A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," (MCL 324.101 to 324.90106) by adding part 27.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 PART 27 ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE ASSISTANCE
- 2 SEC. 2701. AS USED IN THIS PART:
- 3 (A) "ADVISORY PANEL" MEANS THE SMALL BUSINESS ENVIRONMENTAL
 4 COMPLIANCE ADVISORY PANEL CREATED IN SECTION 2707.
- 5 (B) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL
- 7 (C) "ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENT" MEANS A REQUIREMENT OF A PART
- 8 OF THIS ACT ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OR A RULE PROMULGATED OR
 - ORDER OR PERMIT ISSUED THEREUNDER.

- 1 (D) "SMALL BUSINESS" MEANS A BUSINESS THAT MEETS ALL OF THE
- 2 FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:
- 3 (i) IS INDEPENDENTLY OWNED AND OPERATED.
- 4 (ii) IS NOT DOMINANT IN ITS FIELD OF OPERATION AS DESCRIBED IN
- 5 13 CFR 121.102.
- 6 (iii) MEETS THE SMALL BUSINESS SIZE STANDARDS SET FORTH IN 13
- 7 CFR 121.201.
- 8 (E) "SMALL BUSINESS ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE ASSISTANCE
- 9 PROGRAM" OR "ASSISTANCE PROGRAM" MEANS A PROGRAM OF THE DEPARTMENT
- 10 IMPLEMENTING THIS PART.
- 11 (F) "VIOLATION" MEANS A VIOLATION OF AN ENVIRONMENTAL
- 12 REOUIREMENT.
- 13 SEC. 2703. (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ASSIST SMALL BUSINESSES IN
- 14 DETERMINING BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 15 (A) APPLICABLE ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS.
- 16 (B) THE PROCEDURES FOR OBTAINING PERMITS IN AN EFFICIENT AND
- 17 TIMELY MANNER.
- 18 (2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PUBLISH 1 OR MORE GUIDES TO ASSIST
- 19 SMALL BUSINESSES IN COMPLYING WITH ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS. THE
- 20 DEPARTMENT SHALL DESIGNATE THE PUBLICATIONS AS SMALL BUSINESS
- 21 COMPLIANCE GUIDES. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL COOPERATE WITH ASSOCIATIONS

- 2 (B) EXPLAIN THE ACTIONS A SMALL BUSINESS IN THAT GROUP OR
- 3 CLASS IS REQUIRED TO TAKE TO COMPLY WITH ENVIRONMENTAL
- 4 REQUIREMENTS.
- 5 (C) USE PLAIN LANGUAGE LIKELY TO BE UNDERSTOOD BY AFFECTED
- 6 SMALL BUSINESSES.
- 7 (3) BEGINNING IN 2008, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PUBLISH AT LEAST 2
- 8 GUIDES ANNUALLY UNTIL ALL THE GUIDES NECESSARY TO SATISFY THE
- 9 REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (2) ARE PUBLISHED. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
- 10 REEVALUATE A GUIDE EVERY 5 YEARS AFTER PUBLICATION AND REVISE THE
- 11 GUIDE IF NECESSARY. NOT LESS THAN 30 DAYS BEFORE PUBLISHING A GUIDE

- 17 MAY BE CONSIDERED AS EVIDENCE OF THE REASONABLENESS OR
- 18 APPROPRIATENESS OF ANY PROPOSED SANCTIONS.
- 19 SEC. 2705. (1) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (3), THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
- 20 WAIVE CIVIL FINES AND OTHER CIVIL SANCTIONS ASSESSED AGAINST A
- 21 SMALL BUSINESS FOR A VIOLATION IF THE SMALL BUSINESS MEETS ALL OF
- 22 THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:
- 23 (A) THE SMALL BUSINESS DISCLOSES THE VIOLATION TO THE
- 24 DEPARTMENT WITHIN 21 DAYS AFTER THE SMALL BUSINESS DISCOVERS THE
- 25 VIOLATION. THE SMALL BUSINESS MAY REQUEST AN EXTENSION OF THIS
- 26 DEADLINE FROM THE DIRECTOR.
- 27 (B) THE DISCLOSURE IS VOLUNTARY. VOLUNTARY DISCLOSURE DOES NOT

- 1 INCLUDE EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 2 (i) DISCLOSURE OF A MONITORING OR SAMPLING RESULT IF THE
- 3 DISCLOSURE IS REQUIRED BY A LAW, PERMIT, JUDICIAL OR ADMINISTRATIVE
- 4 ORDER, OR CONSENT AGREEMENT.
- 5 (ii) DISCLOSURE OF A VIOLATION DISCOVERED THROUGH AN
- 6 INFORMATION REQUEST OR INSPECTION OR REPORTED BY A MEMBER OF THE
- 7 PUBLIC.
- 8 (C) THE SMALL BUSINESS CORRECTS THE VIOLATION PROMPTLY AND
- 9 WITHIN 180 DAYS AFTER DISCLOSURE OR, IF THE CORRECTION INCLUDES
- 10 POLLUTION PREVENTION CHANGES, WITHIN 360 DAYS AFTER DISCLOSURE. IF
- 11 THE VIOLATION IS FAILURE TO OBTAIN A PERMIT, THE VIOLATION IS
- 12 CONSIDERED TO BE CORRECTED WHEN THE SMALL BUSINESS SUBMITS AN
- 13 ADMINISTRATIVELY COMPLETE PERMIT APPLICATION.
- 14 (2) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (3), IF THE REQUIREMENTS OF
- 15 SUBSECTION (1)(A) TO (C) ARE MET, BUT THE VIOLATION RESULTED IN A
- 16 SUBSTANTIAL ECONOMIC BENEFIT GIVING THE SMALL BUSINESS A CLEAR
- 17 ADVANTAGE OVER ITS BUSINESS COMPETITORS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL WAIVE
- 18 CIVIL FINES AND OTHER CIVIL SANCTIONS ASSESSED AGAINST THE SMALL
- 19 BUSINESS TO THE EXTENT THAT THE AMOUNT OF THE FINES AND THE LIKELY
- 20 COSTS TO THE SMALL BUSINESS OF THE OTHER CIVIL SANCTIONS EXCEED THE
- 21 AMOUNT OF THE ECONOMIC BENEFIT.
- 22 (3) SUBSECTIONS (1) AND (2) DO NOT APPLY IF ANY OF THE
- 23 FOLLOWING APPLY:
- 24 (A) THE VIOLATION CAUSED ACTUAL SERIOUS HARM TO PUBLIC HEALTH,
- 25 SAFETY, OR THE ENVIRONMENT.
- 26 (B) THE VIOLATION MAY PRESENT AN IMMINENT AND SUBSTANTIAL
- 27 ENDANGERMENT TO PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, OR THE ENVIRONMENT.

- 1 (C) THE FACILITY HAS RECEIVED A WARNING LETTER OR NOTICE OF
- 2 VIOLATION, OR HAS BEEN SUBJECT TO A CITIZEN SUIT, FOR A VIOLATION
- 3 OF THE SAME ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENT WITHIN THE PAST 3 YEARS.
- 4 (D) THE FACILITY HAS BEEN THE SUBJECT OF 2 OR MORE ENFORCEMENT
- 5 ACTIONS, FOR VIOLATIONS IN THE PAST 5 YEARS.
- 6 SEC. 2707. (1) THE SMALL BUSINESS ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE
- 7 ADVISORY PANEL IS CREATED WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT.
- 8 (2) THE ADVISORY PANEL SHALL BE BROADLY REPRESENTATIVE OF
- 9 REGULATED SMALL BUSINESSES. THE ADVISORY PANEL SHALL CONSIST OF ALL
- 10 OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 11 (A) THE MEMBERS OF THE SMALL BUSINESS CLEAN AIR COMPLIANCE
- 12 ADVISORY PANEL CREATED IN SECTION 5708.
- 13 (B) FOUR ADDITIONAL MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR.
- 14 (3) A MEMBER OF THE ADVISORY PANEL APPOINTED UNDER SUBSECTION
- 15 (2)(B) SHALL SERVE FOR A TERM OF 4 YEARS, OR UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS
- 16 APPOINTED, WHICHEVER IS LATER. HOWEVER, OF THE MEMBERS FIRST
- 17 APPOINTED UNDER SUBSECTION (2) (B), 1 MEMBER SHALL SERVE FOR A TERM
- 18 OF 3 YEARS, 1 MEMBER FOR A TERM OF 2 YEARS, AND 1 MEMBER FOR A TERM
- 19 OF 1 YEAR.
- 20 (4) IF A VACANCY OCCURS ON THE ADVISORY PANEL AMONG THE
- 21 MEMBERS APPOINTED UNDER SUBSECTION (2)(B), THE GOVERNOR SHALL MAKE
- 22 AN APPOINTMENT FOR THE UNEXPIRED TERM.
- 23 (5) THE FIRST MEETING OF THE ADVISORY PANEL SHALL BE CALLED BY
- 24 THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE SMALL BUSINESS CLEAN AIR COMPLIANCE ADVISORY
- 25 PANEL WITHIN 90 DAYS OF THE APPOINTMENT OF ALL ADVISORY PANEL
- 26 MEMBERS UNDER SUBSECTION (2)(B). AT THE FIRST MEETING, THE ADVISORY
- 27 PANEL SHALL ELECT FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS A CHAIRPERSON AND OTHER

- 1 OFFICERS AS IT CONSIDERS NECESSARY OR APPROPRIATE.
- 2 (6) A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY PANEL
- 3 CONSTITUTES A QUORUM FOR THE TRANSACTION OF BUSINESS AT A MEETING
- 4 OF THE ADVISORY PANEL. A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS PRESENT AND
- 5 SERVING ARE REQUIRED FOR OFFICIAL ACTION OF THE ADVISORY PANEL.
- 6 (7) MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY PANEL SHALL SERVE WITHOUT
- 7 COMPENSATION. HOWEVER, MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY PANEL MAY BE
- 8 REIMBURSED FOR THEIR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE
- 9 PERFORMANCE OF THEIR OFFICIAL DUTIES AS MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY
- 10 PANEL.
- 11 SEC. 2709. THE ADVISORY PANEL SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 12 (A) CONSULT WITH THE SMALL BUSINESS CLEAN AIR OMBUDSMAN
- 13 APPOINTED UNDER SECTION 5703 AND THE HEAD OF THE SMALL BUSINESS
- 14 ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM TO PLAN THE WORK OF THE
- 15 PANEL, INCLUDING THE FREQUENCY OF MEETINGS, AGENDA ITEMS, AND
- 16 REPORTS TO BE ISSUED BY THE PANEL.
- 17 (B) PREPARE ADVISORY REPORTS CONCERNING ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 18 (i) THE DIFFICULTIES ENCOUNTERED BY SMALL BUSINESS IN THE
- 19 ENFORCEMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS AND THE DEGREE AND
- 20 SEVERITY OF THAT ENFORCEMENT.
- 21 (ii) THE AVERAGE COSTS OF DIFFERENT SECTORS OF SMALL BUSINESSES
- 22 IN COMPLYING WITH ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS OF THIS STATE.
- 23 (iii) THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.
- 24 (iv) THE COSTS OF OPERATING THE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.
- 25 (C) REVIEW INFORMATION PREPARED BY THE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR
- 26 SMALL BUSINESSES TO ENSURE THAT THE INFORMATION IS IN PLAIN
- 27 LANGUAGE LIKELY TO BE UNDERSTOOD BY AFFECTED SMALL BUSINESSES.

- 1 (D) UTILIZE THE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM STAFF TO ACT AS STAFF TO
- 2 DEVELOP AND DISSEMINATE THE WORK PRODUCT OF THE ADVISORY PANEL.
- 3 (E) PROVIDE TO THE GOVERNOR, THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE OF
- 4 REPRESENTATIVES, THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 5 LABOR AND ECONOMIC GROWTH COPIES OF ADVISORY REPORTS PREPARED BY
- 6 THE ADVISORY PANEL. IN ADDITION, THE REPORTS SHALL BE MADE
- 7 AVAILABLE TO ANY OTHER PERSON UPON REQUEST AND SHALL BE PUBLISHED
- 8 ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE.
- 9 SEC. 2711. (1) ANY RECORD OR OTHER INFORMATION PREPARED,
- 10 OWNED, USED, IN THE POSSESSION OF, OR RETAINED BY THE ASSISTANCE
- 11 PROGRAM THAT CONCERNS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM INQUIRIES, DISCLOSURES, OR
- 12 ACTIVITIES AND THAT IDENTIFIES OR DESCRIBES AN INDIVIDUAL FACILITY
- 13 OR OPERATION IS CONFIDENTIAL AND EXEMPT FROM DISCLOSURE UNDER THE
- 14 FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 TO 15.246,
- 15 UNLESS THE RECORD OR OTHER INFORMATION IS RELEVANT TO AN EXISTING
- 16 CLEAR AND IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC HEALTH OR ENVIRONMENT.
- 17 (2) BY JULY 1 OF EACH YEAR, BEGINNING IN 2008, THE DEPARTMENT
- 18 SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR, THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE OF
- 19 REPRESENTATIVES, THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE, AND THE CHAIRPERSONS
- 20 OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES STANDING COMMITTEES ON
- 21 APPROPRIATIONS. THE REPORT SHALL CONTAIN, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO,
- 22 ALL OF THE FOLLOWING FOR THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR:
- 23 (A) THE NUMBER AND TYPES OF INQUIRIES THE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
- 24 RECEIVED.
- 25 (B) THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.
- 26 (C) THE NUMBER OF SMALL BUSINESSES THAT VOLUNTARILY DISCLOSED
- 27 VIOLATIONS.
