Overview

The FY 2008-09 Higher Education budget act contains four articles:

- · Article 1 contains a total summary unit for the bill.
- Article 2 covers Research Universities (Michigan State, University of Michigan-Ann Arbor, Wayne State).
- Article 3 covers State Universities (the remaining 12 public universities).
- Article 4 covers State and Regional Programs, the King-Chavez-Parks Program, and Financial Aid.

The FY 2009-10 Executive Recommendation utilizes subparts, rather than articles, to group line items into each category above. The House and Senate concur with the Executive Recommendation regarding this format.

Major Budget Changes From FY 2008-09 YTD Appropriations

1. University Operations

<u>Exec Rec</u> reduces operations appropriations to 15 public universities by 3.0% across the board (total reduction of \$43.9 million GF/GP) and removes \$2.6 million in funding built into university appropriations for King-Chavez-Parks (KCP) Programs. Total reduction of \$46.6 million GF/GP.

<u>House</u> concurs with 3.0% reduction (\$44.0 million), but not with KCP reductions. Replaces reduced GF/GP funding with funding from Education portion of State Fiscal Stabilization Fund (SFSF) under federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). Adds \$3.1 million to university line items for Indian Tuition Waiver costs, funded from General Government Services portion of SFSF.

<u>Senate</u> concurs with both sets of GF/GP reductions under Exec Rec. Partially offsets \$46.6 million in GF/GP reductions with \$40.5 million in SFSF funding, consistent with state's application to U.S. Department of Education. Net reduction of \$6.1 million—equating to a 0.4% net reduction to each university's operations line item. (Note: SFSF funding will be available for FY 2009-10 only.)

Other University Operations adjustments:

- <u>Exec Rec</u> removes \$100,000 GF/GP for allocation from Lake Superior State University's appropriation for Indian Tuition Waiver costs at Bay Mills College. <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> effectively retain funding.
- House adds \$29,700 GF/GP for similar allocation from Central Michigan University's appropriation for Indian Tuition Waiver costs at Saginaw Chippewa Tribal College. <u>Senate</u> concurs.

Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2008-09

Sec. 212. Payments to Universities - RETAINED

Provides for 11 monthly payments to universities. <u>Exec Rec</u> revisions: (1) Allows, rather than requires, withholding of payment if university fails to submit HEIDI data. (2) Eliminates requirement of fiscal agency report on appropriation procedures. <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> retain current-year provisions.

Sec. 214. Tuition Tax Credit - RETAINED

Requires universities to submit Tuition Tax Credit notification to fiscal agencies. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes; <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> retain.

Sec. 216. Postsecondary Student Data System - REVISED

Requires universities to report on steps being taken toward and challenges associated with development of student-level data that could be submitted to state data system. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes. <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> replace with language requiring universities to cooperate with state measures to meet ARRA requirement to develop P-16 longitudinal data system.

Sec. 217. Conflicts of Interest - DELETED

States intent that state university governing boards examine university operations for potential conflicts of interest. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes; <u>House</u> retains; <u>Senate</u> deletes.

Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2008-09

Sec. 301. State Competitive Scholarships - REVISED

Provides for distribution of funds appropriated for Competitive Scholarships. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes; <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> retain but delete statement of intent for 1.0% funding increase.

Sec. 302. Tuition Grants - REVISED

Provides for distribution of funds appropriated for Tuition Grants. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes. <u>House</u> retains but deletes statement of intent for 1.0% funding increase. <u>Senate</u> retains, deletes statement of intent for 1.0% funding increase, limits eligibility to undergraduate students, and limits awards to students at any single college/university to \$3.0 million.

Sec. 303. Work Study - DELETED

Provides for distribution of funds appropriated for Work Study. Exec Rec deletes; House retains; Senate deletes.

Sec. 304. College Access Grants - NOT INCLUDED

Establishes requirements for proposed College Access Grant Program to be administered by Michigan Higher Education Assistance Authority (MHEAA). Exec Rec adds new section; House and Senate do not include.

Sec. 309. Needs Analysis Criteria - RETAINED

Requires MHEAA to determine the needs analysis criteria for students to qualify for Competitive Scholarships and Tuition Grants. Exec Rec deletes; House and Senate retain.

Sec. 312. Nursing Scholarship - RETAINED

Provides for distribution of funds appropriated for Nursing Scholarships. Exec Rec deletes; House and Senate retain.

Sec. 314. Children of Veterans Tuition Grant Report - DELETED

Requires annual report on Children of Veterans Tuition Grant Program. <u>Exec Rec</u>, <u>House</u>, and <u>Senate</u> delete section. (Information included in larger report under Sec. 315 of bill.)

Sec. 315. Financial Aid Report - REVISED

Requires annual report on all state financial aid programs. <u>Exec Rec</u> moves report deadline from January 15 to March 31; House sets deadline at February 15; Senate sets deadline at February 14.

Sec. 316. Financial Aid Workgroup - NEW

States intent for workgroup to examine and make recommendations regarding state financial aid programs. <u>House</u> adds new section; Senate concurs and specifies organizations to be involved.

Sec. 317. Intent Regarding Tuition Grants - NEW

States intent that, if economy improves and state revenues increase, funding of Tuition Grants is one of foremost priorities in Higher Education budget. Senate adds new section.

Sec. 318. Intent Regarding Promise Grants - NEW

States intent that, if economy improves and state revenues increase, funding of Promise Grants is one of foremost priorities in Higher Education budget. Senate adds new section.

Sec. 402. Douglas Lake Biological Station - RETAINED

Designates University of Michigan Douglas Lake Biological Station as a unique resource. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes; <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> retain.

Sec. 405. Higher Education Database - DELETED

Provides for expenditure of funds appropriated for HEIDI database. Exec Rec and House retain; Senate deletes.

Sec. 426. Private Bookstores - REVISED

States intent regarding access to required textbook lists by private bookstores and use of funds in university-administered accounts by students at private bookstores. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes. <u>House</u> retains with minor revisions. <u>Senate</u> replaces with language stating intent that each public university establish a process to review university requirements for students to acquire textbooks and requiring report on efforts to establish such a process.

Sec. 433. Project GREEEN - REVISED

Allocates funds from Agricultural Experiment and Cooperative Extension line items for Project GREEN (Generating Research and Extension to meet Environmental and Economic Needs). Exec Rec revisions: (1) Allocation is increased from \$5.6 million to \$8.0 million and new allocation of \$8.0 million is added for Animal Agriculture Initiative. (2) Reporting requirements are expanded. House retains current Project GREEN allocation amount, does not include allocation amount for Animal Agriculture Initiative, and adds \$3.5 million allocation for bioeconomy research and development; concurs with expanded reporting requirements. Senate concurs with House, but includes statement of intent regarding bioeconomy research, rather than funding allocation.

Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2008-09

Sec. 434. Future Farmers of America - RETAINED

Requires Michigan State University to allocate \$80,000 from its appropriation to the Future Farmers of America Association. Exec Rec and House delete; Senate retains.

Sec. 436. Tuition Restraint - REVISED

States legislative intent that universities increase institutional financial aid expenditures by at least the same percentage as resident undergraduate tuition/fees. Exec Rec replaces language with stated expectation that universities receiving federal stimulus funds will not raise resident tuition/fee rates for remainder of FY 2008-09 or for FY 2009-10. House replaces language with requirement that funds appropriated from SFSF of ARRA be used to mitigate tuition/fee increases or modernize/renovate/repair facilities, consistent with ARRA provisions; requires report on use of funds. Senate concurs with House.

Sec. 450. Per-Student Funding Floor - RETAINED

States intent to allocate funds for per-student funding floor of \$3,775 from GF/GP balance at fiscal year-end. <u>Exec Rec</u> and House delete; Senate retains.

Sec. 451. Indian Tuition Waiver Costs - DELETED

States intent to allocate funds for unfunded Indian Tuition Waiver costs from GF/GP balance at fiscal year-end. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes; House retains; Senate deletes.

Sec. 460. Saginaw Chippewa Tribal College Allocation - NEW

Requires \$29,700 payment from Central Michigan's appropriation to Saginaw Chippewa Tribal College for costs of Indian Tuition Waiver Program. House adds new section; Senate concurs.

Sec. 461. Bay Mills Tribal College Allocation - RETAINED

Requires \$100,000 payment from Lake Superior State's appropriation to Bay Mills Tribal College for costs of Indian Tuition Waiver Program. Exec Rec deletes; House and Senate retain.

Sec. 462. Suicide Prevention - DELETED

States intent that universities develop an education program on preventing suicide and violence. <u>Exec Rec, House,</u> and <u>Senate</u> delete.

Sec. 463. Students from Macomb County - DELETED

Requires universities to report regarding outreach efforts to enroll students from Macomb County. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes; <u>House</u> retains; Senate deletes.

Sec. 464. Research Commercialization - REVISED

Requires universities to submit plan regarding research commercialization. <u>Exec Rec</u> removes prohibition on universities receiving allocation from Technology Commercialization Incentive Fund if plan is not submitted. <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> concur.

Sec. 467. Performance Standards - DELETED

States intent for Legislature to establish university performance standards. Exec Rec, House, and Senate delete.

Sec. 471. Timely Graduation - RETAINED

States intent that universities limit changes to general graduation requirements during a student's enrollment and provide counseling to facilitate timely graduation. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes; <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> retain.

Sec. 472. Payment Delay/Tuition Rates - DELETED

States intent that any university that increased its tuition rate based on the assumption it would not receive the delayed August 2007 payment rebate the tuition increase to its students. Exec Rec, House, and Senate delete.

Sec. 480. Veterans Policies - NEW

States intent that public universities consider all veterans residents of Michigan for purposes of determining tuition rates/fees and take other steps related to veterans assistance/transfer/enrollment. Senate adds new section.

Secs. 501-507. King-Chavez-Parks Program - RETAINED

Provides for expenditure/distribution of funds under six components of King-Chavez-Parks Program. <u>Exec Rec</u> deletes; House and Senate retain.

Sec. 701a. New Degree Programs - REVISED

Lists new degree programs established by state universities for which credit hours may be reported to HEIDI. <u>Exec Rec</u> and <u>House</u> delete. <u>Senate</u> adds new list of programs submitted by Presidents Council.

Sec. 715. Nursing Education - DELETED

Requires report from Department of Labor and Economic Growth (DELEG) on the status of nursing education in Michigan. <u>Exec Rec</u>, <u>House</u>, and <u>Senate</u> delete. (Similar report requirement included in DELEG bill.)
