Overview

The State Board of Education is an eight-member elected board constitutionally mandated to provide leadership and supervision for public education in Michigan. The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is the administrative arm of the Board charged with implementing state and federal educational mandates and administering programs. Major responsibilities of the MDE include developing and overseeing the K-12 school system, certifying teachers, disbursing funds to educational organizations, and providing technical assistance to school districts.

<u>Senate</u> does not include library functions in the DOE budget but instead continues fund them as part of DHAL.

Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2008-09

Sec. 213. Hiring Freeze – RETAINED
Imposes a hiring freeze and prohibits the department from filling civil service positions but allows the State Budget Director to grant exceptions to the hiring freeze. Executive and House delete. Senate restores this section. Conference Committee concurs with Senate.

Sec. 215. Professional Development Travel – RETAINED

Prohibits the travel of more than one employee to a specific out-of-state professional development conference or training seminar unless it is funded through federal or private funds and requires more than one employee to attend. <u>Executive</u> and House delete. Senate restores this section. Conference Committee concurs with Senate.

Sec. 222. Policy Changes, Preparation of Regulatory Plans and Rule Promulgation – RETAINED

Requires a report of policy changes made to implement enacted legislation; prohibits MDE from spending funds to prepare regulatory plans or promulgate rules that fail to reduce the disproportionate economic impact on small businesses. <u>Executive</u> and <u>House</u> delete. <u>Senate</u> restores this section. <u>Conference Committee</u> concurs with Senate.

Sec. 223. FTE Bi-Monthly Reports - NEW

<u>House</u> adds language requiring the department to report every other month on FTEs by civil service classification. <u>Senate</u> deletes this section. <u>Conference Committee</u> concurs with House but amends reporting requirements to quarterly.

Sec. 224. FTE Annual Report – DELETED

<u>House</u> adds language requiring the department along with State Budget Office, once a year, to provide a more detailed FTE report along with salary and benefit cost and fund source information for each line item. <u>Senate</u> deletes this section. <u>Conference Committee</u> concurs with Senate.

Sec. 225. Pupil Membership Fraud - NEW

<u>House</u> adds language of intent that the State Superintendent of Public Instruction investigate and report on issues of pupil membership fraud, including the incidence of students being counted in membership but not remaining in the district for the remainder of the year. <u>Senate</u> concurs. <u>Conference Committee</u> revises such that the Superintendent reports on the scope of and proposed solutions to the problem.

Sec. 226. Lapse Report - NEW

<u>Senate</u> adds language requiring a report of the projected year-end General Fund Lapse amount for FY 2010 by Oct. 15, 2010. Conference Committee concurs with Senate.

Sec. 503. Teacher Preparation Programs - DELETED

Provides \$100,000 each for Central Michigan University alternative route to certification program and Wayne State University pathways to teaching program. Requires a reporting requirement for the programs including number of teachers certified, time served in the classroom, and teacher evaluations. Executive deletes. House and Senate maintain current language. Conference Committee eliminates funding and deletes this section.

Sec. 504. National Board Certification - DELETED

Requires the Department to pay 1/2 the application fee for teachers applying to the national board certification program. <u>Executive</u> deletes. <u>House and Senate</u> maintain current language. <u>Conference Committee</u> eliminates funding and deletes this section.

Sec. 602. Blue Ribbon Exemplary Schools - NOT INCLUDED

<u>House</u> adds language providing that out of the appropriation for school improvement operations, \$30,000 and 0.5 FTE is allocated to maintain the operation of the Blue Ribbon Exemplary Schools Program which recognizes achievement by exemplary schools. <u>Senate</u> deletes this section. <u>Conference Committee</u> concurs with Senate.

Sec. 802. Book Distribution Centers - NEW

Requires that the funds appropriated for book distribution centers be distributed equally to the public enrichment foundation and the Michigan friends of education. <u>House</u> adds language transferred from the DHAL budget. <u>Senate</u> does not include the library funding in this budget. <u>Conference Committee</u> concurs with House.

Sec. 803. Keep Library Functions together - NEW

<u>House</u> provides intent that in a reorganization of the Department of History, Arts, and Libraries the State maintain all the functions of the Library of Michigan together in a state department. <u>Senate</u> does not include the library funding in this budget. <u>Conference Committee</u> revises to provide intent that the Library of Michigan and its related programs be kept together in a state department.

Sec. 902. State School Nurse Consultant - NOT INCLUDED

<u>House</u> adds language providing that out of the appropriation for grants administration and school support services, \$95,000 and 1.0 FTE is allocated for a state school nurse consultant to collect and analyze school health data, develop guidelines and standards for school health personnel, and develop mechanisms for funding school nurse services. <u>Senate</u> deletes this section. Conference Committee concurs with Senate.

Sec. 903. Cyberschools - RETAINED

Requires MDE to report on barriers to the operation of cyberschools for special student populations including dropouts and expelled students. <u>Executive</u> and <u>House</u> delete. <u>Senate</u> restores this section. <u>Conference Committee</u> concurs with Senate.
