June 7, 2007, Introduced by Senators McMANUS, JELINEK and SCHAUER and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"
by amending section 73102 (MCL 324.73102), as amended by 1998 PA
546.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 73102. (1) Except as provided in subsection (4), a person
- 2 shall not enter or remain upon the property of another person,
- 3 other than farm property or a wooded area connected to farm
- 4 property, to engage in any recreational activity or trapping on
- 5 that property without the consent of the owner or his or her lessee
- 6 or agent, if either ANY of the following circumstances exists
- 7 EXIST:
- 3 (a) The property is fenced or enclosed and is maintained in
- such a manner as to exclude intruders.

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- 1 (b) The property is posted in a conspicuous manner against
- 2 entry . The BY 1 OF THE FOLLOWING MEANS:
- 3 (i) BY POSTING SIGNS, THE minimum letter height on the posting
- 4 signs WHICH shall be 1 inch. Each posting sign shall be not less
- 5 than 50 square inches, and the signs shall be spaced to enable a
- 6 person to observe not less than 1 sign at any point of entry upon
- 7 the property.
- 8 (ii) BY PLACING IDENTIFYING PURPLE PAINT MARKS ON TREES OR
- 9 POSTS AROUND THE PROPERTY, USING PAINT APPROVED FOR THAT PURPOSE BY
- 10 THE DEPARTMENT. EACH PAINT MARK SHALL BE A VERTICAL LINE AT LEAST 8
- 11 INCHES LONG, AND THE BOTTOM OF THE PAINT MARK SHALL BE BETWEEN 3
- 12 FEET AND 5 FEET ABOVE THE GROUND. THE PAINT MARKS SHALL BE NOT MORE
- 13 THAN 100 FEET APART AND SHALL BE PLACED SO THAT THEY ARE READILY
- 14 VISIBLE TO PERSONS APPROACHING THE PROPERTY.
- 15 (2) Except as provided in subsection (4), a person shall not
- 16 enter or remain upon farm property or a wooded area connected to
- 17 farm property for any recreational activity or trapping without the
- 18 consent of the owner or his or her lessee or agent, whether or not
- 19 the farm property or wooded area connected to farm property is
- 20 fenced, enclosed, or posted.
- 21 (3) On fenced or posted property or farm property, a fisherman
- 22 wading or floating a navigable public stream may, without written
- 23 or oral consent, enter upon property within the clearly defined
- 24 banks of the stream or, without damaging farm products, walk a
- 25 route as closely proximate to the clearly defined bank as possible
- 26 when necessary to avoid a natural or artificial hazard or
- 27 obstruction, including, but not limited to, a dam, deep hole, or a

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- 1 fence or other exercise of ownership by the riparian owner.
- 2 (4) A person other than a person possessing a firearm may,
- 3 unless previously prohibited in writing or orally by the property
- 4 owner or his or her lessee or agent, enter on foot upon the
- 5 property of another person for the sole purpose of retrieving a
- 6 hunting dog. The person shall not remain on the property beyond the
- 7 reasonable time necessary to retrieve the dog. In an action under
- 8 section 73109 or 73110, the burden of showing that the property
- 9 owner or his or her lessee or agent previously prohibited entry
- 10 under this subsection is on the plaintiff or prosecuting attorney,
- 11 respectively.
- 12 (5) Consent to enter or remain upon the property of another
- 13 person pursuant to this section may be given orally or in writing.
- 14 The consent may establish conditions for entering or remaining upon
- 15 that property. Unless prohibited in the written consent, a written
- 16 consent may be amended or revoked orally. If the owner or his or
- 17 her lessee or agent requires all persons entering or remaining upon
- 18 the property to have written consent, the presence of the person on
- 19 the property without written consent is prima facie evidence of
- 20 unlawful entry.
- 21 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 22 unless Senate Bill No.____ or House Bill No.____ (request no.
- 23 03592'07) of the 94th Legislature is enacted into law.
