

HOUSE BILL No. 4829

May 24, 2007, Introduced by Reps. Valentine, Sheltroun, Lahti, McDowell, Espinoza, Mayes, Meadows, Bauer, Condino, Lindberg, Corriveau and Gillard and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for the department of natural resources for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2007; to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations; and to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations.

PART 2

PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

GENERAL SECTIONS

21 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
22 constitution of 1963, total state spending under part 1 for the
23 fiscal year ending September 30, 2007 is \$36,076,100.00. State
24 payments to local units of government under this act are
25 \$24,842,600.00 as follows:

1	Acquisition grants in aid.....	\$	18,580,800

4 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and the expenditures
5 authorized under this act and the departments, agencies,
6 commissions, boards, offices, and programs for which an
7 appropriation is made under this act are subject to the management
8 and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

9 Sec. 203. The department of natural resources shall require
10 local units of government to enter into agreements with the
11 department of natural resources for the purpose of administering
12 the natural resources trust fund grants identified in part 1. Among
13 other provisions, the agreements shall require that grant
14 recipients agree to dedicate to public outdoor recreation uses in
15 perpetuity the land acquired or developed; to replace lands
16 converted or lost to other than public outdoor recreation use; and,
17 for parcels acquired that are over 5 acres in size, to provide the
18 state with a nonparticipating 1/6 minimum royalty interest in any
19 acquired minerals that are retained by the grant recipient. The
20 agreements shall also provide that the full payments of grants can
21 be made only after proof of acquisition, or completion of the
22 development project, is submitted by the grant recipient and all
23 costs are verified by the department of natural resources.
