## **HOUSE BILL No. 4936**

June 19, 2007, Introduced by Reps. Coulouris, LeBlanc, Warren, Bauer, Meadows, Byrum, Corriveau, Bieda, Condino, Ebli, Lemmons, Wojno, Byrnes, Sheltrown, Hood, Clack, Valentine, Brown, Donigan, Young, Robert Jones, Alma Smith, Simpson, Vagnozzi, Johnson, Melton, Mayes, Hammon, Hammel, Miller, Scott, Cheeks, Gaffney, Angerer, Jackson and Opsommer and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 5474a (MCL 333.5474a), as added by 2004 PA 431.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 5474a. (1) Within 30 days after the effective date of
  this section DECEMBER 21, 2004, the governor shall establish a
  childhood lead poisoning prevention and control commission within
  the department of community health. The commission shall consist of
  the following 9 voting members appointed by the governor with the
  advice and consent of the senate:
  - (a) One member representing the department of community health. The member appointed under this subdivision shall serve as chairperson.

- 1 (b) One member representing the family independence agency
- 2 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.
- 3 (c) One member representing the department of environmental
- 4 quality.
- 5 (d) One member representing the Michigan state housing
- 6 development authority.
- 7 (e) One member representing "Get the Lead Out!". The member
- 8 appointed under this subdivision shall be from a county with a
- 9 population of more than 500,000 but not more than 700,000.
- 10 (f) One member representing a local health department located
- 11 in a county with a population of more than 170,000 but not more
- 12 than 200,000.
- 13 (g) One member representing certified lead-abatement
- 14 contractors.
- 15 (h) Two members representing the general public. One of the
- 16 members appointed under this subdivision shall be from a city with
- 17 a population of 750,000 or more and be a parent of a child who has
- 18 experienced lead poisoning or a child advocate who has experience
- 19 with lead poisoning in children. The second member appointed under
- 20 this subdivision shall represent property owners and developers in
- 21 this state.
- 22 (2) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation
- 23 but, subject to appropriations, may receive reimbursement for their
- 24 actual and necessary expenses while attending meetings or
- 25 performing other authorized official business of the commission. If
- 26 a vacancy occurs on the commission, that vacancy shall be filled in
- 27 the same manner as the original appointment.

- 1 (3) The childhood lead poisoning prevention and control
- 2 commission shall conduct at least 2 public hearings to seek input
- 3 from the general public and all of the following groups or
- 4 individuals that have an interest in childhood lead poisoning
- **5** prevention and control:
- 6 (a) The Michigan association of osteopathic family
- 7 practitioners PHYSICIANS or its successor organization.
- 8 (b) The Michigan nurses association or its successor
- 9 organization.
- 10 (c) The Michigan association COUNCIL of nurse practitioners or
- 11 its successor organization.
- 12 (d) The Michigan association of health plans or its successor
- 13 organization.
- 14 (e) The Michigan association of FOR local public health or its
- 15 successor organization.
- 16 (f) Blue cross blue shield of Michigan or its successor
- 17 organization.
- 18 (g) The Michigan health and hospital association or its
- 19 successor organization.
- 20 (h) The Michigan head start association or its successor
- 21 organization.
- (i) The Michigan council for maternal and child health or its
- 23 successor organization.
- 24 (j) Michigan's children or its successor organization.
- 25 (k) Michigan league for human services or its successor
- 26 organization.
- (l) Detroit public schools or its successor organization.

- 1 (m) The rental property owners association or its successor
- 2 organization.
- 3 (n) The Michigan association of ASSOCIATED general contractors
- 4 or its successor organization.
- 5 (o) The Michigan association of realtors or its successor
- 6 organization.
- 7 (p) The Michigan environmental council or its successor
- 8 organization.
- 9 (q) The Michigan adult blood lead epidemiology and
- 10 surveillance program or its successor organization.
- 11 (r) The Michigan state university extension program or its
- 12 successor organization.
- 13 (s) The Detroit lead partnership or its successor
- 14 organization.
- 15 (t) The Michigan lead safe partnership or its successor
- 16 organization.
- 17 (u) The Detroit mayor's lead LEAD-BASED PAINT task force or
- 18 its successor organization.
- 19 (v) United parents against lead or its successor organization.
- 20 (w) The department of education or its successor organization.
- 21 (x) The Michigan department of community health medical
- 22 services administration or its successor organization.
- 23 (y) The Michigan occupational safety and health administration
- 24 or its successor organization.
- 25 (z) The Michigan department of community health bureau of
- 26 laboratories or its successor organization.
- 27 (aa) An occupational and environmental medicine specialist.

- 1 (bb) Parents or patient advocates of children who have
- 2 experienced lead poisoning.
- 3 (cc) A local housing authority.
- 4 (dd) A community reinvestment officer.
- 5 (ee) The Michigan state medical society or its successor
- 6 organization.
- 7 (ff) The Michigan academy of family practice PHYSICIANS or its
- 8 successor organization.
- 9 (qq) Saint Mary's field neurosciences institute or its
- 10 successor organization.
- 11 (hh) The American academy of pediatrics or its successor
- 12 organization.
- 13 (ii) The arc Michigan organization or its successor
- 14 organization.
- 15 (jj) Any other interested organization or association
- 16 concerned with the prevention, treatment, and control of lead
- 17 poisoning that the department determines necessary.
- 18 (4) The first public hearing shall be held within 60 days
- 19 after the commission has been appointed under subsection (1). The
- 20 commission may hold additional public hearings as it determines
- 21 necessary or appropriate to carry out its duties under this part.
- 22 (5) The commission shall conduct its business at a public
- 23 meeting held in compliance with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267,
- 24 MCL 15.261 to 15.275. The commission shall give public notice of
- 25 the time, date, and place of the meeting in the manner required by
- 26 the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 27 (6) The commission shall make available a writing prepared,

- 1 owned, used, in the possession of, or retained by the childhood
- 2 lead poisoning prevention and control commission to the public in
- 3 compliance with the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL
- 4 15.231 to 15.246.
- 5 (7) As used in this section, "commission" means the commission
- 6 created and appointed by the governor under subsection (1).
- 7 (8) This section is repealed effective July 1, 2007.
