## SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4491

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code,"

by amending sections 224b and 231a (MCL 750.224b and 750.231a), section 231a as amended by 2002 PA 82; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 224b. (1) A person shall not manufacture, sell, offer for
- 2 sale, or possess a short-barreled shotgun or a short-barreled
- 3 rifle.
- 4 (2) A person who violates this section is guilty of a felony
- 5 punishable by imprisonment for not more than 5 years —or a fine of
- 6 not more than \$2,500.00, or both.
- 7 (3) The provisions of this THIS section shall DOES not apply
- 8 to the sale, offering for sale, or possession of a short-barreled
- 9 rifle or a short-barreled shotgun which the secretary of the

- 1 treasury of the United States of America, or his OR HER delegate,
- 2 pursuant to U.S.C. title 26, section UNDER 26 USC, SECTIONS 5801
- 3 through 5872, or <del>U.S.C. title 18, </del>18 USC, sections 921 through 928,
- 4 has found to be a curio, relic, antique, museum piece, or
- 5 collector's item not likely to be used as a weapon, but only if the
- 6 person selling, offering for sale or possessing the firearm has
- 7 also fully complied with the provisions of sections 2 and 9 of Act
- 8 No. 372 of the Public Acts of 1927, as amended, being sections
- 9 28.422 and 28.429 of the Michigan Compiled Laws SECTION 2 OR 2A OF
- 10 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.422 AND 28.422A.
- 11 The provisions of section SECTION 20 of chapter 16 of Act No.
- 12 175 of the Public Acts of 1927, as added by Act No. 299 of the
- 13 Public Acts of 1968, being section 776.20 of the Michigan Compiled
- 14 Laws, are applicable THE CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE, 1927 PA 175,
- 15 MCL 776.20, APPLIES to this subsection.
- Sec. 231a. (1) Subsection (2) of section 227 does not apply to
- 17 any of the following:
- 18 (a) To a person holding a valid license to carry a pistol
- 19 concealed upon his or her person issued by his or her state of
- 20 residence except where the pistol is carried in nonconformance with
- 21 a restriction appearing on the license.
- 22 (b) To the regular and ordinary transportation of pistols as
- 23 merchandise by an authorized agent of a person licensed to
- 24 manufacture firearms.
- 25 (c) To a person carrying an antique firearm as defined in
- 26 subsection (2), completely unloaded in a closed case or container
- 27 designed for the storage of firearms in the trunk of a vehicle.

- 1 (d) To a person while transporting a pistol for a lawful
- 2 purpose that is licensed by the owner or occupant of the motor
- 3 vehicle in compliance with section 2 of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.422,
- 4 and the pistol is unloaded in a closed case designed for the
- 5 storage of firearms in the trunk of the vehicle.
- 6 (e) To a person while transporting a pistol for a lawful
- 7 purpose that is licensed by the owner or occupant of the motor
- 8 vehicle in compliance with section 2 of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.422,
- 9 and the pistol is unloaded in a closed case designed for the
- 10 storage of firearms in a vehicle that does not have a trunk and is
- 11 not readily accessible to the occupants of the vehicle.
- 12 (2) As used in this section:
- 13 (a) "Antique firearm" means either of the following:
- 14 (i) A firearm not designed or redesigned for using rimfire or
- 15 conventional center fire ignition with fixed ammunition and
- 16 manufactured in or before 1898, including a matchlock, flintlock,
- 17 percussion cap, or similar type of ignition system or replica of
- 18 such a firearm, whether actually manufactured before or after 1898.
- 19 (ii) A firearm using fixed ammunition manufactured in or before
- 20 1898, for which ammunition is no longer manufactured in the United
- 21 States and is not readily available in the ordinary channels of
- 22 commercial trade.
- 23 (b) "Lawful purpose" includes the following:
- 24 (i) While en route to or from a hunting or target shooting
- **25** area.
- 26 (ii) While transporting a pistol en route to or from his or her
- 27 home or place of business and place of repair.

- 1 (iii) While moving goods from 1 place of abode or business to
- 2 another place of abode or business.
- 3 (iv) While transporting a licensed pistol en route to or from a
- 4 law enforcement agency for the purpose of having a safety
- 5 inspection performed on the pistol as is required by section 9 of
- 6 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.429, or for the purpose of having a law
- 7 enforcement official take possession of the weapon.
- 8 (v) While en route to or from his or her abode or place of
- 9 business and a gun show or places of purchase or sale.
- 10 (vi) While en route to or from his or her abode to a public
- 11 shooting facility or public land where discharge of firearms is
- 12 permitted by law, rule, regulation, or local ordinance.
- 13 (vii) While en route to or from his or her abode to a private
- 14 property location where the pistol is to be used as is permitted by
- 15 law, rule, regulation, or local ordinance.
- 16 Enacting section 1. Section 228 of the Michigan penal code,
- 17 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.228, is repealed.
- 18 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act takes effect 180 days
- 19 after the date it is enacted into law.
- 20 Enacting section 3. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 21 unless all of the following bills of the 94th Legislature are
- 22 enacted into law:
