## **OVERVIEW**

As passed by the House on September 30, 2009, House Bill 5403 contained appropriations restoring \$261.2 million in budget reductions adopted under various FY 2009-10 budget acts, funded from new state revenue that would be received through two new restricted funds under proposed statutory changes. Note that this document does not include information on the items included in the House-passed version of the bill. A separate HFA summary of the House-passed is available.

As passed by the Senate on January 14, 2010, House Bill 5403 contains various FY 2009-10 supplemental appropriations consistent with requests received from the State Budget Office (SBO), as well as two additional items in the Human Services budget not requested by the SBO. The appropriations in the bill total \$8.9 million, funded from federal (\$3.4 million), private (\$25,000), and state restricted (\$5.5 million) revenues, The bill has no impact on General Fund/General Purpose (GF/GP) appropriations.

The House concurred with the Senate-passed version of the bill, and the bill was signed into law as Public Act 2 of 2010.
