THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 2. (1) As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Department" means the department of consumer and industry
- 3 services except that in reference to the regulation of private
- 4 security police, department means the department of state police

 - (b) "Licensee" means a sole proprietorship, firm, company,
 - partnership, limited liability company, or corporation licensed

- (c) "Private security guard" means an individual or an
 employee of an employer who offers, for hire, to provide protection
- 4 (d) "Private security police" means that part of a business
 5 organization or educational institution primarily responsible for
 6 the protection of property on the premises of the business
 7 organization.

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- (e) "Security alarm system" means a detection device or an 8 9 assembly of equipment and devices arranged to signal the presence 10 of a hazard requiring urgent attention or to which police are 11 expected to respond. Security alarm system includes any system that 12 can electronically cause an expected response by a law enforcement agency to a premises by means of the activation of an audible 13 14 signal, visible signal, electronic notification, or video signal, 15 or any combination of these signals, to a remote monitoring 16 location on or off the premises. Security alarm system does not 17 include a video signal that is not transmitted over a public 18 communication system or a fire alarm system or an alarm system that 19 monitors temperature, humidity, or other condition not directly
- 22 (f) "Security alarm system agent" means a person employed by a
 23 security alarm system contractor whose duties include the altering,
 24 installing, maintaining, moving, repairing, replacing, selling,
 25 servicing, monitoring, responding to, or causing others to respond
 26 to a security alarm system.

(g) "Security alarm system contractor" means a sole

- 1 proprietorship, firm, company, partnership, limited liability
- 2 company, or corporation engaged in the installation, maintenance,
- 3 alteration, monitoring, or servicing of security alarm systems or
- 4 who responds to a security alarm system. Security alarm system
- 5 contractor does not include a business that only sells or
- 6 manufactures security alarm systems unless the business services

- 8 or arranges for the monitoring of a security alarm system, or
- 9 responds to security alarm systems at the protected premises.
- 10 (h) "Security business" means a person or business entity

- 16 (iii) Private security police.
- 17 (2) All businesses furnishing security alarm systems for the
- 18 protection of persons and property, whose employees and security
- 19 technicians travel on public property and thoroughfares in the
- 20 pursuit of their duties, are subject to this act.
- 21 (3) A communications common carrier providing communications
- 22 channels under tariffs for the transmission of signals in
- 23 connection with an alarm system is not subject to this act.
- 24 (4) Railroad policemen appointed and commissioned under the
- 25 railroad code of 1993, 1993 PA 354, MCL 462.101 to 462.451, are
- 26 exempt from this act.
- 27 Sec. 29. (1) The licensure of private security police shall be

- 1 administered by the department. of state police. The application,
- 2 qualification, and enforcement provisions under this act apply to
- 3 private security police. except that the administration of those
- 4 provisions shall be performed by, and the payment of the
- 5 appropriate fees shall be paid to, the department of state police.
- 6 The director of the department may jointly promulgate rules with
- 7 the department of state police under the administrative procedures
- 8 act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, to facilitate the
- 9 bifurcation of authority described in this subsection.
- 10 (2) This act does not require licensing of any private
- 11 security guards employed for the purpose of protecting the property
- 12 and employees of their employer and generally maintaining security
- 13 for their employer. However, any person, firm, limited liability
- 14 company, business organization, educational institution, or
- 15 corporation maintaining a private security police organization may
- 16 voluntarily apply for licensure under this act. When a private
- 17 security police employer as described in this section provides the
- 18 employee with a pistol for the purpose of protecting the property
- 19 of the employer, the pistol shall be considered the property of the
- 20 employer and the employer shall retain custody of the pistol,
- 21 except during the actual working hours of the employee. All such
- 22 private security people shall be subject to the provisions of
- 23 sections 17(1) and 19(1).
- 24 Sec. 30. A private security police officer , as described in
- 25 section 29, who is properly licensed under this act has the
- 26 authority to arrest a person without a warrant as set forth for
- 27 public peace officers in section 15 of chapter IV of the code of

- 1 criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 764.15, when that private
- 2 security police officer is on the employer's premises. Such
- 3 authority is limited to his or her hours of employment as a private
- 4 security police officer and does not extend beyond the boundaries
- 5 of the property of the employer and while the private security
- 6 police officer is in the full uniform of the employer.
- 7 Enacting section 1. Section 31 of the private security
- 8 business and security alarm act, 1968 PA 330, MCL 338.1081, is
- 9 repealed.
