

SUBSTITUTE FOR  
SENATE BILL NO. 1490

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled  
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"  
by amending section 82118 (MCL 324.82118), as amended by 2004 PA  
587, and by adding section 82110a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1           SEC. 82110A. (1) THE PERMANENT SNOWMOBILE TRAIL EASEMENT  
2           SUBACCOUNT IS CREATED AS A SUBACCOUNT OF THE SNOWMOBILE ACCOUNT.  
3           (2) THE STATE TREASURER MAY RECEIVE MONEY OR OTHER ASSETS FROM  
4           ANY SOURCE FOR DEPOSIT INTO THE PERMANENT SNOWMOBILE TRAIL EASEMENT  
5           SUBACCOUNT. THE STATE TREASURER SHALL DIRECT THE INVESTMENT OF THE  
6           SUBACCOUNT. THE STATE TREASURER SHALL CREDIT TO THE SUBACCOUNT  
7           INTEREST AND EARNINGS FROM SUBACCOUNT INVESTMENTS. MONEY IN THE  
8           SUBACCOUNT AT THE CLOSE OF THE FISCAL YEAR SHALL REMAIN IN THE  
9           SUBACCOUNT AND SHALL NOT LAPSE TO THE SNOWMOBILE ACCOUNT OR THE

1 GENERAL FUND. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE  
2 SUBACCOUNT FOR AUDITING PURPOSES.

3 (3) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL EXPEND MONEY FROM THE PERMANENT  
4 SNOWMOBILE TRAIL EASEMENT SUBACCOUNT, UPON APPROPRIATION, ONLY FOR  
5 GRANTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING LANDS, OR SECURING EASEMENTS  
6 OR OTHER APPROPRIATE AGREEMENTS ALLOWING USE OF PRIVATE PROPERTY,  
7 TO ESTABLISH PERMANENT SNOWMOBILE TRAILS THAT ARE OPEN TO THE  
8 PUBLIC IN THIS STATE. TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A GRANT, AN ENTITY SHALL  
9 HAVE BEEN ORGANIZED AT LEAST 3 YEARS BEFORE THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF  
10 THIS SECTION FOR EDUCATIONAL AND CHARITABLE PURPOSES WITHIN THE  
11 MEANING OF 26 USC 501(C) (3) THAT INCLUDES PROMOTING AND  
12 FACILITATING THE EXPANSION AND IMPROVEMENT OF THE EXISTING  
13 SNOWMOBILE TRAIL SYSTEM IN THIS STATE WITH PERMANENT SNOWMOBILE  
14 TRAILS.

15 (4) IF A GRANT RECIPIENT CEASES TO EXIST, ANY INTEREST  
16 ALLOWING THE USE OF PRIVATE PROPERTY TO ESTABLISH PERMANENT  
17 SNOWMOBILE TRAILS THAT WAS OBTAINED BY THAT GRANT RECIPIENT WITH  
18 GRANT MONEY UNDER SUBSECTION (3) SHALL TERMINATE.

19 (5) THE DEPARTMENT OF ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL REVIEW GRANTS AND  
20 OTHER INSTRUMENTS PROPOSED TO BE UTILIZED FOR THE PURPOSES OF  
21 SUBSECTIONS (3) AND (4).

22 (6) THE DEPARTMENT IN CONSULTATION WITH THE SNOWMOBILE  
23 ADVISORY COMMITTEE SHALL PROMULGATE RULES FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF  
24 THE PERMANENT SNOWMOBILE TRAIL EASEMENT SUBACCOUNT.

25 (7) ANY PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF LANDS PURCHASED UNDER  
26 SUBSECTION (3) OR THE TERMINATION OF EASEMENTS OR OTHER AGREEMENTS  
27 SECURED UNDER SUBSECTION (3) SHALL BE DEPOSITED INTO THE PERMANENT

1 SNOWMOBILE TRAIL EASEMENT SUBACCOUNT.

2 (8) IF, AT ANY TIME AFTER JULY 1, 2010, THE MICHIGAN  
3 SNOWMOBILE ADVISORY COMMITTEE, BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF AT LEAST  
4 5 MEMBERS, DETERMINES THAT THE PUBLIC SNOWMOBILE TRAIL SYSTEM IN  
5 THIS STATE IS FULLY DEVELOPED AND NOT CAPABLE OF EXPANSION BY  
6 ADDING FURTHER PERMANENT SNOWMOBILE TRAIL EASEMENTS, ALL OF THE  
7 FOLLOWING APPLY:

8 (A) ANY MONEY IN THE PERMANENT SNOWMOBILE TRAIL EASEMENT  
9 SUBACCOUNT IS TRANSFERRED TO THE RECREATIONAL SNOWMOBILE TRAIL  
10 IMPROVEMENT SUBACCOUNT CREATED IN SECTION 82110.

11 (B) THE PERMANENT SNOWMOBILE TRAIL EASEMENT SUBACCOUNT IS  
12 DISSOLVED.

13 (C) ALL FUTURE REVENUE THAT WOULD OTHERWISE BE DEPOSITED IN  
14 THE PERMANENT SNOWMOBILE TRAIL EASEMENT SUBACCOUNT SHALL BE  
15 DEPOSITED IN THE RECREATIONAL SNOWMOBILE TRAIL IMPROVEMENT  
16 SUBACCOUNT.

17 Sec. 82118. (1) In addition to registration of a snowmobile  
18 pursuant to section 82105 or registration in another state or  
19 province, except as otherwise provided in this section, a person  
20 who desires to operate a snowmobile in this state shall purchase a  
21 Michigan snowmobile trail permit sticker. The Michigan snowmobile  
22 trail permit issued under this section shall be valid for a period  
23 of 1 year which begins on October 1 and ends on the following  
24 September 30. The fee for the permit shall be ~~\$25.00.~~ **AS FOLLOWS:**

25 (A) FOR PERMITS VALID FOR THE 1-YEAR PERIOD BEGINNING OCTOBER  
26 1, 2009 OR OCTOBER 1, 2010, \$35.00

27 (B) FOR PERMITS VALID FOR THE 1-YEAR PERIOD BEGINNING OCTOBER

1 1, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, OR 2015, \$45.00.

2 (C) FOR PERMITS VALID FOR THE 1-YEAR PERIOD BEGINNING OCTOBER  
3 1, 2016 AND EVERY FIFTH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL  
4 ADJUST THE CURRENT PERMIT FEE BY AN AMOUNT DETERMINED BY THE STATE  
5 TREASURER TO REFLECT THE CUMULATIVE PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE  
6 CONSUMER PRICE INDEX DURING THE MOST RECENT 5-YEAR PERIOD FOR WHICH  
7 CONSUMER PRICE INDEX STATISTICS ARE AVAILABLE, ROUNDED TO THE  
8 NEAREST DOLLAR. A FEE ADJUSTED BY THE STATE TREASURER UNDER THIS  
9 SUBDIVISION SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT FOR 5 YEARS. AS USED IN THIS  
10 SUBDIVISION, "CONSUMER PRICE INDEX" MEANS THE MOST COMPREHENSIVE  
11 INDEX OF CONSUMER PRICES AVAILABLE FOR THIS STATE FROM THE BUREAU  
12 OF LABOR STATISTICS OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR.

13 (2) Revenue from the trail permit fee shall be allocated as  
14 follows:

15 ~~—— (a) \$23.50 to the recreational snowmobile trail improvement~~  
16 ~~subaccount.~~

17 (A) ~~(b)~~ 50 cents shall be retained by the department for  
18 administrative costs.

19 (B) ~~(c)~~ \$1.00 shall be retained by the agent selling the  
20 permit.

21 (C) THE BALANCE SHALL BE DEPOSITED IN THE RECREATIONAL  
22 SNOWMOBILE TRAIL IMPROVEMENT SUBACCOUNT.

23 (3) The department shall make the sale of trail permits  
24 available on its website. For each trail permit sold through the  
25 website, the amount otherwise credited to an agent under subsection  
26 (2) shall instead be credited to the recreational snowmobile trail  
27 improvement subaccount.

1 (4) The trail permit sticker shall be permanently affixed to  
2 ~~the forward half of the~~ snowmobile directly above or below the  
3 headlight of the snowmobile.

4 (5) The department may contract with a person to act as an  
5 agent for the purpose of issuing Michigan snowmobile trail permits.  
6 The department shall sell the permits to agents in bulk. ~~Agents~~**AN**  
7 **AGENT** may obtain a refund from the department for any permits that  
8 are not sold.

9 (6) An agent who uses or allows the use of a permit by anyone  
10 except the snowmobile user to whom the permit is sold is guilty of  
11 a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of \$50.00 for each instance of  
12 such use or allowed use.

13 (7) The department of state may suspend a certificate of  
14 registration ~~when~~**IF** the department of state determines that the  
15 required fee has not been paid and remains unpaid after reasonable  
16 notice or demand. In addition to the required fee, a \$10.00 penalty  
17 shall be assessed and collected against any person who tenders an  
18 insufficient check or draft in payment of the fee.

19 (8) A snowmobile used solely for transportation on the frozen  
20 surface of public waters for the purpose of ice fishing is exempt  
21 from the requirement of purchasing and displaying a snowmobile  
22 trail permit sticker under this section.

23 (9) A person shall not charge a fee for a snowmobile trail  
24 permit in an amount that is greater than the fee printed on the  
25 face of the permit.

26 (10) To obtain a snowmobile trail permit, an applicant ~~must~~  
27 **SHALL** provide all information required on the permit application.

1           (11) A person who fails to secure a permit under this section  
2 or who violates subsection (4) is responsible for a state civil  
3 infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than  
4 \$100.00.

5           (12) The department ~~of natural resources~~ shall, by June 1 of  
6 each year, report to the members of the appropriate standing  
7 ~~committee~~ **COMMITTEES** and appropriations subcommittees of the house  
8 and senate, a detailed expenditure plan pertaining to the  
9 additional funds generated by this act. The plan shall include  
10 information as to how funds were expended in the prior year.

11           Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect  
12 unless Senate Bill No. 1489 of the 94th Legislature is enacted into  
13 law.
