## **HOUSE BILL No. 5159**

September 5, 2007, Introduced by Rep. Sheen and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1990 PA 187, entitled

"The pupil transportation act,"

by amending section 57 (MCL 257.1857), as amended by 2006 PA 108.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 57. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2), (3), and
- 2 (4), the driver of a school bus, before crossing a railroad track
- 3 at grade, shall stop the vehicle within 50 feet but not less than
- 4 15 feet from the nearest rail, activate hazard warning lights, turn
- 5 off all interior switches including fans, heaters, and radios, open
- 6 the passenger door and driver-side window, and while stopped shall
- 7 listen and look in both directions along the track for an
- 8 approaching train and for signals indicating the approach of a
- train, and shall not proceed until the driver can do so safely.
- 10 After stopping as required in this subsection, and upon proceeding

- 1 when it is safe to do so, the driver of the vehicle shall cross
- 2 only in a gear of the vehicle that does not require changing gears
- 3 while traversing the crossing. The driver shall not shift gears
- 4 while crossing the track or tracks.
- 5 (2) A stop need not be made at a railroad track grade crossing
- 6 where a uniformed police officer or a traffic-control signal
- 7 directs traffic to proceed.
- 8 (3) A stop need not be made at an abandoned railroad track
- 9 grade crossing. As used in this subsection, "abandoned railroad
- 10 track" means a railroad track which THAT meets both of the
- 11 following requirements:
- 12 (a) The track has been completely paved over or removed,
- 13 PARTIALLY REMOVED AT OR ADJACENT TO THE RAILROAD CROSSING, OR IS
- 14 OTHERWISE UNUSABLE FOR RAIL TRANSPORTATION.
- 15 (b) All signs, signals, and other warning devices are removed.
- 16 (4) A stop shall not be made at a railroad track grade
- 17 crossing on a freeway or limited access highway where the crossing
- 18 is protected by a clearly visible signal, crossing gate, or barrier
- 19 at a time when the signal, crossing gate, or barrier is not
- 20 activated.
- 21 (5) A person who violates this section is responsible for a
- 22 civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more
- 23 than \$100.00. A civil infraction under this subsection shall be
- 24 processed in the same manner as a civil infraction under the
- 25 Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923.
