## **SENATE BILL No. 768**

September 21, 2005, Introduced by Senators BISHOP, GARCIA, BIRKHOLZ and BROWN and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"
by amending section 72105a (MCL 324.72105a), as added by 1997 PA
129.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 72105a. (1) The department shall establish an "adopt-atrail" program that will allow volunteer groups to assist in maintaining and enhancing Michigan trailways and rail-trails.
  - (2) Subject to subsection (3), volunteer groups in the adopta-trail program may adopt any available Michigan trailway or railtrail or Michigan trailway or rail-trail segment and may choose any 1 or more of the following volunteer activities:

- 1 (a) Spring cleanups.
- 2 (b) Environmental activities.
- 3 (c) Accessibility projects.
- 4 (d) Special events.
- 5 (e) Trailway maintenance and development.
- 6 (f) Public information and assistance.

- 8 (3) The department shall designate the activities to be
- 9 performed by a volunteer group in the adopt-a-trail program. The
- 10 department may provide for more than 1 volunteer group to adopt a
- 11 Michigan trailway or rail-trail or Michigan trailway or rail-trail
- 12 segment.
- 13 (4) A volunteer group that wishes to participate in the adopt-
- 14 a-trail program shall submit an application to the department on a
- 15 form provided by the department. Additionally, volunteer groups
- 16 shall agree to the following:
- 17 (a) Volunteer groups shall participate in the program for at
- 18 least a 2-year period.
- 19 (b) Volunteer groups shall consist of at least 6 people who
- 20 are 18 years of age or older, unless the volunteer group is a
- 21 school or scout organization, in which case the volunteers may be
- 22 under 18 years of age.
- (c) Volunteer groups shall contribute a total of at least 400
- 24 service hours over a 2-year period.
- 25 (d) Volunteer groups shall comply with other reasonable
- 26 requirements of the department.
- 27 (5) A state park manager or a district forest manager may

- 1 issue to volunteers who are actively working on adopt-a-trail
- 2 projects that last more than 1 day free camping permits if
- 3 campsites are available. A state park manager or a district forest
- 4 manager may waive state park entry fees for volunteers entering
- 5 state parks to work on adopt-a-trail projects.
- 6 (6) While a volunteer is working on an adopt-a-trail project,
- 7 the volunteer has the same immunity from civil liability as a
- 8 department employee and shall be treated in the same manner as an
- 9 employee under section 8 of 1964 PA 170, MCL 691.1408.
- 10 (7) The department shall design and erect near the entrance of
- 11 each Michigan trailway or rail-trail in the adopt-a-trail program
- 12 or along the trailway an adopt-a-trail program sign with the name
- of the volunteer group's sponsoring organization listed for each
- 14 volunteer group that has contributed at least 100 service hours by
- 15 volunteers.
- 16 (8) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE A VOLUNTEER GROUP CONDUCTING
- 17 LITTER CLEANUP EFFORTS UNDER THE ADOPT-A-TRAIL PROGRAM WITH A
- 18 METHOD FOR THE VOLUNTEER GROUP TO RECORD A GENERAL CHARACTERIZATION
- 19 OF THE TYPES AND AMOUNT OF TRASH COLLECTED DURING THE GROUP'S
- 20 CLEANUP EFFORT. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUEST THE GROUP TO FORWARD
- 21 THE INFORMATION RECORDED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY
- 22 ON COMPLETION.
- Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 24 unless Senate Bill No. 767
- of the 93rd Legislature is enacted into law.
