HOUSE BILL No. 5839

February 28, 2008, Introduced by Rep. Elsenheimer and referred to the Committee on Tourism, Outdoor Recreation and Natural Resources.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled

"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"

by amending sections 78105 and 78115 (MCL 324.78105 and 324.78115), as amended by 2004 PA 587.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 78105. The department shall have the following powers and 2 duties:
 - (a) To acquire, construct, and maintain harbors, channels, and facilities for vessels in the navigable waters lying within the boundaries of the THIS state. of Michigan.
 - (b) To acquire, by purchase, lease, gift, or condemnation the lands, rights of way, and easements necessary for harbors and channels. The department shall be considered a state agency under

- 1 1911 PA 149, MCL 213.21 to 213.25. , relative to condemnation by
- 2 state agencies.
- 3 (c) To acquire, by purchase, lease, gift, or condemnation
- 4 suitable areas on shore for disposal of the material from dredging.
- 5 (d) To enter into any contracts or agreements that may be
- 6 necessary in carrying out this part, including agreements to hold
- 7 and save the United States free from damages due to the
- 8 construction and maintenance by the United States of those works
- 9 that the United States undertakes.
- 10 (e) To provide for the granting of concessions within the
- 11 boundaries of harbors, so as to furnish the public gas, oil, food,
- 12 and other facilities.
- 13 (f) To represent the THIS state of Michigan and the governor
- 14 of Michigan in dealings with the chief of engineers of the United
- 15 States army and his or her authorized agents for the purposes set
- 16 forth in this part.
- 17 (g) To charge fees for both seasonal and daily moorage at
- 18 state-operated small craft mooring facilities. All revenues derived
- 19 from this source THE FEES shall be deposited in the waterways
- 20 account.
- 21 (h) To charge fees for both daily and seasonal use of state-
- 22 operated public access sites, if the cost of collecting the fees
- 23 will not exceed the revenue derived from the fees for daily and
- 24 seasonal passes. All revenues derived from this source shall be
- 25 deposited in the waterways account. A seasonal pass shall grant the
- 26 permittee the right to enter any state-operated public access site
- 27 without payment of an additional fee.

- 1 (H) (i) To collect the proceeds from the sale of marine fuel
- 2 at harbors operated by the department. The proceeds from the sales
- 3 shall be credited to **DEPOSITED IN** the waterways account and used
- 4 for the purchase of marine fuel supplies as may be needed. Any
- 5 remaining revenue from this source not needed for the purchase of
- 6 marine fuel supplies may be expended in the same manner as other
- 7 funds within MONEY IN the waterways account.
- 8 Sec. 78115. (1) The department shall establish a public
- 9 boating access sites grant program. The grant program shall provide
- 10 funding with money in the waterways account to local units of
- 11 government and public colleges or universities for all or a portion
- 12 of the cost of either or both of the following:
- 13 (a) The acquisition of land for the establishment of a public
- 14 boating access site.
- 15 (b) The cost of developing a public boating access site.
- 16 (2) A grant under subsection (1)(a) may be used as the
- 17 required match by a local unit of government or a public college or
- 18 university under part 19 or another state or federal program.
- 19 (3) A local unit of government or a public college or
- 20 university receiving a grant under subsection (1)(b) must agree to
- 21 operate the public boating access site in accordance with the
- 22 department's operational requirements. The operational requirements
- 23 shall be included within a grant agreement that is entered into by
- 24 the grant recipient and the department. The grant agreement may
- 25 contain, but need not be limited to, 1 or more of the following
- 26 provisions as required by the department:
- 27 (a) Any net revenues accruing from the operation of the public

- 1 boating access site shall be separately accounted for and reserved
- 2 in a restricted fund by the grantee for the future maintenance or
- 3 expansion of the public boating access site or, with the approval
- 4 of the department, the construction of other recreational boating
- 5 facilities. Unless otherwise provided in the grant agreement or
- 6 otherwise authorized in writing by the department, if a fee is
- 7 charged for the use of the public boating access site, the fee
- 8 shall be the same as the fee rates set by the department.
- 9 (b) Unless otherwise provided in the grant agreement or
- 10 otherwise authorized in writing by the department, the public
- 11 boating access site and any facilities constructed for use in
- 12 conjunction with the public boating access site shall be reserved
- 13 by the grantee exclusively for the use or rental, on a daily basis,
- 14 of recreational watercraft.
- 15 (c) Unless otherwise provided in the grant agreement or
- 16 otherwise authorized in writing by the department, commercial
- 17 operations of any type shall not be permitted to regularly use the
- 18 public boating access site or any of the facilities constructed for
- 19 use in conjunction with the public boating access site.
- 20 (d) The public boating access site and any facilities
- 21 constructed for use in conjunction with that public boating access
- 22 site shall be open to the public at all times on equal and
- 23 reasonable terms.
- 24 (4) A local unit of government or a public college or
- 25 university that wishes to be considered for a grant under this
- 26 section shall submit an application to the department in a manner
- 27 prescribed by the department and containing the information

1 required by the department.
