968 PA 293, MCL 722.4, at the same location.
- 12 (b) "Child caring institution" means a child care facility
- 13 that is organized for the purpose of receiving minor children for
- 14 care, maintenance, and supervision, usually on a 24-hour basis, in
- 15 buildings maintained by the child caring institution for that
- 16 purpose, and operates throughout the year. An educational program
- 17 may be provided, but the educational program shall not be the
- 18 primary purpose of the facility. Child caring institution includes
- 19 a maternity home for the care of unmarried mothers who are minors
- 20 and an agency group home, that is described as a small child caring
- 21 institution owned, leased, or rented by a licensed agency providing
- 22 care for more than 4 but less than 13 minor children. Child caring
- 23 institution also includes institutions for mentally retarded or
- 24 emotionally disturbed minor children. Child caring institution does
- 25 not include a hospital, nursing home, or home for the aged licensed
- 26 under article 17 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 27 333.20101 to 333.22260, a boarding school licensed under section

- 1 1335 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1335, a
- 2 hospital or facility operated by the state or licensed under the
- 3 mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1001 to 330.2106, or an
- 4 adult foster care family home or an adult foster care small group
- 5 home licensed under the adult foster care facility licensing act,
- 6 1979 PA 218, MCL 400.701 to 400.737, in which a child has been
- 7 placed under section 5(6).
- 8 (c) "Child placing agency" means a governmental organization
- 9 or an agency organized under the nonprofit corporation act, 1982 PA
- 10 162, MCL 450.2101 to 450.3192, for the purpose of receiving
- 11 children for placement in private family homes for foster care or
- 12 for adoption. The function of a child placing agency may include
- 13 investigating applicants for adoption and investigating and
- 14 certifying foster family homes and foster family group homes as
- 15 provided in this act. The function of a child placing agency may
- 16 also include supervising children who are 16 or 17 years of age and
- 17 who are living in unlicensed residences as provided in section
- **18** 5(4).
- 19 (d) "Children's camp" means a residential, day, troop, or
- 20 travel camp that provides care and supervision and is conducted in
- 21 a natural environment for more than 4 children, apart from the
- 22 children's parents, relatives, or legal guardians, for 5 or more
- 23 days in a 14-day period.
- 24 (e) "Child care center" or "day care center" means a facility,
- 25 other than a private residence, receiving 1 or more preschool or
- 26 school-age children for care for periods of less than 24 hours a
- 27 day, —and— where the parents or guardians are not immediately

- 1 available to the child. Child care center or day care center
- 2 includes a facility that provides care for not less than 2
- 3 consecutive weeks, regardless of the number of hours of care per
- 4 day. The facility is generally described as a child care center,
- 5 day care center, day nursery, nursery school, parent cooperative
- 6 preschool, play group, before- or after-school program, or drop-in
- 7 center. Child care center or day care center does not include any
- 8 of the following:
- 9 (i) A Sunday school, a vacation bible school, or a religious
- 10 instructional class that is conducted by a religious organization
- 11 where children are attending for not more than 3 hours per day for
- 12 an indefinite period or for not more than 8 hours per day for a
- 13 period not to exceed 4 weeks during a 12-month period.
- 14 (ii) A facility operated by a religious organization where
- 15 children are cared for not more than 3 hours while persons
- 16 responsible for the children are attending religious services.
- 17 (iii) A program that is primarily supervised, school-age-child-
- 18 focused training in a specific subject, including, but not limited
- 19 to, dancing, drama, music, or religion. This exclusion applies only
- 20 to the time a child is involved in supervised, school-age-child-
- 21 focused training.
- 22 (iv) A program that is primarily an incident of group athletic
- 23 or social activities for school-age children sponsored by or under
- 24 the supervision of an organized club or hobby group, including, but
- 25 not limited to, youth clubs, scouting, and school-age recreational
- 26 or supplementary education programs. This exclusion applies only to
- 27 the time the school-age child is engaged in the group athletic or

- 1 social activities and if the school-age child can come and go at
- 2 will.
- 3 (F) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES OR A
- 4 SUCCESSOR AGENCY OR DEPARTMENT RESPONSIBLE FOR LICENSURE AND
- 5 REGISTRATION UNDER THIS ACT.
- 6 (G) —(f)— "Private home" means a private residence in which
- 7 the licensee or registrant permanently resides as a member of the
- 8 household, which residency is not contingent upon caring for
- 9 children or employment by a licensed or approved child placing
- 10 agency. Private home includes a full-time foster family home, a
- 11 full-time foster family group home, a group day care home, or a
- 12 family day care home, as follows:
- 13 (i) "Foster family home" is a private home in which 1 but not
- 14 more than 4 minor children, who are not related to an adult member
- 15 of the household by blood or marriage, or who are not placed in the
- 16 household under the Michigan adoption code, chapter X of the
- 17 probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 710.21 to 710.70, are given
- 18 care and supervision for 24 hours a day, for 4 or more days a week,
- 19 for 2 or more consecutive weeks, unattended by a parent or legal
- 20 quardian.
- 21 (ii) "Foster family group home" means a private home in which
- 22 more than 4 but fewer than 7 minor children, who are not related to
- 23 an adult member of the household by blood or marriage, or who are
- 24 not placed in the household under the Michigan adoption code,
- 25 chapter X of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 710.21 to
- 26 710.70, are provided care for 24 hours a day, for 4 or more days a
- 27 week, for 2 or more consecutive weeks, unattended by a parent or

- 1 legal guardian.
- 2 (iii) "Family day care home" means a private home in which 1 but
- 3 fewer than -7 12 minor children are received for care and
- 4 supervision for periods of less than 24 hours a day, unattended by
- 5 a parent or legal guardian, except children related to an adult
- 6 member of the family by blood, marriage, or adoption. Family day
- 7 care home includes a home in which care is given to an unrelated
- 8 minor child for more than 4 weeks during a calendar year.
- 9 (iv) "Group day care home" means a private home in which more
- 10 than 6 but not more than 12 minor children are given care and
- 11 supervision for periods of less than 24 hours a day unattended by a
- 12 parent or legal guardian, except children related to an adult
- 13 member of the family by blood, marriage, or adoption. Group day
- 14 care home includes a home in which care is given to an unrelated
- 15 minor child for more than 4 weeks during a calendar year.
- 16 (H) -(g) "Licensee" means a person, partnership, firm,
- 17 corporation, association, nongovernmental organization, or local or
- 18 state government child care organization that has been issued a
- 19 license under this act to operate a child care organization.
- 20 (I)  $\frac{h}{h}$  "Provisional license" means a license issued to a
- 21 child care organization that is temporarily unable to conform to
- 22 all of the rules promulgated under this act.
- 23 (J) -(i) "Regular license" means a license issued to a child
- 24 care organization indicating that the organization is in compliance
- 25 with all rules promulgated under this act.
- **26** (K)  $\frac{(i)}{(j)}$  "Guardian" means the guardian of the person.
- 27 (*l*) -(k) "Minor child" means any of the following:

- 1 (i) A person less than 18 years of age.
- 2 (ii) A person who is a resident in a child caring institution,
- 3 children's camp, foster family home, or foster family group home;
- 4 who becomes 18 years of age while residing in the child caring
- 5 institution, children's camp, foster family home, or foster family
- 6 group home; and who continues residing in the child caring
- 7 institution, children's camp, foster family home, or foster family
- 8 group home to receive care, maintenance, training, and supervision.
- 9 However, a A minor child under this subparagraph does not include
- 10 a person 18 years of age or older who is placed in a child caring
- 11 institution, foster family home, or foster family group home
- 12 pursuant ACCORDING to an adjudication under section 2(a) of
- 13 chapter XIIA of the probate code of 1939, 1939 PA 288, MCL 712A.2,
- 14 or section 1 of chapter IX of the code of criminal procedure, 1927
- 15 PA 175, MCL 769.1. This subparagraph applies only if the number of
- 16 those residents who become 18 years of age does not exceed the
- 17 following:
- 18 (A) Two, if the total number of residents is 10 or fewer.
- 19 (B) Three, if the total number of residents is not less than
- 20 11 and not more than 14.
- 21 (C) Four, if the total number of residents is not less than 15
- 22 and not more than 20.
- 23 (D) Five, if the total number of residents is 21 or more.
- 24 (iii) A person 18 years of age or older who is placed in a
- 25 foster family home under section 5(7).
- 26 (M)  $\frac{(l)}{(l)}$  "Registrant" means a person who has been issued a
- 27 certificate of registration under this act to operate a family day

- 1 care home.
- 2 (N) -(m) "Registration" means the process by which the
- 3 department -of human services regulates family day care homes, and
- 4 includes the requirement that a family day care home certify to the
- 5 department -of human services that the family day care home has
- 6 complied with and will continue to comply with the rules
- 7 promulgated under this act.
- 8 (0)  $\frac{(n)}{(n)}$  "Certificate of registration" means a written
- 9 document issued under this act to a family day care home through
- 10 registration.
- 11 (P) (o) "Related" means a parent, grandparent, brother,
- 12 sister, stepparent, stepsister, stepbrother, uncle, aunt, cousin,
- 13 great aunt, great uncle, or stepgrandparent related by marriage,
- 14 blood, or adoption.
- 15 (Q) (p) "Religious organization" means A church,
- 16 ecclesiastical corporation, or group, not organized for pecuniary
- 17 profit, that gathers for mutual support and edification in piety or
- 18 worship of a supreme deity.
- 19 (R)  $\frac{(q)}{(q)}$  "School-age child" means a child who is eligible to
- 20 be enrolled in a grade of kindergarten or above, but is less than
- 21 13 years of age.
- 22 (2) A facility or program for school-age children that is
- 23 currently operated and has been in operation and licensed or
- 24 approved as provided in this act for a minimum of 2 years may apply
- 25 to the department —of human services— to be exempt from inspections
- 26 and on-site visits required under section 5. The department -of
- 27 human services shall respond to a facility or program requesting

- 1 exemption from inspections and on-site visits required under
- 2 section 5 as provided under this subsection within 45 days from the
- 3 date the completed application is received. The department -of
- 4 human services may grant exemption from inspections and on-site
- 5 visits required under section 5 to a facility or program that meets
- 6 all of the following criteria:
- 7 (a) The facility or program has been in operation and licensed
- 8 or approved under this act for a minimum of 2 years before the
- 9 application date.
- 10 (b) During the 2 years before the application date, the
- 11 facility or program has not had a substantial violation of this
- 12 act, rules promulgated under this act, or the terms of a licensure
- 13 or an approval under this act.
- 14 (c) The school board, board of directors, or governing body
- 15 adopts a resolution supporting the application for exemption from
- 16 inspections and on-site visits required under section 5 as provided
- 17 for in this subsection.
- 18 (3) A facility or program granted exemption from inspections
- 19 and on-site visits required under section 5 as provided for under
- 20 subsection (2) is required to maintain status as a licensed or
- 21 approved program under this act and must continue to meet the
- 22 requirements of this act, the rules promulgated under this act, or
- 23 the terms of a license or approval under this act. A facility or
- 24 program granted exemption from inspections and on-site visits
- 25 required under section 5 as provided for under subsection (2) is
- 26 subject to an investigation by the department -of human services
- 27 when a violation of this act or a violation of a rule promulgated

- 1 under this act is alleged.
- 2 (4) A facility or program granted exemption from inspections
- 3 and on-site visits required under section 5 as provided for under
- 4 subsection (2) is not subject to interim or annual licensing
- 5 reviews. A facility or program granted exemption from inspections
- 6 and on-site visits required under section 5 as provided for under
- 7 subsection (2) is required to submit documentation annually
- 8 demonstrating compliance with the requirements of this act, the
- 9 rules promulgated under this act, or the terms of a license or
- 10 approval under this act.
- 11 (5) An exemption provided under subsection (2) may be
- 12 rescinded by the department -of human services if the facility or
- 13 program willfully and substantially violates this act, the rules
- 14 promulgated under this act, or the terms of a license or approval
- 15 granted under this act.
