SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 5694

A bill to amend 1917 PA 350, entitled

"An act to regulate and license second hand dealers and junk dealers; and to prescribe penalties for the violation of the provisions of this act,"

by amending sections 4, 5, and 8 (MCL 445.404, 445.405, and 445.408), as amended by 2006 PA 675.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4. (1) A second hand dealer or junk dealer shall post in
- 2 a conspicuous place in or upon its place of business a sign having
- 3 its name and occupation.
- 4 (2) A second hand or junk dealer shall keep MAKE AND MAINTAIN
- 5 a separate book or other WRITTEN OR ELECTRONIC record, NUMBERED

- 1 CONSECUTIVELY, AND open to inspection by a member of a local law
- 2 enforcement agency AND THE MICHIGAN STATE POLICE, in which shall be
- 3 written or entered in the English language at the time of the
- 4 purchase or exchange of any article a description of the article,
- 5 the AND ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 6 (A) THE name, description, fingerprint, operator's or
- 7 chauffeur's license or state identification number, registration
- 8 plate number, and address of the person from whom the article was
- 9 purchased and received. , and the THE SECOND HAND DEALER OR JUNK
- 10 DEALER SHALL MAKE A COPY OF THE OPERATOR'S LICENSE, CHAUFFEUR'S
- 11 LICENSE, OR STATE IDENTIFICATION CARD AS PART OF THE BOOK OR
- 12 RECORD.
- 13 (B) THE day and hour when the purchase or exchange was made.
- 14 as well as the
- 15 (C) THE location from which the item was obtained. 7 if
- 16 applicable. Each entry shall be numbered consecutively.
- 17 (D) PAYMENT FOR AN ITEM SHALL BE MADE ONLY BY CHECK OR BY AN
- 18 ELECTRONIC PAYMENT SYSTEM. THE RECORD SHALL INDICATE THE METHOD OF
- 19 PAYMENT.
- Sec. 5. (1) The articles purchased or exchanged shall be
- 21 retained by the purchaser for at least 15 days before disposing of
- 22 them, in an accessible place in the building where the articles are
- 23 purchased and received. A tag shall be attached to the articles in
- 24 some visible and convenient place, with the number written
- 25 thereupon, to correspond with the entry number in the book or other
- 26 record.
- 27 (2) The purchaser shall prepare and deliver on Monday of each

- 1 week to the chief of police or chief law enforcement officer of the
- 2 local unit of government in which such THAT business is carried on,
- 3 before 12 o'clock noon, a legible and correct PAPER OR ELECTRONIC
- 4 copy, written in the English language, from the book or other
- 5 WRITTEN OR ELECTRONIC record, containing a description of each
- 6 article purchased or received during the preceding week, the hour
- 7 and day when the purchase was made, and the description of the
- 8 person from whom it was purchased, AND A COPY OF THE DOCUMENTATION
- 9 REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 4 REGARDING THE PERSON FROM WHOM IT WAS
- 10 PURCHASED. The statement shall be verified by the person
- 11 subscribing his or her name thereto IN A MANNER ACCEPTABLE TO THE
- 12 CHIEF OF POLICE OR CHIEF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.
- 13 (3) This section does not apply to old rags, waste paper, and
- 14 household goods except radios, televisions, record players, and
- 15 electrical appliances and does not require the purchaser to retain
- 16 articles purchased from individuals, firms, or corporations having
- 17 a fixed place of business after those articles shall have been
- 18 reported.
- 19 Sec. 8. (1) Except as otherwise provided for in this section,
- 20 a person who violates this act is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall
- 21 be imprisoned for not more than 6 months and shall be fined not
- 22 less than \$500.00 or more than \$1,000.00.
- 23 (2) A second hand or junk dealer who buys or sells scrap
- 24 metal, knowing that it is stolen, is guilty of a felony punishable
- 25 by imprisonment for not more than 3—5 years or a fine of not more
- than \$2,000.00 \$5,000.00, or both. THE PENALTIES IMPOSED UNDER THIS
- 27 SUBSECTION APPLY ONLY TO A FIRST VIOLATION OF THIS SUBSECTION.

- 1 (3) A second hand or junk dealer who buys or sells stolen
- 2 scrap metal that he or she has reason to believe was unlawfully
- 3 removed from a utility pole, telecommunication company property,
- 4 government property, or utility property or jobsite KNOWING THAT IT
- 5 WAS STOLEN is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not
- 6 more than 5 years or a fine of not more than \$10,000.00, or both.
- 7 THE PENALTIES IMPOSED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION APPLY TO A SECOND OR
- 8 SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION.
- 9 (4) The license of a person, corporation, copartnership, or
- 10 firm that is found guilty of violating any of the provisions of
- 11 this act shall be considered to be revoked upon entry of a
- 12 conviction and such person, corporation, copartnership, or firm
- 13 shall not be permitted to carry on the business of being a second
- 14 hand or junk dealer within this state for a period of 1 year after
- 15 that conviction.
- 16 (5) The remedies under this act are independent and
- 17 cumulative. The use of 1 remedy by a person does not bar the use of
- 18 other lawful remedies by that person or the use of a lawful remedy
- 19 by another person.
- 20 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect April 1,
- 21 2009.
- 22 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 23 unless all of the following bills of the 94th Legislature are
- 24 enacted into law:
