- (a) "Dog handler" means a peace officer who has successfully
 completed training in the handling of a police dog pursuant to a
 policy of the law enforcement agency that employs that peace
 officer.
 - (b) "Physical harm" means any injury to a dog's or horse's physical condition.
 - (c) "Police dog" means -a EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:
 - (i) A dog used by a law enforcement agency of this state or of a local unit of government of this state that is trained for law

- 3 (d) "Police horse" means a horse used by a law enforcement
