## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5021

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 708b (MCL 257.708b), as amended by 2004 PA 362.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 708b. (1) A person shall not equip or operate a motor
- 2 vehicle that is to be used upon the highways of this state with a
- 3 television viewer, screen, or other means of visually receiving a
- 4 television or video broadcast which OR OTHER SIMILAR ELECTRONIC
- 5 DEVICE THAT DISPLAYS A VIDEO IMAGE THAT can be viewed by or
- 6 reflected to the driver OPERATOR WHILE THE VEHICLE IS IN MOTION.
- 7 (2) This section does not apply to:
- 8 (a) A radio AN AUDIO ENTERTAINMENT SYSTEM, heating and OR air-
- 9 conditioning CONTROLS, or other accessory controls in the motor
- 10 vehicle.

- (b) Driver, passenger, and A vehicle information and OR 1
- navigation systems SYSTEM FOR USE IN displaying ONLY information 2

- (E) A POLICE VEHICLE, FIRE VEHICLE, OR AMBULANCE EQUIPPED WITH 16
- A MONITOR FOR USE WITH A COMPUTER-AIDED DISPATCH SYSTEM OR 17
- 18 EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT CONTROLS.
- (F) A POLICE VEHICLE EQUIPPED WITH A MONITOR FOR USE WITH 19
- 20 RECORDING EQUIPMENT.
- 21 (3) [A EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION, A] visual device permitted under subsection (2)(b) (2)(A)

  OR (B) shall be built into the dashboard or other control area of

- dash safety standards. [AN AFTERMARKET VISUAL DEVICE DESCRIBED IN 24

- ABOVE THE DASHBOARD, BUT SHALL NOT BE MOUNTED WITHIN THE DEPLOYMENT 26
- PROFILE OF THE VEHICLE AIRBAGS OR IN A MANNER THAT INTERFERES WITH THE 27 OPERATOR'S VIEW OR CONTROL.] This

- 4 (4) Upon receipt of a completed application, on a form
- 5 prescribed by the secretary of state, and payment of a fee of
- \$10.00, the secretary of state may issue a special permit
- 7 authorizing a research vehicle to use the highways of this state. A
- 8 copy of the authority received by the applicant under subsection
- (2)(c) shall be submitted as part of the application for the 9
- 10 special permit. The special permit may be in a form as prescribed
- 11 by, and shall be displayed on a research vehicle in a manner
- determined by, the secretary of state. The special permit shall 12
- 13 expire upon completion of or expiration of the specific test plan
- 14 approved under subsection (2)(c), whichever occurs first, and shall
- 15 be immediately removed from the research vehicle and destroyed. A
- special permit shall not be transferred to another vehicle or 16
