SENATE BILL No. 835

October 20, 2005, Introduced by Senator SWITALSKI and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 2002 PA 591, entitled
"Michigan nursing scholarship act,"
by amending the title and sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9
(MCL 390.1181, 390.1182, 390.1183, 390.1184, 390.1185, 390.1186,
390.1187, 390.1188, and 390.1189) and by adding sections 7a and 7b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 TITLE

An act to establish an educational scholarship program for eligible resident students enrolled in certain nursing —programs SCHOOLS; to prescribe conditions for repayment of the scholarships; TO PROVIDE GRANTS TO SUPPORT NURSING SCHOOLS IN THIS STATE; to provide for the administration of the —Michigan— nursing scholarship program AND NURSING SCHOOL GRANT PROGRAM; and to

- 1 prescribe certain powers and duties of certain state officers,
- 2 agencies, and departments.
- 3 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 4 "Michigan "nursing scholarship EDUCATION INCENTIVES act".
- 5 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 6 (a) "Authority" means the Michigan higher education assistance
- 7 authority created by 1960 PA 77, MCL 390.951 to 390.961.
- 8 (b) "Eligible costs" means tuition and fees charged by an
- 9 eligible institution; related costs for room, board, books,
- 10 supplies, transportation, or day care; and other costs determined
- 11 by the authority.
- 12 (c) "Eligible employment" means a registered nurse or licensed
- 13 practical nurse providing full-time nursing care, or part-time
- 14 nursing care if section 7 applies, in a ward, emergency department,
- 15 emergency room, operating room, or trauma center of a hospital
- 16 licensed under article 17 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368,
- 17 MCL 333.20101 to 333.22260, in a nursing home or hospice licensed
- 18 under article 17 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 19 333.20101 to 333.22260, in a health facility or agency licensed
- 20 under article 17 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 21 333.20101 to 333.22260, that provides nonemergency health care to
- 22 patients without receiving compensation for providing that
- 23 nonemergency health care, or in a clinic or other health care
- 24 program operated by a local health department that provides 1 or
- 25 more required services under part 24 of the public health code,
- 26 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.2401 to 333.2498, or as an employee of a home
- 27 health care agency providing home patient care.

- 1 (d) "Eligible institution" means a degree or certificate
- 2 granting public or independent nonprofit college or university,
- 3 junior college, or community college in this state.
- 4 (e) "Licensed practical nurse" means an individual licensed to
- 5 engage in the practice of nursing as a licensed practical nurse as
- 6 defined in section 17201 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368,
- **7** MCL 333.17201.
- 8 (f) "Nursing -program SCHOOL" means a program for the
- 9 training of individuals to become registered nurses or licensed
- 10 practical nurses operated in this state by an eligible institution
- 11 and approved by the Michigan board of nursing.
- 12 (g) "Registered professional nurse" means that term as defined
- in section 17201 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- **14** 333.17201.
- 15 Sec. 3. The <u>Michigan</u> nursing scholarship program is created,
- 16 to be administered by the authority. The authority shall do all of
- 17 the following:
- 18 (a) Award scholarships to eligible students pursuant to this
- **19** act.
- 20 (b) Develop a scholarship agreement to be entered into by a
- 21 scholarship recipient and the authority that contains the terms of
- 22 a scholarship made under this act and the rights and obligations of
- 23 the scholarship recipient and the authority.
- (c) Collect repayment of scholarships if required under
- 25 section 7.
- 26 (d) Conduct periodic audits of scholarship recipients to
- 27 ensure compliance with the terms of the scholarship agreement and

- 1 take necessary steps to enforce the terms of the scholarship
- 2 agreement.
- 3 (e) Publicize the <u>Michigan</u> nursing scholarship program and
- 4 recruit qualifying students to participate in the <u>Michigan</u>
- 5 nursing scholarship program.
- 6 (f) Promulgate rules, as necessary to implement this act,
- 7 pursuant to the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306,
- 8 MCL 24.201 to 24.328. The rules may include additional standards of
- 9 eligibility for students to receive scholarships under this act.
- 10 Sec. 4. The authority may award a scholarship under this act
- 11 to an individual determined by the authority to meet all of the
- 12 following eligibility criteria:
- 13 (a) Is a United States citizen or permanent resident of the
- 14 United States.
- 15 (b) Has resided continuously in this state for the 12 months
- 16 immediately preceding the date of his or her application and is not
- 17 a resident of any other state.
- 18 (c) Is enrolled or has been accepted into a nursing -program
- 19 SCHOOL.
- 20 (d) Has signed a written scholarship agreement with the
- 21 authority stating the individual's intention to pursue nursing as a
- 22 career and to serve in eligible employment in this state for not
- 23 less than 1 of the following periods:
- 24 (i) One year if the individual received scholarship assistance
- 25 under this act in 1 academic year of full-time enrollment in a
- 26 nursing program SCHOOL.
- 27 (ii) Two years if the individual received scholarship

- 1 assistance under this act in 2 academic years of full-time
- 2 enrollment in a nursing -program SCHOOL.
- 3 (iii) Three years if the individual received scholarship
- 4 assistance under this act in 3 academic years of full-time
- 5 enrollment in a nursing -program SCHOOL.
- 6 (iv) Four years if the individual received scholarship
- 7 assistance under this act in 4 academic years of full-time
- 8 enrollment in a nursing -program SCHOOL.
- 9 (e) Is in compliance with this act and the rules promulgated
- 10 under this act.
- 11 (f) Has not been convicted of a felony involving an assault,
- 12 physical injury, or death.
- 13 (g) Meets any other standards established in rules promulgated
- 14 by the authority under section 3.
- Sec. 5. (1) Subject to subsection -(2) (3) AND SECTION 8(2),
- 16 each scholarship recipient shall receive a \$4,000.00 scholarship
- 17 OF NOT MORE THAN \$4,000.00 for 1 academic year of full-time
- 18 enrollment, or a partial scholarship for part-time enrollment, in a
- 19 nursing program SCHOOL.
- 20 (2) The authority shall determine the amount of a partial
- 21 scholarship by multiplying -\$4,000.00 THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT FOR
- 22 FULL-TIME ENROLLMENT IN THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR by the number of
- 23 credit hours for which a student enrolls in an academic year, and
- 24 dividing the product by 30 if the nursing -program SCHOOL uses
- 25 semester credits or by 45 if the nursing -program SCHOOL uses term
- 26 credits.
- 27 (3) -(2) A scholarship described in subsection (1) shall not

- 1 exceed an amount equal to the recipient's eligible costs minus any
- 2 other grants or scholarships the recipient receives in any academic
- 3 year in a nursing -program SCHOOL.
- 4 (4) —(3)— An individual shall not receive scholarship
- 5 assistance for more than 4 academic years.
- 6 Sec. 6. Recipients of scholarship assistance under this act
- 7 shall continue to receive scholarship payments only during periods
- 8 that the authority finds that the recipient is both of the
- 9 following:
- 10 (a) Enrolled as a full-time or part-time student in a nursing
- 11 program SCHOOL.
- 12 (b) Maintaining satisfactory progress as determined by the
- 13 eligible institution.
- 14 Sec. 7. (1) An individual shall not receive a scholarship
- 15 under this act unless he or she enters into a written agreement
- 16 with the authority, in which he or she agrees to all of the
- 17 following:
- 18 (a) To obtain a license from this state as a registered
- 19 professional nurse or licensed practical nurse within 1 year after
- 20 completing the nursing -program SCHOOL for which the scholarship
- 21 was awarded.
- 22 (b) Beginning within 1 year after completing the nursing
- 23 program SCHOOL for which the scholarship was awarded, to serve for
- 24 the period of eligible employment applicable to the individual
- 25 under section 4(d) in this state.
- 26 (c) To provide the authority evidence of compliance with
- 27 section 6 as required by the authority.

- 1 (d) Except as provided in subsection (4), (5), (6), or (7), if
- 2 the conditions in subdivisions (a) and (b) are not satisfied, to
- 3 repay all or part of a scholarship award received under this act
- 4 plus interest and, if applicable, reasonable collection fees, in
- 5 compliance with rules promulgated by the authority.
- 6 (2) The agreement described in subsection (1) must fully
- 7 disclose the terms and conditions under which scholarship
- 8 assistance under this act is provided and under which repayment may
- 9 be required. The agreement must include a description of both of
- 10 the following:
- 11 (a) The appeals procedures established by the authority under
- 12 which a recipient may appeal a determination of noncompliance with
- 13 any provision under this act.
- 14 (b) The procedures under which a recipient of assistance
- 15 received under this act who serves in eligible employment in this
- 16 state for less than the period required under subsection (1) may
- 17 have the repayment requirements extended under subsection (4) or
- 18 excused under subsection (5), (6), or (7).
- 19 (3) The authority shall require recipients found by the
- 20 authority to be in noncompliance with the agreement entered into
- 21 under this section to repay the scholarship awards received, plus
- 22 interest, but in no event at an interest rate higher than the rate
- 23 applicable to other student loans MADE OR guaranteed by the
- 24 authority in that time period and, where applicable, reasonable
- 25 collection fees, on a schedule and at a rate of interest to be
- 26 prescribed by the authority by rule.
- 27 (4) A recipient is not in violation of the agreement entered

- 1 into pursuant to subsection (1) and any repayment obligation is
- 2 deferred during any period in which the recipient meets 1 of the
- 3 following:
- 4 (a) Is pursuing a full-time course of study related to the
- 5 field of nursing at an eligible institution.
- 6 (b) Is serving as a member of the armed services of the United
- 7 States for a period of 3 years or less.
- 8 (c) Is temporarily totally disabled for a period of 3 years or
- 9 less, as established by sworn affidavit of a qualified physician.
- 10 (d) Satisfies the provisions of any other repayment exceptions
- 11 prescribed by the authority by rule.
- 12 (5) A recipient is not in violation of the agreement entered
- 13 into pursuant to subsection (1), and the recipient may be excused
- 14 from repayment of any scholarship assistance received under this
- 15 act, if the recipient is employed providing part-time nursing care
- 16 and all of the following are met:
- 17 (a) The <u>department</u> AUTHORITY by rule has established a
- 18 minimum average number of hours per week a recipient must be
- 19 employed providing nursing care to qualify as providing part-time
- 20 nursing care for the purposes of this subsection, and the recipient
- 21 meets this requirement.
- 22 (b) The recipient is engaged in eligible employment in this
- 23 state.
- 24 (c) The recipient provides part-time nursing care for not less
- 25 than 1 of the following periods:
- 26 (i) Two years if the recipient received -a \$4,000.00 1
- 27 scholarship under this act for 1 academic year of full-time

- 1 enrollment in a nursing -program SCHOOL. If the recipient received
- 2 a partial scholarship for 1 academic year of part-time enrollment,
- 3 this 2-year time period is reduced to a time period determined by
- 4 multiplying 2 years by a fraction, the numerator of which is the
- 5 dollar amount of the partial scholarship and the denominator of
- 6 which is \$\frac{\$4,000.00}{}\$ THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT FOR FULL-TIME
- 7 ENROLLMENT IN THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR.
- 8 (ii) Four years if the recipient received $\frac{1}{1}$ two \$4,000.00 2
- 9 scholarships under this act for 2 academic years of full-time
- 10 enrollment in a nursing program SCHOOL. If the recipient received
- 11 partial scholarships for 2 academic years of part-time enrollment,
- 12 this 4-year time period is reduced to a time period determined by
- 13 multiplying 4 years by a fraction, the numerator of which is the
- 14 dollar amount of the partial scholarships and the denominator of
- 15 which is \$\frac{\\$8,000.00}{}\$ 200% OF THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT FOR FULL-TIME
- 16 ENROLLMENT IN THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR.
- 17 (iii) Six years if the recipient received three \$4,000.00 3
- 18 scholarships under this act for 3 academic years of full-time
- 19 enrollment in a nursing -program SCHOOL. If the recipient received
- 20 partial scholarships for 3 academic years of part-time enrollment,
- 21 this 6-year time period is reduced to a time period determined by
- 22 multiplying 6 years by a fraction, the numerator of which is the
- 23 dollar amount of the partial scholarships and the denominator of
- 24 which is \$\frac{\$12,000.00}{} 300\% OF THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT FOR FULL-TIME
- 25 ENROLLMENT IN THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR.
- 26 (iv) Eight years if the recipient received $\frac{\text{four $4,000.00}}{\text{four $4,000.00}}$
- 27 scholarships under this act for 4 academic years of full-time

- 1 enrollment in a nursing program SCHOOL. If the recipient received
- 2 partial scholarships for 4 academic years of part-time enrollment,
- 3 this 8-year time period is reduced to a time period determined by
- 4 multiplying 8 years by a fraction, the numerator of which is the
- 5 dollar amount of the partial scholarships and the denominator of
- 6 which is \$\frac{\$16,000.00}{}\$ 400% OF THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT FOR FULL-TIME
- 7 ENROLLMENT IN THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR.
- 8 (6) A recipient is not in violation of the agreement entered
- 9 into pursuant to subsection (1), and the recipient may be excused
- 10 from repayment of any scholarship assistance received under this
- 11 act, if the recipient meets both of the following:
- 12 (a) Received 1 or more partial scholarships under this act for
- 13 part-time enrollment in a nursing -program SCHOOL.
- 14 (b) Is engaged in full-time, eligible employment in this state
- 15 for not less than 1 of the following time periods:
- (i) If the recipient received a partial scholarship for 1
- 17 academic year of part-time enrollment, a time period determined by
- 18 multiplying 1 year by a fraction, the numerator of which is the
- 19 dollar amount of the partial scholarship and the denominator of
- 20 which is \$\frac{\$4,000.00}{}{} THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT FOR FULL-TIME
- 21 ENROLLMENT IN THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR.
- 22 (ii) If the recipient received partial scholarships for 2
- 23 academic years of part-time enrollment, a time period determined by
- 24 multiplying 2 years by a fraction, the numerator of which is the
- 25 dollar amount of the partial scholarships and the denominator of
- 26 which is \$8,000.00 200% OF THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT FOR FULL-TIME
- 27 ENROLLMENT IN THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR.

- 1 (iii) If the recipient received partial scholarships for 3
- 2 academic years of part-time enrollment, a time period determined by
- 3 multiplying 3 years by a fraction, the numerator of which is the
- 4 dollar amount of the partial scholarships and the denominator of
- 5 which is \$\frac{\$12,000.00}{} 300% OF THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT FOR FULL-TIME
- 6 ENROLLMENT IN THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR.
- 7 (iv) If the recipient received partial scholarships for 4
- 8 academic years of part-time enrollment, a time period determined by
- 9 multiplying 4 years by a fraction, the numerator of which is the
- 10 dollar amount of the partial scholarships and the denominator of
- 11 which is \$\frac{\$16,000.00}{} 400\% OF THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT FOR FULL-TIME
- 12 ENROLLMENT IN THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR.
- 13 (7) A recipient is excused from repayment of any scholarship
- 14 assistance received under this act if the recipient becomes
- 15 permanently and totally disabled as established by sworn affidavit
- 16 of a qualified physician or dies or if circumstances occur that the
- 17 authority considers as a compelling reason to excuse repayment.
- 18 SEC. 7A. THE NURSING SCHOOL GRANT PROGRAM IS CREATED, TO BE
- 19 ADMINISTERED BY THE AUTHORITY. THE AUTHORITY SHALL DO ALL OF THE
- 20 FOLLOWING:
- 21 (A) AWARD GRANTS TO NURSING SCHOOLS PURSUANT TO THIS ACT.
- 22 (B) DEVELOP A FORM OF GRANT APPLICATION FOR USE BY A NURSING
- 23 SCHOOL SEEKING A GRANT UNDER THIS ACT THAT CONTAINS THE TERMS OF
- 24 THE GRANT AND THE RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE NURSING SCHOOL IF
- 25 IT IS AWARDED A GRANT.
- 26 (C) CONDUCT PERIODIC AUDITS OF GRANT RECIPIENTS TO ENSURE
- 27 COMPLIANCE WITH THE TERMS OF THE GRANT AND TAKE NECESSARY STEPS TO

- 1 ENFORCE THE TERMS OF THE GRANT.
- 2 (D) PUBLICIZE THE NURSING SCHOOL GRANT PROGRAM.
- 3 (E) PROMULGATE RULES AS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS ACT
- 4 PURSUANT TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, 1969 PA 306,
- 5 MCL 24.201 TO 24.328. THE RULES MAY INCLUDE ADDITIONAL STANDARDS OF
- 6 ELIGIBILITY FOR NURSING SCHOOLS TO RECEIVE GRANTS UNDER THIS ACT.
- 7 SEC. 7B. (1) THE AUTHORITY MAY AWARD A GRANT UNDER THIS ACT TO
- 8 A NURSING SCHOOL DETERMINED BY THE AUTHORITY TO MEET ALL OF THE
- 9 FOLLOWING ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:
- 10 (A) THE NURSING SCHOOL IS ENGAGED IN TRAINING OF INDIVIDUALS
- 11 TO BECOME REGISTERED NURSES OR LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSES.
- 12 (B) THE NURSING SCHOOL IS OPERATED IN THIS STATE BY AN
- 13 ELIGIBLE INSTITUTION.
- 14 (C) THE NURSING SCHOOL IS APPROVED BY THE MICHIGAN BOARD OF
- 15 NURSING.
- 16 (D) THE NURSING SCHOOL HAS ENROLLED MORE STUDENTS IN THE
- 17 ACADEMIC YEAR WHEN THE GRANT APPLICATION IS SUBMITTED THAN IN THE
- 18 PREVIOUS ACADEMIC YEAR.
- 19 (E) THE NURSING SCHOOL HAS SUBMITTED A WRITTEN GRANT
- 20 APPLICATION TO THE AUTHORITY IN THE FORM ESTABLISHED BY THE
- 21 DEPARTMENT UNDER SECTION 7A(B).
- 22 (F) THE NURSING SCHOOL IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS ACT AND THE
- 23 RULES PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ACT.
- 24 (G) THE NURSING SCHOOL MEETS ANY OTHER STANDARDS ESTABLISHED
- 25 IN RULES PROMULGATED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER SECTION 7A.
- 26 (2) A NURSING SCHOOL MAY ONLY SUBMIT 1 GRANT APPLICATION IN AN
- 27 ACADEMIC YEAR.

- 1 (3) A NURSING SCHOOL MAY ONLY USE GRANT MONEY RECEIVED UNDER
- 2 THIS ACT FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES:
- 3 (A) EMPLOYMENT OF FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME FACULTY AND SUPPORT
- 4 PERSONNEL.
- 5 (B) PROVIDING CLINICAL SUPERVISION AT HOSPITALS AND OTHER
- 6 HEALTH CARE FACILITIES.
- 7 (C) PURCHASING INSTRUCTIONAL EQUIPMENT, MATERIALS, SUPPLIES,
- 8 AND SOFTWARE.
- 9 (D) PROVIDING SPECIAL PREPARATION CLASSES FOR NURSING
- 10 GRADUATES TAKING A STATE-APPROVED LICENSING EXAMINATION.
- 11 (E) PRODUCING MARKETING AND RECRUITMENT MATERIALS AIMED AT
- 12 ATTRACTING QUALIFIED STUDENTS TO THE NURSING SCHOOL.
- 13 Sec. 8. (1) The department of treasury shall establish and
- 14 administer a restricted account in the general fund for the
- 15 Michigan nursing scholarship -program AND NURSING SCHOOL GRANT
- 16 PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED IN THIS ACT, NAMED THE "NURSING EDUCATION
- 17 INCENTIVE FUND". The department of treasury shall credit to the
- 18 account money appropriated from the Michigan merit award trust fund
- 19 established in section 3 of the Michigan merit award scholarship
- 20 act, 1999 PA 94, MCL 390.1453, or APPROPRIATED OR received from any
- 21 other source including, but not limited to, amounts repaid to the
- 22 authority on scholarships awarded under this act and earnings in
- 23 the account. The department of treasury shall use the money in the
- 24 account only to provide money to the authority for scholarships AND
- 25 GRANTS awarded under this act.
- 26 (2) BEFORE EACH STATE FISCAL YEAR, FROM MONEY APPROPRIATED FOR
- 27 THAT FISCAL YEAR FOR THE NURSING SCHOLARSHIP AND NURSING SCHOOL

- 1 GRANT PROGRAMS, THE AUTHORITY SHALL DETERMINE THE AMOUNT ALLOCATED
- 2 TO EACH OF THE PROGRAMS; THE AMOUNT IT INTENDS TO DISTRIBUTE FROM
- 3 MONEY ALLOCATED TO THE NURSING SCHOOL GRANT PROGRAMS TO INDIVIDUAL
- 4 NURSING SCHOOLS; AND THE SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT FOR FULL-TIME
- 5 ENROLLMENT FOR THAT STATE FISCAL YEAR, BASED ON ITS DETERMINATION
- 6 OF AVAILABLE RESOURCES AND AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED.
- 7 (3) $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$ Money in the account at the end of a **STATE** fiscal
- 8 year shall not revert to the general fund but shall be carried over
- 9 in the account to the next STATE fiscal year.
- 10 Sec. 9. Not later than November 1, the authority shall
- 11 annually submit a report to the state budget director, the house
- 12 and senate appropriation subcommittees on higher education, and the
- 13 house and senate fiscal agencies for the preceding STATE fiscal
- 14 year on the nursing scholarship program. The report shall include,
- 15 but is not limited to, THE AMOUNT ALLOCATED TO EACH OF THE
- 16 PROGRAMS, the number of full and partial scholarships, the total
- 17 dollar amount of scholarships awarded, the type of eligible
- 18 institutions in which the scholarship recipients enrolled, and the
- 19 number of scholarships, if any, for which students have incurred a
- 20 repayment obligation under section 7(3).
