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SENATE BILL No. 1121

March 7, 2006, Introduced by Senators STAMAS, GOSCHKA, HARDIMAN, HAMMERSTROM and BIRKHOLZ and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1974 PA 258, entitled "Mental health code,"

by amending section 409 (MCL 330.1409), as amended by 2004 PA 555.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 409. (1) Each community mental health services program

shall establish 1 or more preadmission screening units with 24-hour availability to provide assessment and screening services for individuals being considered for admission into hospitals or alternative treatment programs. The community mental health services program shall employ mental health professionals OR INDIVIDUALS WHO POSSESS A BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN SOCIAL WORK to provide the preadmission screening services or contract with another agency —, which shall meet THAT MEETS the requirements of this section. Preadmission screening unit staff shall be supervised

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- 1 by a registered professional nurse or other mental health
- 2 professional possessing at least a master's degree.
- 3 (2) Each community mental health services program shall
- 4 provide the address and telephone number of its preadmission
- 5 screening unit or units to law enforcement agencies, the
- 6 department, the court, and hospital emergency rooms.
- 7 (3) A preadmission screening unit shall assess an individual
- 8 being considered for admission into a hospital operated by the
- 9 department or under contract with the community mental health
- 10 services program. If the individual is clinically suitable for
- 11 hospitalization, the preadmission screening unit shall authorize
- 12 voluntary admission to the hospital.
- 13 (4) If the preadmission screening unit of the community mental
- 14 health services program denies hospitalization, the individual or
- 15 the person making the application may request a second opinion from
- 16 the executive director. The executive director shall arrange for an
- 17 additional evaluation by a psychiatrist, other physician, or
- 18 licensed psychologist to be performed within 3 days, excluding
- 19 Sundays and legal holidays, after the executive director receives
- 20 the request. If the conclusion of the second opinion is different
- 21 from the conclusion of the preadmission screening unit, the
- 22 executive director, in conjunction with the medical director, shall
- 23 make a decision based on all clinical information available. The
- 24 executive director's decision shall be confirmed in writing to the
- 25 individual who requested the second opinion, and the confirming
- 26 document shall include the signatures of the executive director and
- 27 medical director or verification that the decision was made in

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- 1 conjunction with the medical director. If an individual is assessed
- 2 and found not to be clinically suitable for hospitalization, the
- 3 preadmission screening unit shall provide appropriate referral
- 4 services.
- 5 (5) If an individual is assessed and found not to be
- 6 clinically suitable for hospitalization, the preadmission screening
- 7 unit shall provide information regarding alternative services and
- 8 the availability of those services, and make appropriate referrals.
- 9 (6) A preadmission screening unit shall assess and examine, or
- 10 refer to a hospital for examination, an individual who is brought
- 11 to the unit by a peace officer or ordered by a court to be
- 12 examined. If the individual meets the requirements for
- 13 hospitalization, the preadmission screening unit shall designate
- 14 the hospital to which the individual shall be admitted. The
- 15 preadmission screening unit shall consult with the individual and,
- 16 if the individual agrees, it shall consult with the individual's
- 17 family member of choice, if available, as to the preferred hospital
- 18 for admission of the individual.
- 19 (7) If the individual chooses a hospital not under contract
- 20 with a community mental health services program, and the hospital
- 21 agrees to the admission, the preadmission screening unit shall
- 22 refer the individual to the hospital that is requested by the
- 23 individual. Any financial obligation for the services provided by
- 24 the hospital shall be satisfied from funding sources other than the
- 25 community mental health services program, the department, or other
- 26 state or county funding.
