Overview

The FY 2007-08 Higher Education budget act contains four articles:

- Article 1 contains a total summary unit for the bill.
- Article 2 covers Research Universities (Michigan State, University of Michigan-Ann Arbor, Wayne State).
- Article 3 covers State Universities (remaining 12 public universities).
- Article 4 covers State and Regional Programs, Grants, and Financial Aid.

The FY 2008-09 <u>Executive Recommendation</u> continues this budget bill format. The <u>Senate-passed</u> version of the bill returns to the format used in budget years previous to FY 2007-08 (no articles; all 15 universities in single line item section). The <u>House-passed</u> version utilizes the FY 2007-08 format (four articles). The <u>Conference Report</u> concurs with the House.

Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2007-08

Sec. 203. Research University Definition - RETAINED

Defines "research university" based on Carnegie Classifications. <u>Executive</u> retains; <u>Senate</u> deletes; <u>House</u> retains. Conference concurs with House.

Sec. 210. Foreign Auto Manufacturers – RETAINED

States intent that funds appropriated to universities not be used to purchase/lease vehicles assembled outside U.S. Executive and Senate delete; House retains. Conference concurs with House.

Sec. 212. University Payments - RETAINED

Provides for university payment schedule. <u>Executive</u> revises to (1) allow, rather than require, withholding of payments if HEIDI data are not submitted and (2) delete requirement for fiscal agency report on appropriations procedures. <u>Senate</u>, House, and Conference retain current requirements.

Sec. 214. Tuition Tax Credit – RETAINED

Requires universities to submit Tuition Tax Credit documentation to fiscal agencies. <u>Executive</u> deletes; <u>Senate</u>, <u>House</u>, and <u>conference</u> retain.

Sec. 216/316. Postsecondary Student Data System - NEW

States intent for state universities and all postsecondary institutions whose students are eligible for state financial aid programs to collaborate with development of a comprehensive preschool-through-postsecondary student data system. House adds new section. Conference includes new section for state universities only; changes statement of intent to reporting requirement on steps being taken toward and challenges associated with development of student-level data.

Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2007-08

Sec. 217. Conflicts of Interest - NEW

States intent for each state university governing board to examine the university's operations for potential conflicts of interest. House adds new section. Conference concurs with House.

Sec. 301. State Competitive Scholarships - REVISED

Provides for distribution of Competitive Scholarship appropriation. <u>House</u> adds new subsection stating intent for increase in maximum award from \$1,300 to \$1,400. <u>Conference</u> includes statement of intent to secure a 1.0% increase for the program.

Sec. 302. Tuition Grants - REVISED

Provides for distribution of Tuition Grant appropriation. <u>Executive</u> revises to (1) move grant application deadline from July 1 to June 1, (2) delete specified maximum grant award of \$2,100, and (3) delete provisions for carry-forward of unexpended funds. <u>Senate</u> retains current provisions and adds statement of intent to secure a 3.0% increase for the program. <u>House</u> retains July 1 deadline, concurs with Executive deletion of language regarding the maximum award amount and carry-forward of unexpended funds, and does not include intent language for 3.0% increase. <u>Conference</u> concurs with Senate; lowers intended increase from 3.0% to 1.0%.

Sec. 315. Financial Aid Report - NEW

Requires annual report from Department of Treasury on state financial aid programs. <u>House</u> adds new section. <u>Conference</u> concurs with House.

Sec. 402. Douglas Lake - RETAINED

Designates University of Michigan Douglas Lake Biological Station as a unique resource. <u>Executive</u> deletes; <u>Senate</u>, <u>House</u>, and Conference retain.

Sec. 426. Private Bookstores - RETAINED

States intent regarding private bookstore access to required textbook lists and use of funds in university-administered accounts by students at private bookstores. Executive deletes; Senate, House, and Conference retain.

Sec. 433. Project GREEEN - REVISED

Earmarks funds from Ag. Experiment and Extension line items for Project GREEN (Generating Research and Extension to meet Environmental and Economic Needs). <u>Executive</u> and <u>Senate</u> increase earmarks to reflect 3.0% line items increases; House reflects 2.7% increases. Conference reflects 1.0% increases.

Sec. 434. Future Farmers of America – REVISED

States intent that Michigan State University allocate \$80,000 to the Future Farmers of America Association. <u>Executive</u> deletes; Senate, House, and Conference retain and change from statement of intent to requirement.

Sec. 436. Tuition Restraint - RETAINED

States intent regarding university tuition/fee rates. <u>Executive</u> revises to state expectation that universities will restrain FY 2008-09 resident undergraduate tuition/fee increases to inflationary level of 2.3%. <u>Senate</u>, <u>House</u>, and <u>Conference</u> do not include new statement.

Sec. 450. Per-Student Funding Floor - RETAINED

States intent to allocate funds for \$3,775 per-FYES floor from GF/GP unreserved balances at close of fiscal year. <u>Executive</u> deletes; <u>Senate</u> retains; <u>House</u> deletes. <u>Conference</u> concurs with Senate.

Sec. 451. Indian Tuition Waiver Costs - NEW

States intent to allocate funds for unfunded Indian Tuition Waiver costs from GF/GP unreserved balances at close of fiscal year. <u>Conference</u> adds new section.

Sec. 462. Suicide Prevention - RETAINED

States intent that universities develop education program on preventing suicide and violence. <u>Executive</u> and <u>Senate</u> delete; <u>House</u> retains. <u>Conference</u> concurs with House.

Sec. 463. Students From Macomb County - RETAINED

Requires universities to report regarding outreach efforts to students from Macomb County. <u>Executive</u> and <u>Senate</u> delete; House retains. Conference concurs with House.

Sec. 464. Research Commercialization - REVISED

Requires universities to submit plan regarding research that could be commercialized. <u>Executive</u> deletes. <u>Senate</u> retains and adds prohibition on universities not submitting report from receiving allocation from Technology Commercialization Incentive Fund when fund is established. House retains without additional language. Conference concurs with Senate.

Sec. 467. Performance Standards – RETAINED

States intent to establish university performance standards. <u>Executive</u> and <u>Senate</u> delete; <u>House</u> retains. <u>Conference</u> concurs with House.

Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2007-08

Sec. 468. Incentive-Based Formula - NOT INCLUDED

States that university funding is allocated based on three-part, incentive-based formula. <u>Executive</u> adds new section; <u>Senate</u>, <u>House</u>, and <u>Conference</u> do not include.

Sec. 469. Graduates Receiving Pell Grants - NEW

Requires universities to report the number of graduates who received Pell Grants during their enrollment. <u>Executive</u> adds new section; Senate does not include; House includes new section. Conference concurs with House.

Sec. 470. Presidential Salaries - NOT INCLUDED

States intent that university presidential salary increases be limited to level of inflation. <u>Senate</u> adds new section. <u>House</u> does not include. Conference does not include.

Sec. 471. Timely Graduation - NEW

States intent that universities limit changes to general graduation requirements during a student's enrollment and provide counseling to facilitate timely graduation. <u>Senate</u> adds new section. <u>House</u> does not include. <u>Conference</u> concurs with Senate.

Sec. 472. Payment Delay/Tuition Rates - NEW

States intent that any university that increased its tuition rate based on assumption it would not receive delayed August 2007 payment rebate the tuition increase to its students; provides for FY 2008-09 appropriation for any noncompliant university to be reduced by percentage of applicable tuition increase. <u>Senate</u> adds new section. <u>House</u> does not include. <u>Conference</u> includes new section, but removes reference to appropriation reductions.

Sec. 701. Enrollment Reporting - REVISED

Provides for exclusion of certain categories of credit hours from enrollment data reported to state. <u>House</u> adds language clarifying the types of distance learning credit hours that can be reported. Conference concurs with House.

Sec. 701a. New Degree Programs - REVISED

Lists new degree programs for which state universities may report enrollment data to state. <u>House</u> includes new list of programs approved by Presidents Council's Academic Affairs Officers Committee. <u>Conference</u> concurs with House.

Sec. 715. Nursing Education - NEW

Requires report from Department of Labor and Economic Growth on the status of nursing education in Michigan. <u>Senate</u> adds new section; House does not include. Conference concurs with Senate.
