## **SENATE BILL No. 85**

January 25, 2007, Introduced by Senators McMANUS, ALLEN, GARCIA, HARDIMAN, RICHARDVILLE and CROPSEY and referred to the Committee on Families and Human Services.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled
"Public health code,"
by amending sections 16901, 16903, and 16905 (MCL 333.16901,
333.16903, and 333.16905), section 16901 as added by 1995 PA 126
and sections 16903 and 16905 as amended by 2006 PA 388.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 16901. (1) As used in this part:

- (a) "Advertise" means issuing or ordering the printing or distribution of a card, sign, or device or causing, permitting, or allowing a sign or marking on or in a building or structure, or placing material in a newspaper, magazine, or directory, or on radio or television. ADVERTISE DOES NOT INCLUDE UNPAID PUBLIC
- AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS OR EDUCATIONAL OR PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS BY

- 1 INDIVIDUALS EXEMPTED FROM THIS PART BY SECTION 16905.
- 2 (b) "Marriage and family therapist" means an individual
- 3 licensed under this article to engage in the practice of marriage
- 4 and family therapy.
- 5 (c) "Practice of marriage and family therapy" means the
- 6 providing of guidance, testing, discussions, therapy, instruction,
- 7 or advice that is intended to avoid, eliminate, relieve, manage, or
- 8 resolve INDIVIDUAL, marital, or family conflict or discord, to
- 9 create, improve, or restore INDIVIDUAL, marital, or family harmony,
- 10 or to prepare couples for marriage. Practice of marriage and family
- 11 therapy does not include the administration and interpretation of
- 12 psychological tests except for those tests that are consistent with
- 13 the individual's education and training and with the code of ethics
- 14 for licensed marriage and family therapists.
- 15 (2) In addition to the definitions of this part, article 1
- 16 contains general definitions and principles of construction
- 17 applicable to all articles in this code and part 161 contains
- 18 definitions applicable to this part.
- 19 Sec. 16903. (1) An individual licensed under this part as a
- 20 marriage and family therapist shall use only the title "licensed
- 21 marriage and family therapist" or "licensed marriage counselor" or
- 22 the abbreviation "l.m.f.t." in representing his or her services in
- 23 the practice of marriage and family therapy to the public.
- 24 (2) Unless exempt under section <del>16905(3)</del> **16905(4)**, only an
- 25 individual licensed under this part may advertise that he or she
- 26 offers marriage and family therapy; marriage or family counseling
- 27 service or advice; marriage or family guidance service or advice;

- 1 marriage or family relations service or advice; marriage or family
- 2 problems service or advice; marriage or family relations advice or
- 3 assistance; service in the alleviation of a marital or family
- 4 problem; or service of similar import or effect that is included in
- 5 the practice of marriage and family therapy. THIS PART DOES NOT
- 6 PROHIBIT AN INDIVIDUAL EXEMPTED BY SECTION 16905 FROM ISSUING
- 7 UNPAID PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS OR EDUCATIONAL OR PROMOTIONAL
- 8 MATERIALS.
- 9 (3) The board may grant a limited license to an individual who
- 10 has met the requirements of section 16909(a) and (b) 16909(1)(A)
- 11 AND (B) in order to permit that individual to obtain the experience
- 12 required under section  $\frac{16909(c)}{16909(1)}$  (C). The board shall not
- 13 renew a limited license for more than 6 years. A limited licensee
- 14 shall do all of the following:
- 15 (a) Use only the title "limited licensed marriage and family
- therapist" or "limited licensed marriage counselor".
- 17 (b) Not represent that he or she is engaged in the independent
- 18 practice of marriage and family therapy.
- 19 (c) Practice only under the supervision of a fully licensed
- 20 marriage and family therapist.
- 21 (d) Confine his or her practice to an organized health care
- 22 setting or other arrangement approved by the board.
- 23 (4) An individual engaged in obtaining experience required
- 24 under section 16909(b) 16909(1)(B) may use the title "marriage and
- 25 family therapist intern" or "marriage and family therapist trainee"
- 26 during the training period. The board shall not require an
- 27 individual obtaining experience required under section 16909(b)

- 1 16909(1)(B) to hold a limited license.
- 2 (5) The following words, titles, or letters or a combination
- 3 thereof, with or without qualifying words or phrases, are
- 4 restricted in use only to those individuals authorized under this
- 5 part to use the terms and in a way prescribed by this part:
- 6 "marriage advisor" or "marriage consultant"; "family counselor",
- 7 "family advisor", "family therapist", or "family consultant";
- 8 "family guidance counselor", "family guidance advisor", or "family
- 9 guidance consultant"; "marriage guidance counselor", "marriage
- 10 guidance advisor", or "marriage guidance consultant"; "family
- 11 relations counselor"; "marriage relations counselor", "marriage
- 12 relations advisor", or "marriage relations consultant"; or "marital
- 13 counselor" or "marital therapist".
- 14 Sec. 16905. (1) This part does not apply to an individual
- 15 engaged in the practice of social work as defined in part 185, in
- 16 the course of employment with a governmental agency or a reputable
- 17 social service agency regularly providing social work services as
- 18 an agency.
- 19 (2) This part does not apply to an ordained cleric or other
- 20 religious practitioner who is employed by or working under the
- 21 authority of an organization exempt from taxation under section
- 22 501(c)(3) of the internal revenue code of 1986, 26 USC 501, if the
- 23 advice or counsel given by the cleric or other religious
- 24 practitioner is incidental to his or her duties as a cleric or
- 25 other religious practitioner, and PROVIDES ADVICE, GUIDANCE, OR
- 26 TEACHING BASED ON HIS OR HER RELIGIOUS BELIEFS, CREEDS, OR
- 27 DOCTRINES if the cleric or other religious practitioner does not

- 1 hold himself or herself out to the public as a marriage and family
- 2 therapist licensed under this article or use 1 or more of the
- 3 titles listed in section 16903 and if no fee or donation is exacted
- 4 for the service. THIS PART DOES NOT PROHIBIT AN ORDAINED CLERIC OR
- 5 OTHER RELIGIOUS PRACTITIONER FROM ACCEPTING A VOLUNTARY
- 6 CONTRIBUTION.
- 7 (3) THIS PART DOES NOT APPLY TO AN ORDAINED CLERIC OR OTHER
- 8 RELIGIOUS PRACTITIONER WHO HAS BEEN AUTHORIZED BY LAW TO OFFICIATE
- 9 AT A MARRIAGE IF THAT PERSON PROVIDES, IN WRITING, AN AFFIDAVIT
- 10 CLEARLY STATING THAT HE OR SHE IS A MEMBER OF THE CLERGY OR A
- 11 RELIGIOUS PRACTITIONER, IS NOT A MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPIST
- 12 LICENSED UNDER THIS ARTICLE, AND DOES NOT USE 1 OR MORE OF THE
- 13 TITLES LISTED IN SECTION 16903, AND THAT THE ADVICE, GUIDANCE, OR
- 14 TEACHING IS BASED ON THAT INDIVIDUAL'S RELIGIOUS BELIEFS, CREEDS,
- 15 OR DOCTRINES.
- 16 (4) (3)—This part does not apply to a physician licensed under
- 17 this article who has completed an accredited psychiatric residency
- 18 program approved by the Michigan board of medicine or to a
- 19 psychologist fully licensed under this article, if both of the
- 20 following circumstances exist:
- 21 (a) The individual is practicing his or her profession in a
- 22 manner consistent with his or her education and training and is
- 23 practicing in a manner consistent with the code of ethics of that
- 24 profession.
- 25 (b) The individual does not hold himself or herself out to the
- 26 public as a marriage and family therapist licensed under this
- 27 article or use any of the titles listed in section 16903 for

- 1 advertising purposes. However, this THIS subdivision does not
- 2 prohibit the individual from advertising under a telephone or other
- 3 business directory listing that uses those titles if the individual
- 4 discloses in the listing, in an unabbreviated fashion, the
- 5 profession in which he or she is licensed.
- 6 (5) (4) This part does not limit an individual in, or prevent
- 7 an individual from, the practice of a statutorily regulated
- 8 profession or occupation if services to families, couples, or
- 9 subsystems of families are part of the services provided by that
- 10 profession or occupation, and if the individual does not hold
- 11 himself or herself out to the public as a marriage and family
- 12 therapist licensed under this article or use 1 or more of the
- 13 titles listed in section 16903. As used in this subsection,
- 14 "statutorily regulated profession or occupation" means an
- 15 occupation or profession regulated by statute that includes, but is
- 16 not limited to, all of the following: a physician, attorney, social
- 17 worker, social service technician, fully licensed psychologist,
- 18 limited licensed psychologist, temporary limited licensed
- 19 psychologist, licensed professional counselor, limited licensed
- 20 counselor, or school counselor.
