REDIRECTION OF CERTAIN DRIVERS' LICENSE FEE REVENUE FROM TEDF TO STATE GENERAL FUND

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House Bills 5072 and 5073 as passed by the House

A SUMMARY OF HOUSE BILLS 5072 AND 5073 AS PASSED BY THE HOUSE 9-25-09

House Bill 5072 (H-1) would amend Section 11 of 1987 PA 231 (MCL 247.911), an act which created and governs the Transportation Economic Development Fund (TEDF). The TEDF is a state-restricted transportation fund created to help fund highway, road, and street improvements related to either a specific type of economic activity or a specific type of road system. The bill would reduce the amount allocated to the Targeted Industries program ("Category A") for the 2008-09 fiscal year by \$12 million to reflect in statute the reductions effected through Executive Order 2009-22.

House Bill 5073 (H-1) would amend Section 819 (MCL 257.819) of the Michigan Vehicle Code (1949 PA 300) to redirect to the state General Fund a portion of drivers' license fee revenue currently dedicated to the TEDF. The total amount to be redirected as shown in the bill is \$18 million. This amount represents \$12 million related to TEDF reductions made in Executive Order 2009-22. Public Act 346 of 2008 had previously redirected \$6 million in driver's license fees from the TEDF to the state General Fund in FY 2008-09. The bill simply reflects the total of \$18 million to be redirected to the General Fund in FY 2008-09 (\$6 million plus \$12 million).

The previous \$6 million amount for FY 2008-09 represented the amount that the TEDF was reduced for FY 2006-07 through Executive Order 2007-3. In effect, budgetary spending authority was reduced by \$6 million in FY 2006-07, but the actual shift of those funds to the state General Fund was not completed until FY 2008-09.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The bills would redirect \$12 million from the TEDF to the state General Fund (not counting the \$6 million that had already been redirected through Public Act 346 of 2008). The reduction in TEDF funding would be taken entirely from the TEDF "Target Industry" program (Category A). There would be no impact on total state revenue, simply a shift between a state-restricted fund and the state General Fund.
