HOUSE BILL No. 6498

September 24, 2008, Introduced by Rep. Hune and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 1988 PA 466, entitled "Animal industry act,"

by amending section 14 (MCL 287.714), as amended by 2002 PA 458.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 14. (1) If the director determines that the control or 1 2 eradication of a disease or condition of livestock warrants entry 3 onto property where livestock or domestic animals are located, the 4 director shall order the entry onto property where livestock or 5 domestic animals are located and authorize seizure, slaughter, 6 destruction, or other disposition of individual livestock or 7 domestic animals or the entire herd, flock, or school. If the director has signed an order for the slaughter, destruction, or other disposition of livestock or domestic animals, the director

- 1 shall notify the attorney general and the house and senate
- 2 appropriations committees and the department of management and
- 3 budget on the issue of indemnity under this section. The director
- 4 may approve facilities and procedures for the orderly disposal of
- 5 animals, animal products, and animal feeds for the purpose of
- 6 controlling or preventing the spread of an infectious, contagious,
- 7 or toxicological disease. The director may select a site or method
- 8 for the disposal with the advice of the director of the department
- 9 of environmental quality.
- 10 (2) The director may, under rules promulgated by the
- 11 department, allow indemnification for the slaughter, destruction,
- 12 or other disposition of livestock or domestic animals due to
- 13 livestock diseases or toxicological contamination. If the director
- 14 has signed an order for the slaughter, destruction, or other
- 15 disposition of livestock or domestic animals, the owner may apply
- 16 for indemnification. The director shall appraise and inventory the
- 17 condemned livestock or domestic animals. The appraisals and
- 18 inventories shall be on forms approved by the director. The
- 19 director shall use agricultural pricing information from commercial
- 20 livestock or domestic animal auction markets and other livestock or
- 21 domestic animal market information as determined by the director to
- 22 determine the value of condemned livestock or domestic animals.
- 23 (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5),
- 24 indemnification for individual livestock or domestic animals within
- 25 a herd, flock, or school shall be based upon 100% of the fair
- 26 market value of that type of livestock or domestic animal on the
- 27 date of the appraisal and marketable for the purpose for which the

- 1 livestock or domestic animal was intended. , not to exceed
- 2 \$4,000.00 for each livestock or domestic animal. The appraisal
- 3 determination shall not delay the slaughter, destruction, or
- 4 disposition of the livestock or domestic animals. The
- 5 indemnification amount under this subsection shall include a
- 6 deduction for any compensation received, or to be received, from
- 7 any other source including, but not limited to, indemnification by
- 8 the United States department of agriculture, insurance, salvage
- 9 value, or any monetary value obtained to encourage disposal of
- 10 infected or exposed livestock or domestic animals in accordance
- 11 with a disease control or eradication program. The owner shall
- 12 furnish to the department all records indicating other sources of
- 13 indemnity. An affidavit signed by the owner attesting to the amount
- 14 of compensation for the livestock received or to be received from
- 15 any other source shall accompany the appraisal certificate before
- 16 indemnification under this section.
- 17 (4) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5),
- 18 indemnification for entire herd, flock, or school depopulations of
- 19 livestock or domestic animals shall be based upon 100% of the fair
- 20 market value of that type of animal on the date of the appraisal
- 21 and marketable for the purpose for which the livestock or domestic
- 22 animal was intended. , not to exceed an average of \$4,000.00 per
- 23 animal in the flock, herd, or school. The appraisal determination
- 24 shall not delay depopulation. The indemnification amount under this
- 25 section shall include a deduction for any compensation received, or
- 26 to be received, from any other source including, but not limited
- 27 to, indemnification by the United States department of agriculture,

- 1 insurance, salvage value, or any monetary value obtained to
- 2 encourage disposal of infected or exposed livestock or domestic
- 3 animals in accordance with a disease control or eradication
- 4 program. The owner shall furnish to the department all records
- 5 indicating other sources of indemnity. An affidavit signed by the
- 6 owner attesting to the amount of compensation for the livestock or
- 7 domestic animals received, or to be received, from any other source
- 8 shall accompany the appraisal certificate prior to indemnification
- 9 under this section.
- 10 (5) The department may provide for indemnity pursuant to this
- 11 section not to exceed \$100,000.00 per order, from any line item in
- 12 the annual budget for the department in the applicable fiscal year.
- 13 Any agreement greater than \$100,000.00 entered into between the
- 14 department and an owner of livestock shall contain a provision
- 15 indicating that, notwithstanding the terms of the agreement,
- 16 indemnification shall be subject to specific appropriations by the
- 17 legislature and not be paid from department funds.
- 18 (6) Acceptance of compensation under this act constitutes a
- 19 full and complete release of any claim the owner has against the
- 20 state of Michigan, its departments, agencies, officers, employees,
- 21 agents, and contractors to the extent these persons were acting on
- 22 behalf of the state, within the scope of their employment with the
- 23 state or under the direction of the state, its departments,
- 24 agencies, officers, or employees, arising out of testing, purchase,
- 25 removal, slaughter, destruction, and other disposition of the
- 26 owner's animals.
- **27** (7) The right to indemnity from the state for animals

- 1 condemned and ordered slaughtered, destroyed, or otherwise disposed
- 2 of by the director applies only to native livestock and native
- 3 domestic animals. Indemnification shall not apply to livestock or
- 4 domestic animals determined by the department to be imported
- 5 without meeting import requirements such as official interstate
- 6 health certificate or official interstate certificate of veterinary
- 7 inspection, required testing, required vaccination, or for
- 8 livestock or domestic animals determined by the department to have
- 9 been illegally moved within this state. An owner is not entitled to
- 10 indemnity from the state for an animal that comes into the
- 11 possession of the owner with the owner's knowledge that the animal
- 12 is diseased or is suspected of having been exposed to an
- 13 infectious, contagious, or toxicological disease. In addition, the
- 14 director shall not indemnify an owner for animals that have been
- 15 exposed to an animal that comes in to the possession of the owner
- 16 with the owner's knowledge that the animal is diseased or is
- 17 suspected of having been exposed to an infectious, contagious, or
- 18 toxicological disease.
- 19 (8) A premises that has been depopulated shall be cleaned and
- 20 disinfected as prescribed by the director.
- 21 (9) Repopulation of the premises, except as approved by the
- 22 director, shall not confer eligibility for future indemnity under
- 23 this section.
- 24 (10) The department may cooperate and coordinate with the
- 25 secretary of the United States department of agriculture or the
- 26 secretary's authorized representative or other governmental
- 27 departments or agencies regarding indemnification under this

- 1 section.
- 2 (11) Not less than annually, within 60 days after the close of
- 3 the fiscal year, the director shall make a written report to the
- 4 standing committees of the house of representatives and senate
- 5 having jurisdiction on agricultural and farming issues. The report
- 6 will include the following:
- 7 (a) The amount expended by the department for bovine
- 8 tuberculosis eradication during the preceding fiscal year.
- 9 (b) An explanation of the expenditures made by the department
- 10 for bovine tuberculosis eradication during the preceding fiscal
- 11 year.
- 12 (c) The status of bovine tuberculosis eradication efforts in
- 13 Michigan.
- 14 (12) Not less than annually, within 60 days after the close of
- 15 the fiscal year, the director of the department of natural
- 16 resources shall make a written report to the standing committees of
- 17 the house of representatives and senate having jurisdiction on
- 18 agricultural and farming issues. The report will include the
- **19** following:
- 20 (a) The amount expended by the department of natural resources
- 21 for bovine tuberculosis eradication during the preceding fiscal
- **22** year.
- 23 (b) An explanation of the expenditures made by the department
- 24 of natural resources for bovine tuberculosis eradication during the
- 25 preceding fiscal year.
