## **SENATE BILL No. 512**

May 19, 2005, Introduced by Senators HAMMERSTROM, GEORGE, EMERSON and SIKKEMA and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1989 PA 24, entitled
"The district library establishment act,"
by amending sections 2, 3, 4, 11, 12, 15, 19, 20, 21, 23, and 24
(MCL 397.172, 397.173, 397.174, 397.181, 397.182, 397.185, 397.189, 397.190, 397.191, 397.193, and 397.194), sections 2 and 3 as amended by 2001 PA 64, section 11 as amended by 2002 PA 159, section 12 as amended by 2002 PA 540, and section 15 as amended by 1994 PA 114, and by adding section 3a.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 2. As used in this act:

(a) "Agreement" means a district library agreement required by

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- 1 section 3 or the agreement governing a district library established
- 2 pursuant to UNDER former 1955 PA 164.
- 3 (b) "Board" means a district library board.
- 4 (c) "Department" means the department of history, arts, and
- 5 libraries.
- 6 (d) "District" means the territory of the participating
- 7 municipalities that is served by a district library established
- 8 pursuant to UNDER this act.
- 9 (e) "General election" means that term as defined in the
- 10 Michigan election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.1 to 168.992.
- 11 (f) "Largest" means, if used in reference to a participating
- 12 school district, the participating school district having the most
- 13 electors voting at the last regularly scheduled school board
- 14 election in the participating school district.
- 15 (g) "Largest" means, if used in reference to a county, the
- 16 county having the most registered electors of a district as last
- 17 reported to the county clerk -pursuant to- UNDER section 661 of the
- 18 Michigan election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.661.
- 19 (h) "Legislative body" means, if the municipality is a school
- 20 district, the school board.
- 21 (i) "Municipality" means a city, village, school district,
- 22 township, or county. MUNICIPALITY SHALL NOT INCLUDE A SCHOOL
- 23 DISTRICT FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A NEW DISTRICT LIBRARY
- 24 AFTER JANUARY 1, 2015.
- 25 (j) "Participating" means, in reference to a municipality,
- 26 that the municipality is a party to an agreement.
- 27 (k) "School district" means 1 of the following but does not

- 1 include a primary school district or a school district that holds
- 2 meetings rather than elections:
- 3 (i) "Local act school district" as defined in section 5 of the
- 4 revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.5.
- 5 (ii) "Local school district" as that term is used in the
- 6 revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1 to 380.1852.
- 7 (l) "State librarian" means the librarian appointed —pursuant
- 8 to UNDER section 5 of the library of Michigan act, 1982 PA 540,
- **9** MCL 397.15.
- 10 Sec. 3. (1) -Two- EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED UNDER
- 11 SUBSECTION (13), 2 or more municipalities, except 2 or more school
- 12 districts that hold their regularly scheduled elections on
- 13 different dates, authorized by law to establish and maintain a
- 14 library or library services may jointly establish a district
- 15 library if each of the following requirements is satisfied:
- 16 (a) If the proposed district contains a public library, other
- 17 than a district library established under this act, and that public
- 18 library is recognized by the department as lawfully established for
- 19 purposes of the distribution of state aid and penal fines, the
- 20 governing board of the public library approves the establishment of
- 21 the district library.
- 22 (b) The legislative body of each municipality identified in
- 23 the agreement described in section 4 adopts a resolution providing
- 24 for the establishment of a district library and approving a
- 25 district library agreement.
- 26 (c) The proposed district library district does not overlap
- 27 any portion of another district library district.

- 1 (2) A participating municipality may provide in the resolution
- 2 required by subsection (1) that only a portion of its territory is
- 3 included in the district library district. Except as provided in
- 4 subsection (3), the portion of a participating municipality
- 5 included in a district library district shall be bounded by county,
- 6 township, city, village, or school district boundaries.
- 7 (3) A participating municipality other than a county may
- 8 exclude from a district library district only that portion of the
- 9 municipality's territory located within the boundaries of a public
- 10 library that is all of the following:
- 11 (a) Recognized by the department as lawfully established for
- 12 the purposes of the distribution of state aid and penal fines.
- 13 (b) Established under this act or any of the following acts:
- 14 (i) 1877 PA 164, MCL 397.201 to 397.217.
- 15 (ii) The revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1 to
- **16** 380.1852.
- 17 (iii) 1917 PA 138, MCL 397.301 to 397.305.
- 18 (4) On or before October 1, 1998, the boards of district
- 19 libraries having common jurisdiction over parcels of taxable
- 20 property shall file with the state librarian copies of resolutions
- 21 adopted by each, together with a copy of a map described in
- 22 subsection (5), certifying the exclusion of territory from one or
- 23 the other of the district library districts. The resolution and the
- 24 map shall demonstrate that no parcels of taxable property remain
- 25 within more than 1 district library district and shall additionally
- 26 demonstrate that the remaining district library districts are each
- 27 composed of a contiguous whole. If the boards of district library

- 1 districts having common jurisdiction over parcels of taxable
- 2 property have not filed such resolutions and maps with the state
- 3 librarian by October 1, 1998, the department shall approve a change
- 4 in the boundaries of those district libraries, eliminating the
- 5 overlapped territory. The department shall obtain a statement
- 6 identifying the parcels that are located in the overlapping
- 7 territory from the treasurer of each county within which the
- 8 district library district is located and a statement of the date on
- 9 which such parcels were first included within the territory of a
- 10 district library district established in accordance with this act.
- 11 The department shall direct the district library board to ensure
- 12 that any parcel that was originally located within the boundaries
- 13 of a district library district remain in that original district
- 14 library district and be excluded from the territories of the other
- 15 district library districts in which it is located.
- 16 (5) Participating municipalities that propose to establish a
- 17 district library shall file with the state librarian -all BOTH of
- 18 the following:
- 19 (a) A copy of an agreement described in section 4 that
- 20 identifies the proposed library district.
- 21 (b) A copy of a map or drawing that is no smaller than 8-1/2
- 22 by -13 11 inches or larger than 14 by 18 inches and clearly shows
- 23 the territory proposed to be included in the district library
- 24 district.
- 25 (c) A map that unambiguously shows THE MAP SHALL
- 26 UNAMBIGUOUSLY SHOW the relationship of the proposed district
- 27 library district to the adjacent and constituent units of

- 1 government, which include counties, cities, villages, townships,
- 2 school districts, and district libraries.
- 3 (6) The state librarian shall review the agreement described
- 4 in -subsection (5) (a) SECTION 4 AND THE MAP DESCRIBED IN
- 5 SUBSECTION (6) (B) and approve or disapprove of the proposed
- 6 district library district in accordance with section 5. THE
- 7 PARTICIPATING MUNICIPALITIES SHALL COOPERATE WITH THE STATE
- 8 LIBRARIAN TO CORRECT ANY ERRORS OR CHANGES IN THE AGREEMENT OR MAP
- 9 THAT THE STATE LIBRARIAN CONSIDERS NECESSARY TO COMPLY WITH THIS
- 10 ACT.
- 11 (7) Upon receiving notice of the state librarian's approval of
- 12 an agreement described in section 4, upon receiving notice of a
- 13 directive from the department in accordance with subsection (4), or
- 14 upon expiration of the 10-day period described in subsection (11),
- 15 the secretary of the board of the affected district library shall
- 16 submit to the county treasurer of each county in which the district
- 17 library district is located and to the treasurer of each
- 18 municipality in which the district library district is located a
- 19 copy of all of the following:
- (a) The state librarian's written statement of approval for
- 21 the district library issued in accordance with section 5 or the
- 22 department's directive received in accordance with subsection (4).
- 23 (b) The map or drawing of the district library's territory
- 24 described in subsection (5)(b).
- 25 (c) If the district library includes only a portion of a
- 26 municipality, the tax identification number of each parcel of
- 27 property within that municipality which is included in the district

- 1 library district.
- 2 (8) Once an agreement is approved by the state librarian, the
- 3 AGREEMENT AND boundaries of a district library established under
- 4 this act may be amended to do only the following:
- 5 (a) Provide for the withdrawal of a participating municipality
- 6 in accordance with section 24.
- 7 (b) Add a participating municipality in accordance with
- 8 section 25.
- 9 (C) PROVIDE FOR THE MERGING OF 2 OR MORE DISTRICT LIBRARIES.
- 10 (D)  $\overline{\text{(c)}}$  Eliminate certain territory in accordance with
- 11 subsection (10).
- 12 (9) For any amendment described in subsection (8), the
- 13 secretary of the board of the district library shall file with each
- 14 of the following a copy of the map or drawing of the amended
- 15 boundaries approved by the participating municipalities:
- 16 (a) The county treasurer of each county in which the district
- 17 library is situated.
- 18 (b) The department.
- 19 (10) A district library recognized by the legislative council
- 20 before December 29, 1997 may amend its boundaries to eliminate
- 21 territory located within the legal boundaries of a public library
- 22 or another district library district, if that public library or
- 23 other district library is recognized by the department as lawfully
- 24 established for the purposes of the distribution of state aid and
- 25 penal fines. The procedures for amending an agreement under section
- 26 5 do not apply to a boundary amendment described in this
- 27 subsection. A district library that amends its boundaries under

- 1 this subsection shall meet all of the following requirements:
- 2 (a) The board of the district library adopts a resolution
- 3 designating the territory to be excluded from its boundaries.
- 4 (b) The proposed amended boundaries exclude only that
- 5 territory which is within the legal boundaries of a public library
- 6 established under this act or any of the following acts and
- 7 recognized by the department as lawfully established for the
- 8 purposes of the distribution of state aid and penal fines:
- 9 (i) 1877 PA 164, MCL 397.201 to 397.217.
- 10 (ii) The revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1 to
- **11** 380.1852.
- 12 (iii) 1917 PA 138, MCL 397.301 to 397.305.
- 13 (c) The district library files with the state librarian a copy
- 14 of the resolution of the board described in subdivision (a)
- 15 together with a map or drawing that complies with the requirements
- **16** of subsection (5)(b).
- 17 (11) If a district library complies with subsection (4) or
- 18 (10) and the state librarian does not disapprove the amended
- 19 boundaries within 10 business days after receiving the map or
- 20 drawing described in subsection (10)(c), the boundaries are
- 21 amended.
- 22 (12) The territory that has been excluded from any district
- 23 library district under subsection (4) or (10) shall remain a part
- 24 of the district library district from which it has been excluded
- 25 for the purpose of levying debt retirement taxes for bonded
- 26 indebtedness of the district library district that exists on
- 27 December 29, 1997. The territory shall remain a part of that

- 1 district library district until the bonds are redeemed or
- 2 sufficient funds are available in the debt retirement fund of the
- 3 district library for that purpose.
- 4 (13) EXCEPT FOR A SCHOOL DISTRICT AND WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE
- 5 STATE LIBRARIAN, A SINGLE MUNICIPALITY MAY ESTABLISH A DISTRICT
- 6 LIBRARY UNDER THIS SECTION IF EACH OF THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS IS
- 7 SATISFIED:
- 8 (A) THE MUNICIPALITY HAS MADE AN ASSERTIVE EFFORT OVER A
- 9 PERIOD OF TIME OF NOT LESS THAN 3 YEARS TO FORM A DISTRICT LIBRARY
- 10 WITH 1 OR MORE OTHER MUNICIPALITIES.
- 11 (B) THE MUNICIPALITY HAS SUBMITTED TO AND RECEIVED THE STATE
- 12 LIBRARIAN'S APPROVAL OF A PLAN OF SERVICE.
- 13 (C) THE MUNICIPALITY HAS A POPULATION OF 5,000 OR MORE.
- 14 (D) THE MUNICIPALITY IS OTHERWISE QUALIFIED AND MEETS THE
- 15 REQUIREMENTS OF A DISTRICT LIBRARY UNDER THIS ACT.
- 16 (E) ANY OTHER REQUIREMENTS CONSIDERED NECESSARY BY THE STATE
- 17 LIBRARIAN TO ENSURE THAT A DISTRICT LIBRARY CREATED UNDER THIS
- 18 SECTION COMPLIES WITH THE INTENT OF THIS ACT.
- 19 SEC. 3A. (1) UPON PETITION BY NOT LESS THAN 5% OF THE
- 20 REGISTERED ELECTORS RESIDING IN EACH OF THE AFFECTED
- 21 MUNICIPALITIES, REQUESTING A REFERENDUM ON THE QUESTION OF BECOMING
- 22 A DISTRICT LIBRARY OR JOINING AN EXISTING DISTRICT LIBRARY, THE
- 23 CLERK OF EACH AFFECTED MUNICIPALITY, UPON VERIFYING THE REQUIRED
- 24 NUMBER OF SIGNATURES ON THE PETITIONS, SHALL FILE A COPY OF THE
- 25 PETITION WITH THE DEPARTMENT AND SUBMIT THE QUESTION OF WHETHER THE
- 26 MUNICIPALITY SHOULD BECOME A PARTICIPATING MUNICIPALITY TO THE VOTE
- 27 OF THE ELECTORS OF THE MUNICIPALITY AT THE NEXT GENERAL ELECTION OR

- 1 SPECIAL ELECTION CALLED FOR THAT PURPOSE AND CONDUCTED IN
- 2 ACCORDANCE WITH THE MICHIGAN ELECTION LAW, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.1
- 3 TO 168.992.
- 4 (2) THE REFERENDUM SUBMITTED TO THE ELECTORS UNDER THIS
- 5 SECTION SHALL INCLUDE A REQUEST FOR A MILLAGE TO FUND THE NEW
- 6 DISTRICT OR THE MUNICIPALITY'S OBLIGATION TO THE EXISTING DISTRICT.
- 7 (3) IF APPROVED BY A MAJORITY OF THE ELECTORS IN THE AFFECTED
- 8 MUNICIPALITY VOTING ON THE QUESTION, THE MUNICIPALITY SHALL PROCEED
- 9 TO BECOME A PARTICIPATING MUNICIPALITY IN THE MANNER PROVIDED UNDER
- 10 THIS ACT.
- 11 (4) A NEW DISTRICT LIBRARY ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION
- 12 SHALL CONSIST OF 2 OR MORE MUNICIPALITIES AND BE GOVERNED BY AN
- 13 ELECTED BOARD AS PROVIDED UNDER SECTION 11.
- 14 (5) IF A NEW DISTRICT LIBRARY IS CREATED UNDER THIS SECTION,
- 15 EACH PARTICIPATING MUNICIPALITY SHALL APPOINT MEMBERS TO AN INTERIM
- 16 GOVERNING BOARD IN A NUMBER PROPORTIONAL TO ITS POPULATION IN
- 17 RELATIONSHIP TO THE ENTIRE DISTRICT. THE INTERIM BOARD SHALL
- 18 PREPARE AND SUBMIT THE AGREEMENT AND MAP REQUIRED BY THIS ACT TO
- 19 THE DEPARTMENT NO LATER THAN 180 DAYS FROM THE DATE THE ELECTORS
- 20 APPROVE THE NEW DISTRICT. IF THE AGREEMENT AND MAP ARE NOT
- 21 SUBMITTED AS REQUIRED BY THIS SUBSECTION, THE AGREEMENT AND MAP
- 22 SHALL BE PREPARED BY THE STATE LIBRARIAN.
- 23 (6) THE BOARD REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (4) SHALL BE ELECTED
- 24 NOT LATER THAN 1 YEAR FROM THE DATE THE ELECTORS APPROVE THE NEW
- 25 DISTRICT.
- 26 Sec. 4. (1) The agreement shall provide for the creation of a
- 27 board to govern the operation of the district library and set forth

- 1 all of the following:
- 2 (A) THE NAME OF THE DISTRICT. THE NAME SHALL INCLUDE THE WORD
- 3 "DISTRICT".
- 4 (B)  $\frac{}{}$  (a) The identity of the municipalities establishing the
- 5 district library.
- 6 (C) —(b)— The CREATION OF A BOARD TO GOVERN THE OPERATION OF
- 7 THE DISTRICT AND THE method of selection of board members, whether
- 8 by election or appointment. -; if IF BOARD MEMBERS ARE SELECTED by
- 9 appointment, their THE AGREEMENT SHALL PROVIDE FOR THE term of
- 10 office, the total number of board members, and the number of board
- 11 members to be appointed by the legislative body of each
- 12 participating municipality. -; and, if IF BOARD MEMBERS ARE
- 13 SELECTED by election, the AGREEMENT SHALL PROVIDE FOR THE number of
- 14 provisional board members to be appointed by the legislative body
- 15 of each participating municipality.
- 16 (D)  $\frac{(c)}{(c)}$  Of the amount of money to be stated in the annual
- 17 budget pursuant to UNDER section 13, the percentage to be
- 18 supplied by each participating municipality.
- 19 (E) -(d)— The procedure for amending the agreement, which
- 20 shall require the consent of the legislative bodies of not less
- 21 than 2/3 of the participating municipalities.
- (F)  $\frac{\text{(e)}}{\text{(e)}}$  A period of time after the effective date of the
- 23 agreement, not less than 1 year, during which the adoption of a
- 24 resolution to withdraw from the district library pursuant to
- 25 UNDER section 24 shall be void.
- 26 (G) (f)— Any distribution of district library assets to take
- 27 place upon the withdrawal of a participating municipality.

- 1 (H)  $\frac{-(g)}{-(g)}$  Any other necessary provisions regarding the
- 2 district library.
- 3 (2) A district library agreement may provide that the district
- 4 library board is abolished and the district library terminates
- 5 unless, on or before a date stated in the agreement, the district
- 6 electors approve a district library millage at a rate not less than
- 7 a minimum number of mills stated in the agreement. If the district
- 8 library agreement contains such a provision, the district library
- 9 agreement shall specify the manner in which the net assets of the
- 10 district library shall be distributed to the participating
- 11 municipalities upon termination and shall contain a plan for
- 12 continuing public library service to all residents of the district
- 13 after termination.
- 14 Sec. 11. (1) —All— EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED UNDER
- 15 SUBSECTION (2), ALL of the following apply to an election of board
- 16 members of a district library: -unless a school district is a
- 17 participating municipality and subsection (2) imposes a different
- 18 requirement:
- 19 (a) If an agreement prescribes elected board members, the
- 20 board shall consist of 7 members elected at large from the
- 21 district.
- (b) If an agreement prescribes elected board members, a
- 23 provisional board of 7 members shall be appointed. The members of
- 24 the provisional board shall hold office until their successors are
- 25 elected and qualified.
- (c) The first election of board members shall take place at
- 27 the first general election held 140 days or more after the

- 1 appointment of the first member of the provisional board. The 4
- 2 persons receiving the most votes at the first election for board
- 3 members shall have 4-year terms, and the 3 remaining persons
- 4 elected to the board shall have 2-year terms. After the first
- 5 election, board members shall be elected at general elections for
- 6 4-year terms that begin on January 1 following the election.
- 7 (d) Board members shall be elected on nonpartisan ballots.
- 8 (e) Subject to subdivision (f), a nomination for the office of
- 9 board member shall be by nonpartisan petitions signed by registered
- 10 electors of the district. The number of signatures shall be as
- 11 follows:
- 12 (i) For a district with a population of less than 10,000, not
- 13 less than 6 or more than 20.
- 14 (ii) For a district with a population of 10,000 or more, not
- 15 less than 40 or more than 100.
- 16 (f) In lieu of the nominating petition prescribed in this
- 17 subsection, an individual may file a \$100.00 nonrefundable fee to
- 18 have his or her name placed on the ballot.
- 19 (g) A nominating petition or filing fee shall be filed with
- 20 the clerk of the largest county not later than 4 p.m. of the day
- 21 110 days before the date of the election. The county clerk with
- 22 whom nominating petitions or filing fees are filed shall certify
- 23 the names of the candidates to the clerk of every other county in
- 24 which all or part of a participating municipality is located.
- 25 (h) A vacancy in the office of a board member shall be filled
- 26 until the expiration of the vacating board member's term by
- 27 appointment by majority vote of the remaining board members.

- 1 However, if IF the vacancy occurs 140 or more days or, if a
- 2 school district is a participating municipality, 13 or more Mondays
- 3 before the first regularly scheduled election of board members that
- 4 follows the beginning of the term of the board member vacating
- 5 office and that term is 4 years, all of the following apply:
- 6 (i) The vacancy shall be filled by appointment by majority vote
- 7 of the remaining board members only until the next date on which
- 8 the term of any board member expires.
- 9 (ii) A board member shall be elected at the regularly scheduled
- 10 election of board members next following the occurrence of the
- 11 vacancy to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term of the
- 12 board member vacating office.
- 13 (2) If a school district is a participating municipality, the
- 14 following apply to an election of board members for a district
- 15 library:
- 16 (a) The first election of board members shall take place at
- 17 the same time as the first regularly scheduled election of school
- 18 board members in the largest participating school district
- 19 occurring on or after the thirteenth Monday following the
- 20 appointment of the first member of the provisional board. The term
- 21 of office of an elected member of the board shall begin at the same
- 22 time as the term of a school board member elected at the same
- 23 election in the largest participating school district.
- 24 (b) Subject to subdivision (c), a nomination for the office of
- 25 board member shall be by a petition meeting to the extent
- 26 applicable the same requirements, including filing requirements, as
- 27 a nominating petition for the office of school board member in the

- 1 largest participating school district. -However, the THE petition
- 2 shall be filed not later than 4 p.m. of the -ninth Monday TWELFTH
- 3 TUESDAY preceding the election. The number of signatures shall be
- 4 as follows:
- 5 (i) For a district with a population of less than 10,000, not
- 6 less than 6 or more than 20.
- 7 (ii) For a district with a population of 10,000 or more, not
- 8 less than 40 or more than 100.
- 9 (c) In lieu of the nominating petition prescribed under
- 10 subdivision (b), an individual may file a \$100.00 nonrefundable fee
- 11 to have his or her name placed on the ballot. A nominating petition
- 12 or filing fee shall be filed with the <del>secretary of the</del> school
- 13 board of DISTRICT ELECTION COORDINATOR FOR the largest
- 14 participating school district. The -secretary of that school
- 15 board DISTRICT ELECTION COORDINATOR shall certify the names of the
- 16 candidates and the date of the election to the secretary of the
- 17 school -board DISTRICT ELECTION COORDINATOR of every other
- 18 participating school district and to the election officials
- 19 authorized by this act to conduct the election in each
- 20 participating municipality all or a portion of which is located
- 21 within a nonparticipating school district.
- 22 (3) THE AGREEMENT MAY BE AMENDED TO COORDINATE THE TERMS AND
- 23 ELECTION OF BOARD MEMBERS WITH THE TERMS AND ELECTION OF OTHER
- 24 SCHOOL OR MUNICIPAL OFFICIALS.
- Sec. 12. (1) A board may do 1 or more of the following:
- 26 (a) Establish, maintain, and operate a public library for the
- 27 district.

- 1 (b) Appoint and remove officers from among its members.
- 2 (c) Appoint and remove a librarian and necessary assistants
- 3 and fix their compensation.
- 4 (d) Acquire PURCHASE, SELL, CONVEY, LEASE, OR OTHERWISE
- 5 ACQUIRE OR DISPOSE OF real or personal property for use for library
- 6 purposes. -by purchase, land contract, installment purchase
- 7 contract, lease with or without option to purchase, or title
- 8 retaining contract.
- 9 (e) Erect buildings.
- (f) Supervise and control district library property.
- 11 (g) Enter into a contract to receive library-related service
- 12 from or give library-related service to a library or a municipality
- 13 within or without the district. ANY CONTRACT TO PROVIDE LIBRARY-
- 14 RELATED SERVICES TO A MUNICIPALITY OUTSIDE OF THE DISTRICT THAT IS
- 15 RENEWED OR ENTERED INTO AFTER 1 YEAR FROM THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE
- 16 AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED SECTION 3A SHALL REQUIRE THE DISTRICT TO
- 17 BE COMPENSATED BY THE RESIDENTS OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT BY AN AMOUNT
- 18 EQUIVALENT TO THE AMOUNT PAID ON AVERAGE BY RESIDENTS PER HOUSEHOLD
- 19 OF THE DISTRICT. IN CALCULATING THE CONTRACT AMOUNT UNDER THIS

- 24 (i) Propose and levy upon approval of the electors as provided
- 25 in this act a tax for support of the district library.
- (j) Borrow money pursuant to the district library financing
- 27 act, 1988 PA 265, MCL 397.281 to 397.290.

- 1 (k) Issue bonds pursuant to the district library financing
- 2 act, 1988 PA 265, MCL 397.281 to 397.290.
- 3 (l) Accept gifts and grants for the district library.
- 4 (m) Do any other thing necessary for conducting the district
- 5 library service, the cost of which shall be charged against the
- 6 district library fund.
- 7 (2) A board may reimburse a board member for necessary
- 8 expenses that the member incurs in the performance of official
- 9 duties. A board may compensate board members for attending OFFICIAL
- 10 meetings of the board OR COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD and shall include

- 10 SATISFIED.
- 11 (4) After the withdrawal of a municipality, the agreement
- 12 shall be amended to reflect the withdrawal.
- 13 (5) THE STATE LIBRARIAN MAY INITIATE PROCEEDINGS TO DISSOLVE A
- 14 DISTRICT LIBRARY ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS ACT IF HE OR SHE FINDS 1 OR
- 15 MORE OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 16 (A) THE DISTRICT LIBRARY DOES NOT QUALIFY FOR DISTRIBUTION OF
- 17 STATE AID AND PENAL FINES.
- 18 (B) THE DISTRICT LIBRARY BOARD HAS NOT MET WITHIN THE LAST 12
- 19 MONTHS.
- 20 (C) THE DISTRICT LIBRARY LACKS THE FUNDING TO PROVIDE ADEQUATE
- 21 LIBRARY-RELATED SERVICES.
- 22 (D) ANY OTHER APPROPRIATE FACTORS CONSIDERED BY THE STATE
- 23 LIBRARIAN THAT WARRANT THE DISSOLUTION OF THE DISTRICT.
