HOUSE BILL No. 4019

January 22, 2007, Introduced by Rep. Opsommer and referred to the Committee on Ethics and Elections.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled

"Michigan election law,"

by amending section 931 (MCL 168.931), as amended by 1996 PA 583.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 931. (1) A person who violates 1 or more of the following
- 2 subdivisions is guilty of a misdemeanor:
- 3 (a) A person shall not, either directly or indirectly, give,
- 4 lend, or promise valuable consideration, to or for any A person, as
- 5 an inducement to influence the manner of voting by a person
- 6 relative to a candidate or ballot question, or as a reward for
- refraining from voting.
- 8 (b) A person shall not, either before, on, or after an
 - election, for the person's own benefit or on behalf of any other

- 1 ANOTHER person, receive, agree TO RECEIVE, or contract for valuable
- 2 consideration for 1 or more of the following:
- 3 (i) Voting or agreeing to vote, or inducing or attempting to
- 4 induce another to vote, at an election.
- 5 (ii) Refraining or agreeing to refrain, or inducing or
- 6 attempting to induce another to refrain, from voting at an
- 7 election.
- 8 (iii) Doing anything prohibited by this act.
- 9 (iv) Both distributing absent voter ballot applications to
- 10 voters and receiving signed applications from voters for delivery
- 11 to the appropriate clerk or assistant of the clerk. This
- 12 subparagraph does not apply to an authorized election official.
- 13 (c) A person shall not solicit any valuable consideration from
- 14 a candidate for nomination for, or election to, an office described
- 15 in this act. This subdivision does not apply to requests for
- 16 contributions of money by or to an authorized representative of the
- 17 political party committee of the organization to which the
- 18 candidate belongs. This subdivision does not apply to a regular
- 19 business transaction between a candidate and any other ANOTHER
- 20 person that is not intended for, or connected with, the securing of
- 21 votes or the influencing of voters in connection with the
- 22 nomination or election.
- 23 (d) A person shall not, either directly or indirectly,
- 24 discharge or threaten to discharge an employee of the person for
- 25 the purpose of influencing the employee's vote at an election.
- 26 (e) A priest, pastor, curate, or other officer of a religious
- 27 society shall not for the purpose of influencing a voter at an

- 1 election, impose or threaten to impose upon the voter a penalty of
- 2 excommunication, dismissal, or expulsion, or command or advise the
- 3 voter, under pain of religious disapproval.
- 4 (f) A person shall not hire a motor vehicle or other
- 5 conveyance or cause the same to be done, for conveying voters,
- 6 other than voters physically unable to walk, to an election.
- 7 (g) In a city, township, village, or school district that has
- 8 a board of election commissioners authorized to appoint inspectors
- 9 of election, an inspector of election, a clerk, or other election
- 10 official who accepts an appointment as an inspector of election
- 11 shall not fail to report at the polling place designated on
- 12 election morning at the time specified by the board of election
- 13 commissioners, unless excused as provided in this subdivision. A
- 14 person who violates this subdivision is guilty of a misdemeanor,
- 15 punishable by a fine of not more than \$10.00 or imprisonment for
- 16 not more than 10 days, or both. An inspector of election, clerk, or
- 17 other election official who accepts an appointment as an inspector
- 18 of election is excused for failing to report at the polling place
- 19 on election day and is not subject to a fine or imprisonment under
- 20 this subdivision if 1 or more of the following requirements are
- 21 met:
- 22 (i) The inspector of election, clerk, or other election
- 23 official notifies the board of election commissioners or other
- 24 officers in charge of elections of his or her inability to serve at
- 25 the time and place specified, 3 days or more before the election.
- 26 (ii) The inspector of election, clerk, or other election
- 27 official is excused from duty by the board of election

- 1 commissioners or other officers in charge of elections for cause
- 2 shown.
- 3 (h) A person shall not willfully fail to perform a duty
- 4 imposed upon that person by this act, or disobey a lawful
- 5 instruction or order of the secretary of state as chief state
- 6 election officer or of a board of county election commissioners,
- 7 board of city election commissioners, or board of inspectors of
- 8 election.
- 9 (i) A delegate or member of a convention shall not solicit a
- 10 candidate for nomination before the convention for money, reward,
- 11 position, place, preferment, or other valuable consideration in
- 12 return for support by the delegate or member in the convention. A
- 13 candidate or other person shall not promise or give to a delegate
- 14 money, reward, position, place, preferment, or other valuable
- 15 consideration in return for support by or vote of the delegate in
- 16 the convention.
- 17 (j) A person elected to the office of delegate to a convention
- 18 shall not accept or receive any money or other valuable
- 19 consideration for his or her vote as a delegate.
- 20 (k) A person shall not, while the polls are open on an
- 21 election day, solicit votes in a polling place or within 100 feet
- 22 from an entrance to the building in which a polling place is
- 23 located.
- (l) A person shall not keep a room or building for the purpose,
- 25 in whole or in part, of recording or registering bets or wagers, or
- 26 of selling pools, upon the result of a political nomination,
- 27 appointment, or election. A person shall not wager property, money,

- 1 or ANY OTHER thing of value, or be the custodian of money,
- 2 property, or ANY OTHER thing of value, staked, wagered, or pledged
- 3 upon the result of a political nomination, appointment, or
- 4 election.
- 5 (m) A person shall not participate in a meeting or a portion
- 6 of a meeting of more than 2 persons, other than the person's
- 7 immediate family, at which an absent voter ballot is voted.
- 8 (n) A person, other than an authorized election official,
- 9 shall not, either directly or indirectly, give, lend, or promise
- 10 any—valuable consideration to or for a person to induce that person
- 11 to both distribute absent voter ballot applications to voters and
- 12 receive signed absent voter ballot applications from voters for
- 13 delivery to the appropriate clerk.
- 14 (O) A PERSON SHALL NOT CONTRACT FOR, PAY OR RECEIVE PAYMENT
- 15 FOR, TAKE STEPS TO MAKE OR BRING ABOUT, OR OTHERWISE UNDERTAKE TO
- 16 MAKE OR BRING ABOUT AUTOMATED TELEPHONE CALLS SUPPORTING OR
- 17 OPPOSING A CANDIDATE FOR NOMINATION FOR OR ELECTION TO PUBLIC
- 18 OFFICE.
- 19 (2) A person who violates a provision of this act for which a
- 20 penalty is not otherwise specifically provided in this act —is
- 21 quilty of a misdemeanor.
- 22 (3) A person or a person's agent who knowingly makes,
- 23 publishes, disseminates, circulates, or places before the public,
- 24 or knowingly causes directly or indirectly to be made, published,
- 25 disseminated, circulated, or placed before the public, in this
- 26 state, either orally or in writing, an assertion, representation,
- 27 or statement of fact concerning a candidate for public office at an

- 1 election in this state, that is false, deceptive, scurrilous, or
- 2 malicious, without the true name of the author being subscribed to
- 3 the assertion, representation, or statement if written, or
- 4 announced if unwritten, is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 5 (4) As used in this section, "valuable consideration"
- 6 includes, but is not limited to, money, property, a gift, a prize
- 7 or chance for a prize, a fee, a loan, an office, a position, an
- 8 appointment, or employment.

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
