SENATE BILL No. 843

October 25, 2005, Introduced by Senator GILBERT and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 222, entitled

"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to regulate the use and disclosure of information obtained from the card; to prescribe the powers and duties of the secretary of state; to prescribe fees; to prescribe certain penalties for violations; and to provide an appropriation for certain purposes,"

by amending sections 1 and 2 (MCL 28.291 and 28.292), section 1 as amended by 1997 PA 99 and section 2 as amended by 2003 PA 143.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. (1) A person who is a resident of this state may apply
 - to the department of state for an official state personal
- 3 identification card. Upon application the applicant shall supply -a
 - BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:
 - (A) DOCUMENTS SUFFICIENT TO ESTABLISH THAT THE APPLICANT IS A

- 1 CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES OR A RESIDENT ALIEN LAWFULLY ADMITTED
- 2 TO THE UNITED STATES.
- 3 (B) A birth certificate attesting to his OR HER age or other
- 4 sufficient documents or identification as the secretary of state
- 5 may require.
- 6 (2) The secretary of state shall not issue an official state
- 7 personal identification card to a person who holds an operator's or
- 8 chauffeur's license issued pursuant to UNDER the Michigan vehicle
- 9 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, unless the license has
- 10 been suspended, revoked, or restricted.
- 11 Sec. 2. (1) The official state personal identification card
- 12 shall contain the following:
- 13 (a) An identification number permanently assigned to the
- 14 person.
- 15 (b) The full name, date of birth, sex, residential address,
- 16 height, weight, eye color, image, and signature of the person to
- 17 whom the identification card is issued.
- 18 (c) An indication that the identification card contains 1 or
- 19 more of the following:
- 20 (i) The blood type of the person.
- 21 (ii) Immunization data of the person.
- 22 (iii) Medication data of the person.
- 23 (iv) A statement that the person is deaf.
- (v) A statement that the person is an organ and tissue donor
- 25 pursuant to UNDER part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368,
- 26 MCL 333.10101 to 333.10109. If the identification card contains
- 27 such a statement, the statement shall include the signature of the

- 1 person, along with the signature of at least 1 witness.
- 2 (vi) Emergency contact information of the person.
- 3 (d) Beginning July 1, 2003, in the case of a person who is
- 4 less than 18 years of age at the time of issuance of the
- 5 identification card, the dates on which the person will become 18
- 6 years of age and 21 years of age.
- 7 (e) Beginning July 1, 2003, in the case of a person who is at
- 8 least 18 years of age but less than 21 years of age at the time of
- 9 issuance of the identification card, the date on which the person
- 10 will become 21 years of age.
- 11 (2) In conjunction with the issuance of an official state
- 12 personal identification card, the secretary of state shall do all
- 13 of the following:
- 14 (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:
- 15 (i) Written information explaining the applicant's right to
- 16 make an anatomical gift in the event of death -pursuant to UNDER
- 17 part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to
- 18 333.10109, and in accordance with this section.
- 19 (ii) Written information describing the organ donation registry
- 20 program maintained by Michigan's federally designated organ
- 21 procurement organization or its successor organization. The written
- 22 information required under this subparagraph shall include, in a
- 23 type size and format that is conspicuous in relation to the
- 24 surrounding material, the address and telephone number of
- 25 Michigan's federally designated organ procurement organization or
- 26 its successor organization, along with an advisory to call
- 27 Michigan's federally designated organ procurement organization or

- 1 its successor organization with questions about the organ donor
- 2 registry program.
- 3 (iii) Written information giving the applicant the opportunity
- 4 to have his or her name placed on the organ donor registry
- **5** described in subparagraph (ii).
- 6 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on
- 7 his or her official state personal identification card that he or
- 8 she is willing to make an anatomical gift in the event of death
- 9 pursuant to UNDER part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368,
- 10 MCL 333.10101 to 333.10109, and in accordance with this section.
- 11 (c) Inform the applicant in writing that, if he or she
- 12 indicates to the secretary of state under this section a
- 13 willingness to have his or her name placed on the organ donor
- 14 registry described in subdivision (a) (ii), the secretary of state
- 15 will forward the applicant's name and address to the organ donation
- 16 registry maintained by Michigan's federally designated organ
- 17 procurement organization or its successor organization, pursuant to
- 18 subsection (4).
- 19 (3) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of
- 20 subsection (2) by 1 or more of the following methods:
- 21 (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice
- 22 for the issuance or renewal of an official state personal
- 23 identification card.
- 24 (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who personally
- 25 appears at a secretary of state branch office.
- 26 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for
- 27 applications processed by electronic means.

- 1 (4) If an applicant indicates a willingness under this section
- 2 to have his or her name placed on the organ donor registry
- 3 described in subsection (2)(a)(ii), the secretary of state shall
- 4 within 10 days forward the applicant's name and address to the
- 5 organ donor registry maintained by Michigan's federally designated
- 6 organ procurement organization or its successor organization. The
- 7 secretary of state may forward information under this subsection by
- 8 mail or by electronic means. The secretary of state shall not
- 9 maintain a record of the name or address of an individual who
- 10 indicates a willingness to have his or her name placed on the organ
- 11 donor registry after forwarding that information to the organ donor
- 12 registry under this subsection. Information about an applicant's
- 13 indication of a willingness to have his or her name placed on the
- 14 organ donor registry obtained by the secretary of state under
- 15 subsection (2) and forwarded under this subsection is exempt from
- 16 disclosure under the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL
- 17 15.231 to 15.246, pursuant to section 13(1)(d) of the freedom of
- 18 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.243.
- 19 (5) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the
- 20 identification card. The secretary of state shall designate on the
- 21 identification card a space where the applicant may place a sticker
- 22 or decal of the uniform size as the secretary may specify to
- 23 indicate that the cardholder carries a separate emergency medical
- 24 information card. The sticker or decal may be provided by any
- 25 person, hospital, school, medical group, or association interested
- 26 in assisting in implementing the emergency medical information
- 27 card, but shall meet the specifications of the secretary of state.

- 1 The sticker or decal also may be used to indicate that the
- 2 cardholder has designated 1 or more patient advocates in accordance
- 3 with section 5506 of the estates and protected individuals code,
- 4 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5506. The emergency medical information card,
- 5 carried separately by the cardholder, may contain the information
- 6 described in subsection (2)(c), information concerning the
- 7 cardholder's patient advocate designation, other emergency medical
- 8 information, or an indication as to where the cardholder has stored
- 9 or registered emergency medical information. Beginning on and after
- 10 July 1, 2003, an original identification card or the renewal of an
- 11 existing identification card issued to a person less than 21 years
- 12 of age shall be portrait or vertical in form and an identification
- 13 card issued to a person 21 years of age or over shall be landscape
- 14 or horizontal in form. Except as otherwise required in this act,
- 15 other information required on the identification card pursuant to
- 16 this act may appear on the identification card in a form prescribed
- 17 by the secretary of state.
- 18 (6) The identification card shall not contain a fingerprint or
- 19 finger image of the applicant.
- 20 (7) Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of
- 21 state may retain and use a person's image and signature described
- 22 in subsection (1)(b) only for programs administered by the
- 23 secretary of state. Except as provided in this subsection, the
- 24 secretary of state shall not use a person's image unless written
- 25 permission for that purpose is granted by the person to the
- 26 secretary of state or specific enabling legislation permitting the
- 27 use is enacted into law. A law enforcement agency of this state

- 1 shall have access to any information retained by the secretary of
- 2 state under this subsection. The information may be utilized for
- 3 any law enforcement purpose unless otherwise prohibited by law. The
- 4 department of state police shall provide to the secretary of state
- 5 updated lists of persons required under section 5a of the sex
- 6 offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a, to maintain a
- 7 valid operator's or chauffeur's license or an official state
- 8 personal identification card and the secretary of state shall make
- 9 images of those persons available to the department of state police
- 10 as provided in the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL
- **11** 28.721 to 28.732.
- 12 (8) If a person presents evidence of statutory blindness as
- 13 provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued or
- 14 is the holder of an official state personal identification card,
- 15 the secretary of state shall mark the person's identification card
- in a manner that clearly indicates that the cardholder is legally
- 17 blind.
- 18 (9) Until July 1, 2003, if the secretary of state issues an
- 19 official state personal identification card to a person who at the
- 20 time of application is 20-1/2 years of age or less, the secretary
- 21 of state shall mark the person's identification card in a manner
- 22 that clearly indicates that the cardholder is less than 21 years of
- 23 age.
- 24 (10) An official state personal identification card may
- 25 contain an identifier for voter registration purposes. An official
- 26 state personal identification card may contain information
- 27 appearing in electronic or machine readable codes needed to conduct

- 1 a transaction with the secretary of state. The information shall be
- 2 limited to the person's identification card number, birth date,
- 3 expiration date, and other information necessary for use with
- 4 electronic devices, machine readers, or automatic teller machines
- 5 and shall not contain the person's name, address, driving record,
- 6 or other personal identifier. The identification card shall
- 7 identify the encoded information.
- 8 (11) An official state personal identification card shall be
- 9 issued only upon authorization of the secretary of state, and shall
- 10 be manufactured in a manner to prohibit as nearly as possible the
- 11 ability to reproduce, alter, counterfeit, forge, or duplicate the
- 12 identification card without ready detection.
- 13 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this act, an applicant
- 14 shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the secretary of state for each
- 15 original or renewal identification card issued.
- 16 The department of treasury shall deposit the fees received and
- 17 collected under this section in the state treasury to the credit of
- 18 the general fund. The legislature shall appropriate the fees
- 19 credited to the general fund under this act to the secretary of
- 20 state for the administration of this act. Appropriations from the
- 21 Michigan transportation fund shall not be used to compensate the
- 22 secretary of state for costs incurred and services performed under
- 23 this section.
- 24 (13) An original or renewal official state personal
- 25 identification card -shall expire EXPIRES on the birthday of the
- 26 person to whom it is issued in the fourth year following the date
- 27 of issuance. HOWEVER, AN ORIGINAL OR RENEWAL OFFICIAL STATE

- 1 PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED TO A PERSON WHO IS AN ALIEN
- 2 EXPIRES ON THE DATE HIS OR HER PRESENCE IN THE UNITED STATES
- 3 BECOMES UNLAWFUL. The secretary of state shall not issue an
- 4 official state personal identification card under this act for a
- 5 period greater than 4 years. Except as provided in this subsection,
- 6 a person may apply for a renewal of an official state personal
- 7 identification card by mail or by other methods prescribed by the
- 8 secretary of state. The secretary of state shall require renewal in
- 9 person by a person required under section 5a of the sex offenders
- 10 registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a, to maintain a valid
- 11 operator's or chauffeur's license or official state personal
- 12 identification card.
- 13 (14) The secretary of state shall waive the fee under this
- 14 section if the applicant is a person 65 years of age or older, is a
- 15 person who has had his or her operator's or chauffeur's license
- 16 suspended, revoked, or denied under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949
- 17 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, because of a mental or physical
- 18 infirmity or disability, is a person who presents evidence of
- 19 statutory blindness as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to
- 20 393.368, or is a person who presents other good cause for a fee
- 21 waiver.
- 22 (15) A person who has been issued an official state personal
- 23 identification card shall apply for a renewal official state
- 24 personal identification card if the person changes his or her name.
- 25 (16) A person who has been issued an official state personal
- 26 identification card shall apply for a corrected identification card
- 27 if he or she changes his or her residential address. The secretary

- 1 of state may correct the address on an identification card by a
- 2 method prescribed by the secretary of state. A fee shall not be
- 3 charged for a change of residential address.
- 4 (17) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (15) and
- 5 (16), a person who has been issued an official state personal
- 6 identification card may apply for a renewal official state personal
- 7 identification card for 1 or more of the following reasons:
- 8 (a) The person wants to change any information on the
- 9 identification card.
- 10 (b) An identification card issued under this act is lost,
- 11 destroyed, or mutilated, or becomes illegible.
- 12 (18) A person may indicate on an official state personal
- 13 identification card in a place designated by the secretary of state
- 14 his or her blood type, emergency contact information, immunization
- 15 data, medication data, a statement that the person is deaf, or a
- 16 statement that the person has made an anatomical gift pursuant to
- 17 UNDER part 101 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- **18** 333.10101 to 333.10109.
- 19 (19) If an applicant provides proof to the secretary of state
- 20 that he or she is a minor who has been emancipated -pursuant to
- 21 UNDER 1968 PA 293, MCL 722.1 to 722.6, the official state personal
- 22 identification card shall bear the designation of the individual's
- 23 emancipated status in a manner prescribed by the secretary of
- 24 state.
- 25 (20) A valid official state personal identification card
- 26 presented by the person to whom the card is issued shall be
- 27 considered the same as a valid state of Michigan driver license

- 1 when identification is requested except as otherwise specifically
- 2 provided by law.
