## **HOUSE BILL No. 4096**

January 23, 2007, Introduced by Reps. Vagnozzi, Byrnes, Gonzales, Constan, Lemmons, Cushingberry and Clack and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to create the Michigan opportunity scholarship program; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state governmental officers and entities; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
   "Michigan opportunity scholarship act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) Except as used in section 6, "academic year" means 2
  5 semesters or 3 terms of enrollment at an approved postsecondary
  6 educational institution.
  - (b) "Approved postsecondary educational institution" means a degree or certificate granting public or independent nonprofit college or university, junior college, or community college in this state.

- 1 (c) "Assessment test" means the Michigan education assessment
- 2 program (MEAP) subject area assessments or any successor assessment
- 3 test approved by the state board.
- 4 (d) "Authority" means the Michigan higher education assistance
- 5 authority created by 1960 PA 77, MCL 390.951 to 390.961.
- 6 (e) "Eligible costs" means tuition and fees charged by an
- 7 approved postsecondary educational institution; related costs for
- 8 room, board, books, and supplies; and other costs determined by the
- 9 authority.
- 10 (f) "FAFSA" means the free application for federal student aid
- 11 developed under section 432(m)(1)(c) of part B of title IV of the
- 12 higher education act of 1965, 20 USC 1082.
- 13 (g) "Fiscal year" means the fiscal year of this state.
- 14 (h) "Michigan opportunity scholarship" means a scholarship
- awarded by the authority under section 3.
- 16 (i) "State board" means the state board of education.
- 17 Sec. 3. (1) To increase access to postsecondary education for
- 18 Michigan high school graduates who need financial assistance, the
- 19 Michigan opportunity scholarship program is established. The
- 20 authority shall administer the Michigan opportunity scholarship
- 21 program.
- 22 (2) Subject to the conditions and requirements contained in
- 23 this act, each student enrolled in grade 12 in or after the 2006-
- 24 2007 school year is eligible for the award of a Michigan
- 25 opportunity scholarship in an academic year if the authority finds
- 26 that the student meets all of the following requirements:
- 27 (a) The student is a United States citizen, has resided

- 1 continuously in this state for the preceding 12 months, is not
- 2 considered a resident of any other state, and is not incarcerated.
- 3 (b) The student graduated from high school or passed the
- 4 general educational development (GED) test or other graduate
- 5 equivalency examination approved by the state board within the 4-
- 6 year period preceding the date of the student's application to
- 7 receive his or her Michigan opportunity scholarship money. If the
- 8 student becomes a member of the United States armed forces or peace
- 9 corps during this 4-year period and serves for 4 years or less, the
- 10 4-year period is extended by a period equal to the number of days
- 11 the student served as a member of the United States armed forces or
- 12 peace corps. The authority may also extend the 4-year period if the
- 13 authority determines that an extension is warranted because of an
- 14 illness, disability, or other family emergency of the student or in
- 15 the student's immediate family.
- 16 (c) The student took the assessment test in the subject areas
- 17 of reading, writing, mathematics, and science while in high school.
- 18 (d) The student is enrolled in an approved postsecondary
- 19 educational institution.
- 20 (e) The student has a need for financial assistance as
- 21 determined by the authority.
- 22 (f) The student is not a recipient of a scholarship awarded
- 23 under 1964 PA 208, MCL 390.971 to 390.981, or a tuition grant
- 24 awarded under 1966 PA 313, MCL 390.991 to 390.997a.
- 25 (g) If the student has previously received a Michigan
- 26 opportunity scholarship, the student has maintained satisfactory
- 27 academic progress, as defined by the approved postsecondary

- 1 educational institution in which the student is enrolled, since
- 2 receiving the previous Michigan opportunity scholarship.
- 3 (h) The student meets any additional eligibility requirements
- 4 established by the authority.
- 5 Sec. 4. All of the following apply to the award of a Michigan
- 6 opportunity scholarship under this act:
- 7 (a) The authority shall determine the amount of a Michigan
- 8 opportunity scholarship paid to a student in any academic year,
- 9 based on an evaluation of the family's financial resources
- 10 described in the FAFSA and the eligible costs at the approved
- 11 postsecondary institution in which the student is enrolled.
- 12 (b) A student attending an approved postsecondary educational
- 13 institution as a full-time student may not receive a Michigan
- 14 opportunity scholarship under this act in more than 5 academic
- 15 years. The authority shall determine the number of academic years a
- 16 student who is not attending an approved postsecondary educational
- 17 institution as a full-time student but is attending at least half-
- 18 time for which the student may receive a Michigan opportunity
- 19 scholarship. A student attending an approved postsecondary
- 20 educational institution less than half-time may not receive a
- 21 Michigan opportunity scholarship.
- (c) A student must maintain satisfactory academic progress, as
- 23 defined by the approved postsecondary educational institution in
- 24 which the student is enrolled, and comply with any rules
- 25 promulgated by the authority to remain eligible for a Michigan
- 26 opportunity scholarship.
- 27 (d) A student may use a Michigan opportunity scholarship only

- 1 to pay for eligible costs. The authority shall determine the
- 2 process for payment of a Michigan opportunity scholarship on behalf
- 3 of a student eligible under this act.
- 4 (e) The annual cost of the total number of scholarships paid
- 5 in a fiscal year shall not exceed the amount appropriated by the
- 6 legislature for the Michigan opportunity scholarship in that fiscal
- 7 year. If there are not sufficient funds appropriated by the
- 8 legislature to provide each student with a scholarship in the
- 9 amount to which those students are eligible in an academic year,
- 10 the authority shall establish a maximum scholarship level for that
- 11 academic year. In any fiscal year, the authority may adjust the
- 12 amount of a Michigan opportunity scholarship available to eligible
- 13 students, based upon its determination of available resources and
- 14 amounts appropriated.
- 15 Sec. 5. If the legislature appropriates money in a fiscal year
- 16 for the Michigan opportunity scholarship program, the authority
- 17 shall use the funds for any of the following purposes:
- 18 (a) Michigan opportunity scholarships under this act.
- 19 (b) Funding scholarships to students who received a state
- 20 competitive scholarship in 2006-2007 under 1964 PA 208, MCL 390.971
- 21 to 390.981, and who meet the eligibility requirements contained in
- 22 that act at the time a scholarship is provided under this
- 23 subdivision.
- 24 (c) Funding grants to students who received a tuition grant in
- 25 2006-2007 under 1966 PA 313, MCL 390.991 to 390.997a, and who meet
- 26 the eligibility requirements contained in that act at the time a
- 27 tuition grant is provided under this subdivision.

- 1 (d) Payment of necessary expenses properly incurred by the
- 2 authority in carrying out its powers and duties under this act.
- 3 (e) Other payments required by law.
- 4 Sec. 6. The authority shall pay a Michigan opportunity
- 5 scholarship in the fiscal year that begins October 1 in the
- 6 academic year in which the student is eligible for the scholarship.
- 7 As used in this section, "academic year" means a 12-month period
- 8 that begins on August 1 and ends on the following July 31. The
- 9 legislature shall annually establish the payment schedule.
- Sec. 7. The authority shall provide each student written
- 11 notice of whether or not the student is eligible for the award of a
- 12 Michigan opportunity scholarship under this act. If a student is
- 13 eliqible, the written notice shall also contain the Michigan
- 14 opportunity scholarship amount for which the student is eligible,
- 15 how the student applies for payment of the Michigan opportunity
- 16 scholarship, and any other information the authority considers
- 17 necessary regarding qualification requirements or conditions
- 18 relating to the use of the Michigan opportunity scholarship.
- 19 Sec. 8. By March 1 of each year, the authority shall submit a
- 20 report on its activities under this act to the senate and house
- 21 fiscal agencies and the state budget director. The report shall
- 22 contain at least all of the following information:
- 23 (a) The number of Michigan opportunity scholarships awarded,
- 24 the maximum amount of a Michigan opportunity scholarship paid, and
- 25 the total amount paid out for Michigan opportunity scholarships in
- 26 the immediately preceding fiscal year.
- 27 (b) The number of state competitive scholarships awarded under

- 1 1964 PA 208, MCL 390.971 to 390.981, the maximum amount of a state
- 2 competitive scholarship paid, and the total amount paid out for
- 3 state competitive scholarships in the immediately preceding fiscal
- 4 year.
- 5 (c) The number of state tuition grants awarded under 1966 PA
- 6 313, MCL 390.991 to 390.997a, the maximum amount of a state tuition
- 7 grant, and the total amount paid out for state tuition grants in
- 8 the immediately preceding fiscal year.
- 9 Enacting section 1. Each of the following acts is repealed
- 10 effective October 1, 2007:
- 11 (a) 1964 PA 208, MCL 390.971 to 390.981.
- 12 (b) 1966 PA 313, MCL 390.991 to 390.997a.
- 13 (c) 1974 PA 75, MCL 390.1021 to 390.1027.
- 14 (d) 1986 PA 102, MCL 390.1281 to 390.1288.
- 15 (e) 1986 PA 273, MCL 390.1401 to 390.1409.
- 16 (f) 1986 PA 288, MCL 390.1371 to 390.1382.
- 17 (g) 1986 PA 303, MCL 390.1321 to 390.1332.
