SENATE BILL No. 810

October 18, 2005, Introduced by Senators SCOTT and CLARKE and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending section 759 (MCL 168.759), as amended by 1995 PA 261.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 759. (1) At any time during the 75 days before a primary
- 2 or special primary, but not later than 2 p.m. of the Saturday
- 3 immediately before the primary or special primary, an elector who
- qualifies to vote as an absent voter, as defined in section 758,
- 5 may apply for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in
- 6 person or by mail with the clerk of the township, city, or village
- 7 in which the elector is registered. An application received before
 - a primary or special primary may be for either that primary only,

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- 1 or for that primary and the election that follows.
- 2 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (1), at any
- 3 time during the 75 days before an election, but not later than 2
- 4 p.m. of the Saturday before the election, an elector who qualifies
- 5 to vote as an absent voter, as defined in section 758, may apply
- 6 for an absent voter ballot. The elector shall apply in person or by
- 7 mail with the clerk of the township, city, or village in which the
- 8 voter is registered.
- 9 (3) An application for an absent voter ballot under this
- 10 section may be made in any of the following ways:
- 11 (a) By a written request signed by the voter stating the
- 12 statutory grounds for making the application.
- 13 (b) On an absent voter ballot application form provided for
- 14 that purpose by the clerk of the city, township, or village.
- 15 (c) On a federal postcard application.
- 16 (4) An applicant for an absent voter ballot shall sign the
- 17 application. A clerk or assistant clerk shall not deliver an absent
- 18 voter ballot to an applicant who does not sign the application. A
- 19 person -other than SHALL NOT BE IN POSSESSION OF A SIGNED ABSENT
- 20 VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION EXCEPT FOR the applicant; a member of the
- 21 applicant's immediate family; a person residing in the applicant's
- 22 household; a person whose job normally includes the handling of
- 23 mail, but only during the course of his or her employment; a
- 24 registered elector requested by the applicant TO RETURN THE
- 25 APPLICATION; or a clerk, assistant of the clerk, or other
- 26 authorized election official. -shall not be in possession of a
- 27 signed absent voter ballot application. A registered elector who

- 1 is requested by the applicant to return his or her absent voter
- 2 ballot application shall sign the certificate on the absent voter
- 3 ballot application.
- 4 (5) The clerk of the city, township, or village shall have
- 5 absent voter ballot application forms available in the CLERK'S
- 6 office of the clerk at all times and shall furnish an absent
- 7 voter ballot application form to anyone upon a verbal or written
- 8 request. IN ADDITION, THE CLERK OF THE CITY, TOWNSHIP, OR VILLAGE
- 9 MAY FORWARD AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION FORM TO A QUALIFIED
- 10 AND REGISTERED ELECTOR WHO IS 60 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER, EVEN IF THE
- 11 ELECTOR HAS NOT REQUESTED AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION FORM
- 12 UNDER THIS SECTION. The absent voter ballot application shall be in
- 13 substantially the following form:
- "Application for absent voter ballot for:
- 15 [] The primary or special primary election to be held on
- $16 \quad \frac{1}{\dots 19\dots} \quad \text{(DATE)} .$
- 17 [] The election to be held on $\frac{19...}{19...}$ (DATE).
- 18 (Check applicable election or elections)
- 19 I,, a qualified and registered elector of the
- 20 precinct of the township of or village of
- **21** or of the ward of the city of , in
- 22 the county of and state of Michigan, apply for an
- 23 official ballot, or ballots, to be voted by me at the election or
- 24 elections as requested in this application.
- The statutory grounds on which I base my request are:
- 26 [] I expect to be absent from the community in which I am
- 27 registered for the entire time the polls are open on election day.

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1	[] I am physically unable to attend the polls without the
2	assistance of another.
3	[] I cannot attend the polls because of the tenets of my
4	religion.
5	[] I have been appointed an election precinct inspector in a
6	precinct other than the precinct where I reside.
7	[] I am 60 years of age or older.
8	[] I cannot attend the polls because I am confined to jail
9	awaiting arraignment or trial.
10	(Check applicable reason)
11	Send absent voter ballot to me at:

26	A person making a false statement in this absent voter ballot
27	application is guilty of a misdemeanor. It is a violation of

- 1 Michigan election law for a person other than those listed in the 2 instructions to return, offer to return, agree to return, or solicit to return your absent voter ballot application to the 3 clerk. An assistant authorized by the clerk who receives absent 5 voter ballot applications at a location other than the CLERK'S office -of the clerk- must have credentials signed by the clerk. Ask to see his or her credentials before entrusting your 7 application with a person claiming to have the clerk's 8 authorization to return your application. 9 10 Certificate of Authorized Registered 11 Elector Returning Absent Voter 12 Ballot Application 13 I certify that my name is, my address is 14, and my date of birth is; that I 15 am delivering the absent voter ballot application of at his or her request; that I did not solicit 16 17 or request to return the application; that I have not made any 18 markings on the application; that I have not altered the 19 application in any way; that I have not influenced the applicant; 20 and that I am aware that a false statement in this certificate is a violation of Michigan election law. 21 22 (Signature)" 23 (Date)
- 24 (6) The following instructions for an applicant for an absent
 25 voter ballot shall be included with each application furnished an
 26 applicant:

1 INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS FOR ABSENT VOTER BALLOTS

- 2 Step 1. After completely filling out the application, sign and
- 3 date the application in the place designated. Your signature must
- 4 appear on the application or you will not receive an absent voter
- 5 ballot.
- 6 Step 2. Deliver the application by 1 of the following methods:
- 7 (a) Place the application in an envelope addressed to the
- 8 appropriate clerk and place the necessary postage upon the return
- 9 envelope and deposit it in the United States mail or with another
- 10 public postal service, express mail service, parcel post service,
- 11 or common carrier.
- 12 (b) Deliver the application personally to the CLERK'S office,
- 13 of the clerk, or to an authorized assistant of the
- 14 clerk.
- 15 (c) In either (a) or (b), a member of the immediate family of
- 16 the voter including a father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law,
- 17 sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandparent, or
- 18 grandchild or a person residing in the voter's household may mail
- 19 or deliver the application to the clerk for the applicant.
- 20 (d) In the event—IF an applicant cannot return the
- 21 application in any of the above methods, the applicant may select
- 22 any registered elector to return the application. The person
- 23 returning the application must sign and return the certificate at
- 24 the bottom of the application.
- 25 (7) A person who prints and distributes absent voter ballot
- 26 applications shall print on the application the warning,
- 27 certificate of authorized registered elector returning absent voter

- 1 ballot application, and instructions required by this section.
- 2 (8) A person who makes a false statement in an absent voter
- 3 ballot application is guilty of a misdemeanor. A person who forges
- 4 a signature on an absent voter ballot application is guilty of a
- 5 felony. A person who is not authorized in this act and who both
- 6 distributes absent voter ballot applications to absent voters and
- 7 returns those absent voter ballot applications to a clerk or
- 8 assistant of the clerk is guilty of a misdemeanor.
