"An act to provide for the regulation and control of public and certain private utilities and other services affected with a public interest within this state; to provide for alternative energy suppliers; to provide for licensing; to include municipally owned utilities and other providers of energy under certain provisions of this act; to create a public service commission and to prescribe and define its powers and duties; to abolish the Michigan public utilities commission and to confer the powers and duties vested by law on the public service commission; to provide for the continuance, transfer, and completion of certain matters and proceedings; to abolish automatic adjustment clauses; to prohibit certain rate increases without notice and hearing; to qualify residential energy conservation programs permitted under state law for certain federal exemption; to create a fund; to provide for a restructuring of the manner in which energy is provided in this state; to encourage the utilization of resource recovery facilities; to prohibit certain acts and practices of providers of energy; to allow for the securitization of stranded costs; to reduce rates; to provide for appeals; to provide appropriations; to declare the effect and purpose of this act; to prescribe remedies and penalties; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

(MCL 460.1 to 460.10cc) by adding section 9d.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 9D. (1) IF A CUSTOMER HAS FAILED TO FULFILL AN OBLIGATION
- 2 TO A NATURAL GAS OR ELECTRIC UTILITY, THE UTILITY MAY SHUT OFF
- 3 SERVICE TO THE CUSTOMER ON, OR AT A REASONABLE TIME FOLLOWING, THE
- 4 DATE SPECIFIED IN A NOTICE DELIVERED TO THE CUSTOMER BY PERSONAL
- 5 SERVICE OR FIRST-CLASS MAIL.
- 6 (2) IF THE NATURAL GAS OR ELECTRIC UTILITY DOES NOT SHUT OFF
- 7 SERVICE AS ALLOWED UNDER SUBSECTION (1), THE UTILITY SHALL NOT SHUT
- 8 OFF SERVICE UNTIL IT HAS PROVIDED A SUBSEQUENT NOTICE TO THE
- 9 CUSTOMER PROVIDING A NEW DATE FOR SHUTOFF.
- 10 (3) THE NOTICE REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (1) OR (2) SHALL BE
- 11 DELIVERED TO THE CUSTOMER NOT LESS THAN 30 DAYS BEFORE THE
- 12 SPECIFIED DATE FOR SHUTOFF.
- 13 (4) SHUTOFF OF SERVICE UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL OCCUR ONLY
- 14 BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 8 A.M. AND 4 P.M. AND SHALL NOT OCCUR ON A
- 15 DAY, OR A DAY IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING A DAY, WHEN THE NATURAL GAS OR
- 16 ELECTRIC UTILITY IS UNABLE TO RESTORE SERVICE TO THE CUSTOMER.
- 17 (5) IF THE OBLIGATION OF THE CUSTOMER IS IN DISPUTE, THE
- 18 NATURAL GAS OR ELECTRIC UTILITY SHALL NOT SHUT OFF SERVICE UNTIL
- 19 THE DISPUTE IS RESOLVED.
- 20 (6) IN NO EVENT SHALL THE UTILITY SHUT OFF SERVICE BETWEEN THE
- 21 TIME PERIOD OF DECEMBER 1 TO MARCH 31.
