## **HOUSE BILL No. 5086**

August 1, 2007, Introduced by Reps. LeBlanc, Cushingberry and Sak and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to create a public safety officer grant program; to prescribe certain powers and duties of the Michigan commission on law enforcement standards and the department of state police; and to create certain funds.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Certified law enforcement officer" means a law
- 3 enforcement officer certified by the commission under the law
- 4 enforcement officers training council act of 1965, 1965 PA 203, MCL
- **5** 28.601 to 28.616.
- 6 (b) "Commission" means the Michigan commission on law
  - enforcement standards created in Executive Reorganization Order No.
  - 2001-2, MCL 28.621.
    - (c) "Firefighter" means a regularly employed member of a fire

- 1 department of a local unit of government who is employed to fight
- 2 fires.
- 3 (d) "Fund" means the public safety officer grant fund created
- 4 in section 8.
- (e) "Local unit of government" means a city, village,
- 6 township, or county.
- 7 Sec. 2. (1) The commission shall establish a public safety
- 8 officer grant program. The program shall provide funding to local
- 9 units of government in this state for the costs of employing
- 10 certified law enforcement officers and firefighters. The commission
- 11 shall make the grants described in this act.
- 12 (2) Each grant made under this act shall cover 50% of the
- 13 annual cost of employing either 1 full-time certified law
- 14 enforcement officer or 1 full-time firefighter in that local unit
- 15 of government. As a condition of receiving a grant under this act,
- 16 the local unit of government shall expend matching funds in the
- 17 same amount to cover the remaining 50% of that cost.
- 18 Sec. 3. (1) A local unit of government may apply for a grant
- 19 pertaining to a law enforcement officer under this act only if the
- 20 number of full-time certified law enforcement officers employed by
- 21 the local unit of government on the date of application is less
- 22 than the number of full-time certified law enforcement officers
- 23 employed by the local unit of government on September 11, 2001.
- 24 (2) A local unit of government may apply for a grant
- 25 pertaining to a firefighter under this act only if the number of
- 26 full-time firefighters employed by the local unit of government on
- 27 the date of application is less than the number of full-time

- 1 firefighters employed by the local unit of government on September
- **2** 11, 2001.
- 3 Sec. 4. (1) A local unit of government may be awarded not more
- 4 than 15 grants in any 1 state fiscal year.
- 5 (2) Once a grant has been awarded to a local unit of
- 6 government, the local unit of government may apply to the
- 7 commission each subsequent fiscal year to renew that grant.
- 8 Sec. 6. (1) The department shall not expend more than 90% of
- 9 the total amount in the fund in any state fiscal year on the public
- 10 safety officer grant program.
- 11 (2) Of the total amount in the fund in any fiscal year, not
- more than 1/6 of that amount may be expended for grants to pay
- 13 costs of employing firefighters.
- 14 Sec. 7. Within 6 months after the effective date of this act,
- 15 the commission shall establish an application and review process
- 16 for considering grant applications under this act. The application
- 17 shall contain the information required by the commission. Within 60
- 18 days after receiving an administratively complete grant
- 19 application, the commission shall, in writing, notify the applicant
- 20 whether the application is approved or rejected. If the commission
- 21 approves a grant under this act, the commission shall enter into a
- 22 grant agreement with the recipient before transferring funds. The
- 23 grant agreement shall contain terms established by the commission.
- 24 Sec. 8. (1) The public safety officer grant fund is created
- 25 within the state treasury.
- 26 (2) The state treasurer may receive money or other assets from
- 27 any source for deposit into the fund. The state treasurer shall

- 1 direct the investment of the fund. The state treasurer shall credit
- 2 to the fund interest and earnings from fund investments.
- 3 (3) Money in the fund at the close of the fiscal year shall
- 4 remain in the fund and shall not lapse to the general fund.
- 5 (4) The department of state police shall be the administrator
- 6 of the fund for auditing purposes.
- 7 (5) The commission shall expend money from the fund, upon
- 8 appropriation, only for grants as provided under this act.
