SENATE BILL No. 1052

February 21, 2006, Introduced by Senators ALLEN, BIRKHOLZ, JELINEK, CROPSEY, McMANUS and BROWN and referred to the Committee on Gaming and Casino Oversight.

A bill to amend 1995 PA 279, entitled "Horse racing law of 1995," by amending sections 2 and 4 (MCL 431.302 and 431.304).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 2 (A) "AFFILIATE" MEANS A PERSON WHO, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY,
- 3 CONTROLS, IS CONTROLLED BY, OR IS UNDER COMMON CONTROL WITH; IS IN
- 4 A PARTNERSHIP OR JOINT VENTURE RELATIONSHIP WITH; OR IS A
- 5 COSHAREHOLDER OF A CORPORATION, COMEMBER OF A LIMITED LIABILITY
- 6 COMPANY, OR COPARTNER IN A LIMITED LIABILITY PARTNERSHIP WITH THE
- 7 PERSON WHO HOLDS OR APPLIES FOR A RACE MEETING OR TRACK LICENSE
- B UNDER THIS ACT. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBDIVISION, A CONTROLLING

- 1 INTEREST IS THE BENEFICIAL OWNERSHIP OF MORE THAN 5% OF A
- 2 CORPORATION WHOSE STOCK IS WIDELY HELD, PUBLICLY TRADED, AND
- 3 REGULATED BY THE SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION, OR ANY
- 4 BENEFICIAL OWNERSHIP OF A PRIVATELY HELD CORPORATION OR OF A FIRM,
- 5 PARTNERSHIP, ASSOCIATION, OR OTHER LEGAL ENTITY.
- 6 (B) —(a)— "Breaks" means the cents over any multiple of 10
- 7 otherwise payable to a patron on a wager of \$1.00.
- 8 (C) (b) "Certified horsemen's organization" means an
- 9 organization registered with the office of racing commissioner in a
- 10 manner and form required by the racing commissioner, that can
- 11 demonstrate all of the following:
- (i) The organization's capacity to supply horses.
- 13 (ii) The organization's ability to assist a race meeting
- 14 licensee in conducting the licensee's racing program.
- 15 (iii) The organization's ability to monitor and improve physical
- 16 conditions and controls for individuals and horses participating at
- 17 licensed race meetings.
- 18 (iv) The organization's ability to protect the financial
- 19 interests of the individuals participating at licensed race
- 20 meetings.
- 21 (D) —(c)— "City area" means a city —having— WITH a population
- of 750,000 or more —, and —includes the counties EVERY COUNTY
- 23 LOCATED wholly or partly within -a distance of 30 miles of the
- 24 city limits of the city.
- 25 (E) -(d) "Controlled substance" means that term as defined in
- 26 section 7104 of the public health code, Act No. 368 of the Public
- 27 Acts of 1978, being section 333.7104 of the Michigan Compiled Laws

- 2 (F) —(e) "Day of operation" means a period of 24 hours
- 3 beginning at 12 noon and ending at 11:59 a.m. the following day.
- 4 (G) -(f) "Drug" means any of the following:
- 5 (i) A substance intended for use in the diagnosis, cure,
- 6 mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease in humans or other
- 7 animals.
- 8 (ii) A substance, other than food, intended to affect the
- 9 structure, condition, or any function of the body of humans or
- 10 other animals.
- 11 (iii) A substance intended for use as a component of a substance
- 12 specified in subparagraph (i) or (ii).
- 13 (H) -(g) "Fair" means any county, district, or community fair
- 14 and any state fair.
- 15 (I) —(h) "Foreign substance" means a substance, or its
- 16 metabolites, -which THAT does not exist naturally in an untreated
- 17 horse or, if natural to an untreated horse, exists at an
- 18 unnaturally high physiological concentration as a result of having
- 19 been administered to the horse.
- 20 (J) —(i)— "Full card simulcast" means an entire simulcast
- 21 racing program of 1 or more race -meet- MEETING licensees located
- 22 in this state, or an entire simulcast racing program of 1 or more
- 23 races simulcasted from 1 or more racetracks located outside of this
- 24 state.
- 25 (K) "MEMBER OF THE IMMEDIATE FAMILY" MEANS THE SPOUSE, CHILD,
- 26 PARENT, OR SIBLING.
- 27 (1) (j) "Person" means an individual, firm, partnership,

- 1 corporation, association, or other legal entity.
- 2 (M) $\frac{(k)}{(k)}$ "Purse pool" means an amount of money allocated or
- 3 apportioned to pay prizes for horse races and from which payments
- 4 may be made to certified horsemen's organizations pursuant to this
- 5 act.
- 6 (N) $\frac{-(l)}{-(l)}$ "Veterinarian" means a person licensed to practice
- 7 veterinary medicine under article 15 PART 188 of the public
- 8 health code, Act No. 368 of the Public Acts of 1978, being
- 9 sections 333.16101 to 333.18838 of the Michigan Compiled Laws 1978
- 10 PA 368, MCL 333.18801 TO 333.18838, or under a state or federal law
- 11 applicable to that person.
- Sec. 4. (1) The racing commissioner shall be appointed for a
- 13 term of 4 years by the governor by and with the advice and consent
- 14 of the senate.
- 15 (2) The racing commissioner shall be a resident of this state
- 16 and during his or her term of office shall not be a stockholder of,
- 17 or be directly or indirectly connected with the conduct or
- 18 management of, or have any other legal or beneficial interest in,
- 19 any of the following:
- 20 (a) A racetrack, race meeting, or a racing interest,
- 21 including, but not limited to, the ownership, breeding, training,
- 22 or racing of horses or any vendor, supplier, or distributor of
- 23 goods or services to a racetrack, race meeting, or racing
- 24 participant licensed under this act.
- 25 (b) Any gaming activity conducted at any licensed race meeting
- 26 in the THIS state.
- 27 (3) THE RACING COMMISSIONER OR A MEMBER OF THE IMMEDIATE

- 1 FAMILY OF THE RACING COMMISSIONER SHALL NOT PARTICIPATE IN WAGERING
- 2 PERMITTED UNDER THIS ACT OR CONDUCTED BY A PERSON OR AN AFFILIATE
- 3 OF A PERSON LICENSED OR APPLYING FOR A LICENSE UNDER THIS ACT. THIS
- 4 SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO WAGERING THAT IS PART OF SURVEILLANCE,
- 5 SECURITY, OR OTHER OFFICIAL DUTIES FOR THE OFFICE OF THE RACING
- 6 COMMISSIONER.
