FY 2009-10 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS

Summary: As Passed by the Senate Senate Bill 797 (S-1) as Amended

OVERVIEW

In a letter dated June 2, 2010, the State Budget Office (SBO) recommended negative adjustments to FY 2009-10 appropriations for all state departments to reflect estimated savings from state employee concessions. The table below shows recommended adjustments by department and fund source, which are incorporated into Senate Bill 797 (S-1). Gross savings total \$46.6 million; GF/GP savings total \$23.4 million.

The savings reflected in the bill are the result of the following employee concession measures:

- Banked Leave Time number of hours varies by bargaining unit; 47,587 employees affected.
- Furlough Days 5 days for 3,396 employees.
- Elimination of overtime paid for Department of Corrections employees who attend pre-shift meetings.

In addition to the savings included in this bill, the SBO anticipates lapsing \$5.1 million Gross and \$2.3 million GF/GP in professional development funds. As part of the UAW's negotiated concessions, they agreed to forfeit \$5.1 million in available professional development funds, which are collected pursuant to their collective bargaining agreement and are used to pay for various training programs for employees.

Additionally, Senate Bill 797 (S-1) includes supplemental appropriations for certain time-sensitive items in the Department of Human Services budget—including federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funding for food assistance costs—and disaster assistance funding in the Department of State Police budget. Those adjustments are summarized in the tables on page 2 of this document.

The total net impact of all appropriation adjustments contained in the Senate-passed version of Senate Bill 797 is an increase of \$75.3 million in Gross appropriations and a reduction of \$23.1 million in GF/GP appropriations in the FY 2009-10 state budget.
