In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources in this appropriation act for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2010 is \$745,400.00 and state appropriations paid to local units of government are \$0.

Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized under this act and the departments, commissions, boards, offices, and programs for which appropriations are made under this act are subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101

- 3 Sec. 407. (1) The amount appropriated in part 1 and in part 1
- 4 of Enrolled House Bill No. 4436 of the 95th Legislature for
- 5 substance abuse prevention, education, and treatment grants shall
- 6 be expended for contracting with coordinating agencies.
- 7 Coordinating agencies shall work with CMHSPs or PIHPs to coordinate
- 8 care and services provided to individuals with severe and
- 9 persistent mental illness and substance abuse diagnoses.
- 10 (2) The department shall approve a fee schedule for providing
- 11 substance abuse services and charge participants in accordance with
- 12 their ability to pay.
