

# SENATE BILL No. 1614

November 6, 2008, Introduced by Senator BASHAM and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1987 PA 231, entitled

"An act to create a transportation economic development fund in the state treasury; to prescribe the uses of and distributions from this fund; to create the office of economic development and to prescribe its powers and duties; to prescribe the powers and duties of the state transportation department, state transportation commission, and certain other bodies; and to permit the issuance of certain bonds,"

by amending section 11 (MCL 247.911), as amended by 2007 PA 168.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

SENATE BILL No. 1614

1           Sec. 11. (1) Bonds may be issued as authorized by the  
2   commission for the purpose of funding projects under this act in  
3   the manner provided in sections 18b and 18k of 1951 PA 51, MCL  
4   247.668b and 247.668k, and in accordance with the adopted  
5   policies of the commission. Bonds shall not be committed for any  
6   project under this act until the requirements set forth under

1 section 3(1) have been satisfied.

2 (2) Projects shall be funded in the following categories in  
3 the following amounts:

4 (a) The first \$5,000,000.00 of the fund shall be distributed  
5 each fiscal year to each qualified county in a percentage amount  
6 equal to the same percentage amount that the number of acres of  
7 commercial forest, national park, and national lakeshore land in  
8 each qualified county bears to the total number of acres of  
9 commercial forest, national park, and national lakeshore land in  
10 all qualified counties in this state. Revenue distributed under  
11 this subdivision shall be used for the construction or  
12 reconstruction of roads.

13 (b) The next \$2,500,000.00 of the fund shall be distributed  
14 each fiscal year for improvements to roads and streets that are  
15 eligible for federal aid in cities and villages having a  
16 population of 5,000 or greater within rural counties.

17 (3) Of the balance remaining after funding projects pursuant  
18 to subsection (2), projects shall be funded in the categories  
19 described in section 9 based on the following percentages:

20 (a) ~~Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, 50%~~  
21 **40%** for economic development road projects in any of the targeted  
22 industries. ~~For the period beginning October 1, 2006 and~~  
23 ~~continuing through September 30, 2007, allocations made to~~  
24 ~~targeted industries under this subdivision shall be reduced by~~  
25 ~~\$6,000,000.00.~~

26 (b) ~~25%~~**20%** for projects to reduce congestion on county  
27 primary and city major streets within urban counties including

1 advanced traffic management systems. The funds shall be  
 2 distributed to counties with populations in excess of 400,000 in  
 3 accordance with the following formula:

4	<u>Population</u>	<u>Percentage of Funds</u>
5	1,750,000 or more	16%
6	1,000,000 to 1,750,000	40%
7	600,000 to 1,000,000	20%
8	400,000 to 600,000	24%

9 When 2 or more counties occupy the same category, the funds  
 10 shall be divided equally.

11 Projects funded under this category shall be used for the  
 12 widening of county primary roads or city major streets or for  
 13 advanced traffic management systems in eligible counties.

14 (c) ~~25%~~ 20% for development projects within rural counties.  
 15 These revenues shall be distributed for the improvement of rural  
 16 primary roads in rural counties and major streets in cities and  
 17 villages with a population of 5,000 or less. Funds distributed  
 18 under this subdivision shall be allocated by the commission to  
 19 the regional rural task force areas defined in section 12a in the  
 20 same proportion that the rural primary mileage of the regional  
 21 rural task force area bears to the total rural primary mileage of  
 22 all counties. Each rural county shall be credited with an  
 23 allocation in the proportion that the county's rural primary  
 24 mileage is to the total rural primary mileage of those rural  
 25 counties within the same regional rural task force area. Projects  
 26 funded under this subdivision shall be limited to upgrading rural

1 primary roads and major streets to create an all-season road  
2 network.

3 (D) 20% FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO ROADS AND STREETS IN COUNTIES,  
4 CITIES, AND VILLAGES THAT HAVE ADOPTED WEIGHT LIMITS FOR MOTOR  
5 CARRIERS THAT DO NOT EXCEED THE FEDERAL WEIGHT LIMITS FOR MOTOR  
6 CARRIERS.

7 (4) The obligation authority for any federal funds allocated  
8 under section 10 of 1951 PA 51, MCL 247.660, shall be distributed  
9 equally among urban task forces and regional rural task forces  
10 according to the distribution formula outlined in subsection  
11 ~~(3)(e)~~-(3) (B) and ~~(d)~~-(C). An additional 1.5% of the obligation  
12 authority for federal funds identified in section 10 of 1951 PA  
13 51, MCL 247.660, shall be distributed among the regional rural  
14 task forces according to the distribution formula outlined in  
15 subsection ~~(3)(d)~~-(3) (C). These funds shall be obligated and used  
16 consistent with section 10 of 1951 PA 51, MCL 247.660.
