## SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 4337

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

(MCL 168.1 to 168.992) by adding section 496b.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 496B. (1) A PERSON WHO PREREGISTERS TO VOTE UNDER SECTION
- 2 496A SHALL BECOME A REGISTERED ELECTOR AT 17-1/2 YEARS OF AGE AND
- 3 BECOME ELIGIBLE TO VOTE AT THE FIRST ELECTION AFTER HE OR SHE
- 4 BECOMES 18 YEARS OF AGE.
- 5 (2) IMMEDIATELY UPON RECEIPT OF A PREREGISTRATION TO VOTE
- 6 APPLICATION, THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL TRANSMIT THE
- 7 PREREGISTRATION TO VOTE APPLICATION TO THE APPROPRIATE CITY OR
- 8 TOWNSHIP CLERK AND SHALL TRANSMIT THE ELECTRONIC DATA FOR THE
- 9 PREREGISTRATION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTER FILE. THE PREREGISTRATION TO
- 10 VOTE APPLICATION SHALL BE HELD IN A SEPARATE FILE AND SHALL NOT BE
- 11 MOVED TO THE MASTER FILE UNTIL THE PERSON WHO FILED THE

- PREREGISTRATION TO VOTE APPLICATION BECOMES 17-1/2 YEARS OF AGE. 1
- 2 (3) THE OUALIFIED VOTER FILE SHALL NOT INCLUDE THE NAME OF A
- 3 PERSON WHO PREREGISTERS TO VOTE ON A PRECINCT VOTER LIST BEFORE THE
- 4 PERSON BECOMES 18 YEARS OF AGE.
- 5 (4) IF A PERSON WHO PREREGISTERS TO VOTE CHANGES THE ADDRESS
- 6 THAT APPEARS ON HIS OR HER DRIVER LICENSE OR PERSONAL
- IDENTIFICATION CARD, THE PREREGISTRATION TO VOTE ADDRESS FOR THAT 7
- PERSON SHALL ALSO BE CHANGED. 8
- 9 (5) WHEN A PERSON WHO PREREGISTERS TO VOTE BECOMES 17-1/2
- 10 YEARS OF AGE, THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL SEND A NOTICE THROUGH
- 11 THE OUALIFIED VOTER FILE TO THE APPROPRIATE CITY OR TOWNSHIP CLERK
- DIRECTING THE CLERK TO SEND A VOTER IDENTIFICATION CARD TO THE 12
- 13 PERSON WHO PREREGISTERED TO VOTE.
- (6) THE CITY OR TOWNSHIP CLERK WHO RECEIVES A NOTICE FROM THE 14
- 15 SECRETARY OF STATE PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (5) SHALL SEND A VOTER
- 16 IDENTIFICATION CARD TO THE PERSON WHO PREREGISTERED TO VOTE AND
- 17 SHALL ADD THAT PERSON TO THE MASTER FILE.
- 18 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 19 unless House Bill No. 4261 of the 95th Legislature is enacted into
- 20 law.
