HOUSE BILL No. 4840

May 24, 2007, Introduced by Rep. Kathleen Law and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled

"Public health code,"

by amending section 20161 (MCL 333.20161), as amended by 2007 PA 5.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 20161. (1) The department shall assess fees and other
- 2 assessments for health facility and agency licenses and
- 3 certificates of need on an annual basis as provided in this
- 4 article. Except as otherwise provided in this article, fees and
- 5 assessments shall be paid in accordance with the following
- 6 schedule:
- 7 (a) Freestanding surgical

- 3 surcharge of \$23.00 per bed. As used in this subsection, "title
- 4 XVIII" and "title XIX" mean those terms as defined in section
- **5** 20155.
- 6 (3) The base fee for a certificate of need is \$1,500.00 for
- 7 each application. For a project requiring a projected capital
- 8 expenditure of more than \$500,000.00 but less than \$4,000,000.00,
- 9 an additional fee of \$4,000.00 shall be added to the base fee.
- 10 For a project requiring a projected capital expenditure of
- 11 \$4,000,000.00 or more, an additional fee of \$7,000.00 shall be
- 12 added to the base fee. The department of community health shall
- 13 use the fees collected under this subsection only to fund the
- 14 certificate of need program. Funds remaining in the certificate
- 15 of need program at the end of the fiscal year shall not lapse to
- 16 the general fund but shall remain available to fund the
- 17 certificate of need program in subsequent years.
- 18 (4) If licensure is for more than 1 year, the fees described
- 19 in subsection (1) are multiplied by the number of years for which
- 20 the license is issued, and the total amount of the fees shall be
- 21 collected in the year in which the license is issued.
- 22 (5) Fees described in this section are payable to the
- 23 department at the time an application for a license, permit, or
- 24 certificate is submitted. If an application for a license,
- 25 permit, or certificate is denied or if a license, permit, or
- 26 certificate is revoked before its expiration date, the department
- 27 shall not refund fees paid to the department.

- 1 (6) The fee for a provisional license or temporary permit is
- 2 the same as for a license. A license may be issued at the
- 3 expiration date of a temporary permit without an additional fee
- 4 for the balance of the period for which the fee was paid if the
- 5 requirements for licensure are met.
- 6 (7) The department may charge a fee to recover the cost of
- 7 purchase or production and distribution of proficiency evaluation
- 8 samples that are supplied to clinical laboratories pursuant to
- 9 section 20521(3).
- 10 (8) In addition to the fees imposed under subsection (1), a
- 11 clinical laboratory shall submit a fee of \$25.00 to the
- 12 department for each reissuance during the licensure period of the
- 13 clinical laboratory's license.
- 14 (9) The cost of licensure activities shall be supported by
- 15 license fees.
- 16 (10) The application fee for a waiver under section 21564 is
- 17 \$200.00 plus \$40.00 per hour for the professional services and
- 18 travel expenses directly related to processing the application.
- 19 The travel expenses shall be calculated in accordance with the
- 20 state standardized travel regulations of the department of
- 21 management and budget in effect at the time of the travel.
- 22 (11) An applicant for licensure or renewal of licensure
- 23 under part 209 shall pay the applicable fees set forth in part
- **24** 209.
- 25 (12) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the fees
- 26 and assessments collected under this section shall be deposited
- 27 in the state treasury, to the credit of the general fund.

- 1 (13) The quality assurance assessment collected under
- 2 subsection (1)(g) and all federal matching funds attributed to
- 3 that assessment shall be used only for the following purposes and
- 4 under the following specific circumstances:
- 5 (a) The quality assurance assessment and all federal
- 6 matching funds attributed to that assessment shall be used to
- 7 finance medicaid nursing home reimbursement payments. Only
- 8 licensed nursing homes and hospital long-term care units that are
- 9 assessed the quality assurance assessment and participate in the
- 10 medicaid program are eligible for increased per diem medicaid
- 11 reimbursement rates under this subdivision.
- 12 (b) Except as otherwise provided under subdivision (c),
- 13 beginning October 1, 2005, the quality assurance assessment is
- 14 based on the total number of patient days of care each nursing
- 15 home and hospital long-term care unit provided to nonmedicare
- 16 patients within the immediately preceding year and shall be
- 17 assessed at a uniform rate on October 1, 2005 and subsequently on
- 18 October 1 of each following year, and is payable on a quarterly
- 19 basis, the first payment due 90 days after the date the
- 20 assessment is assessed.
- 21 (c) Within 30 days after September 30, 2005, the department
- 22 shall submit an application to the federal centers for medicare
- 23 and medicaid services to request a waiver pursuant to 42 CFR
- 24 433.68(e) to implement this subdivision as follows:
- 25 (i) If the waiver is approved, the quality assurance
- 26 assessment rate for a nursing home or hospital long-term care
- 27 unit with less than 40 licensed beds or with the maximum number,

- 1 or more than the maximum number, of licensed beds necessary to
- 2 secure federal approval of the application is \$2.00 per
- 3 nonmedicare patient day of care provided within the immediately
- 4 preceding year or a rate as otherwise altered on the application
- 5 for the waiver to obtain federal approval. If the waiver is
- 6 approved, for all other nursing homes and long-term care units
- 7 the quality assurance assessment rate is to be calculated by
- 8 dividing the total statewide maximum allowable assessment
- 9 permitted under subsection (1)(g) less the total amount to be
- 10 paid by the nursing homes and long-term care units with less than
- 11 40 or with the maximum number, or more than the maximum number,
- 12 of licensed beds necessary to secure federal approval of the
- 13 application by the total number of nonmedicare patient days of
- 14 care provided within the immediately preceding year by those
- 15 nursing homes and long-term care units with more than 39, but
- 16 less than the maximum number of licensed beds necessary to secure
- 17 federal approval. The quality assurance assessment, as provided
- 18 under this subparagraph, shall be assessed in the first quarter
- 19 after federal approval of the waiver and shall be subsequently
- 20 assessed on October 1 of each following year, and is payable on a
- 21 quarterly basis, the first payment due 90 days after the date the
- 22 assessment is assessed.
- 23 (ii) If the waiver is approved, continuing care retirement
- 24 centers are exempt from the quality assurance assessment if the
- 25 continuing care retirement center requires each center resident
- 26 to provide an initial life interest payment of \$150,000.00, on
- 27 average, per resident to ensure payment for that resident's

- 1 residency and services and the continuing care retirement center
- 2 utilizes all of the initial life interest payment before the
- 3 resident becomes eligible for medical assistance under the
- 4 state's medicaid plan. As used in this subparagraph, "continuing
- 5 care retirement center" means a nursing care facility that
- 6 provides independent living services, assisted living services,
- 7 and nursing care and medical treatment services, in a campus-like
- 8 setting that has shared facilities or common areas, or both.
- 9 (d) Beginning October 1, 2007, the department shall no
- 10 longer assess or collect the quality assurance assessment or
- 11 apply for federal matching funds.
- 12 (e) Beginning May 10, 2002, the department of community
- 13 health shall increase the per diem nursing home medicaid
- 14 reimbursement rates for the balance of that year. For each
- 15 subsequent year in which the quality assurance assessment is
- 16 assessed and collected, the department of community health shall
- 17 maintain the medicaid nursing home reimbursement payment increase
- 18 financed by the quality assurance assessment.
- 19 (f) The department of community health shall implement this
- 20 section in a manner that complies with federal requirements
- 21 necessary to assure that the quality assurance assessment
- 22 qualifies for federal matching funds.
- 23 (g) If a nursing home or a hospital long-term care unit
- 24 fails to pay the assessment required by subsection (1)(g), the
- 25 department of community health may assess the nursing home or
- 26 hospital long-term care unit a penalty of 5% of the assessment
- 27 for each month that the assessment and penalty are not paid up to

- 1 a maximum of 50% of the assessment. The department of community
- 2 health may also refer for collection to the department of
- 3 treasury past due amounts consistent with section 13 of 1941 PA
- 4 122, MCL 205.13.
- 5 (h) The medicaid nursing home quality assurance assessment
- 6 fund is established in the state treasury. The department of
- 7 community health shall deposit the revenue raised through the
- 8 quality assurance assessment with the state treasurer for deposit
- 9 in the medicaid nursing home quality assurance assessment fund.
- 10 (i) The department of community health shall not implement
- 11 this subsection in a manner that conflicts with 42 USC 1396b(w).
- 12 (j) The quality assurance assessment collected under
- 13 subsection (1)(g) shall be prorated on a quarterly basis for any
- 14 licensed beds added to or subtracted from a nursing home or
- 15 hospital long-term care unit since the immediately preceding July
- 16 1. Any adjustments in payments are due on the next quarterly
- 17 installment due date.
- 18 (k) In each fiscal year governed by this subsection,
- 19 medicaid reimbursement rates shall not be reduced below the
- 20 medicaid reimbursement rates in effect on April 1, 2002 as a
- 21 direct result of the quality assurance assessment collected under
- **22** subsection (1)(g).
- 23 (1) In fiscal year 2005-2006, \$39,900,000.00 of the quality
- 24 assurance assessment collected pursuant to subsection (1)(g)
- 25 shall be appropriated to the department of community health to
- 26 support medicaid expenditures for long-term care services. These
- 27 funds shall offset an identical amount of general fund/general

- 1 purpose revenue originally appropriated for that purpose.
- 2 (14) The quality assurance dedication is an earmarked
- 3 assessment collected under subsection (1)(h). That assessment and
- 4 all federal matching funds attributed to that assessment shall be
- 5 used only for the following purpose and under the following
- 6 specific circumstances:
- 7 (a) To maintain the increased medicaid reimbursement rate
- 8 increases as provided for in subdivision (c).
- 9 (b) The quality assurance assessment shall be assessed on
- 10 all net patient revenue, before deduction of expenses, less
- 11 medicare net revenue, as reported in the most recently available
- 12 medicare cost report and is payable on a quarterly basis, the
- 13 first payment due 90 days after the date the assessment is
- 14 assessed. As used in this subdivision, "medicare net revenue"
- 15 includes medicare payments and amounts collected for coinsurance
- 16 and deductibles.
- 17 (c) Beginning October 1, 2002, the department of community
- 18 health shall increase the hospital medicaid reimbursement rates
- 19 for the balance of that year. For each subsequent year in which
- 20 the quality assurance assessment is assessed and collected, the
- 21 department of community health shall maintain the hospital
- 22 medicaid reimbursement rate increase financed by the quality
- 23 assurance assessments.
- 24 (d) The department of community health shall implement this
- 25 section in a manner that complies with federal requirements
- 26 necessary to assure that the quality assurance assessment
- 27 qualifies for federal matching funds.

- 1 (e) If a hospital fails to pay the assessment required by
- 2 subsection (1)(h), the department of community health may assess
- 3 the hospital a penalty of 5% of the assessment for each month
- 4 that the assessment and penalty are not paid up to a maximum of
- 5 50% of the assessment. The department of community health may
- 6 also refer for collection to the department of treasury past due
- 7 amounts consistent with section 13 of 1941 PA 122, MCL 205.13.
- **8** (f) The hospital quality assurance assessment fund is
- 9 established in the state treasury. The department of community
- 10 health shall deposit the revenue raised through the quality
- 11 assurance assessment with the state treasurer for deposit in the
- 12 hospital quality assurance assessment fund.
- 13 (g) In each fiscal year governed by this subsection, the
- 14 quality assurance assessment shall only be collected and expended
- 15 if medicaid hospital inpatient DRG and outpatient reimbursement
- 16 rates and disproportionate share hospital and graduate medical
- 17 education payments are not below the level of rates and payments
- 18 in effect on April 1, 2002 as a direct result of the quality
- 19 assurance assessment collected under subsection (1)(h), except as
- 20 provided in subdivision (h).
- 21 (h) The quality assurance assessment collected under
- 22 subsection (1)(h) shall no longer be assessed or collected after
- 23 September 30, 2008, or in the event that the quality assurance
- 24 assessment is not eligible for federal matching funds. Any
- 25 portion of the quality assurance assessment collected from a
- 26 hospital that is not eligible for federal matching funds shall be
- 27 returned to the hospital.

- 1 (i) In fiscal year 2005-2006, \$46,400,000.00 of the quality
- 2 assurance assessment collected pursuant to subsection (1)(h)
- 3 shall be appropriated to the department of community health to
- 4 support medicaid expenditures for hospital services and therapy.
- 5 These funds shall offset an identical amount of general
- 6 fund/general purpose revenue originally appropriated for that
- 7 purpose.
- 8 (15) The quality assurance assessment provided for under
- 9 this section is a tax that is levied on a health facility or
- 10 agency.
- 11 (16) As used in this section, "medicaid" means that term as
- 12 defined in section 22207.

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
