4	GENERAL SECTIONS
5	Sec. 201. In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of
6	article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending
7	from state resources in this appropriation act for the fiscal year
8	ending September 30, 2010 is \$0 and state appropriations paid to
9	local units of government are \$0.
10	Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized
11	under this act and the departments, commissions, boards, offices,
12	and programs for which appropriations are made under this act are
13	subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101
14	to 18.1594.
15	Sec. 211. The appropriation in part 1 to the racing
16	commissioner is intended to provide 46 additional horse racing
17	dates. From the amount appropriated in part 1 to the office of
18	racing commissioner, the Michigan gaming control board shall
19	provide all regulatory functions necessary for the conduct of pari-
20	mutuel horse racing as provided in Michigan law, including the
21	reimbursement of all Michigan department of agriculture laboratory
22	testing fees.
23	Sec. 212. The Michigan gaming control board, in conjunction
24	with the Michigan department of agriculture and each certified
25	horsemen's organization, shall report to the legislature on the

- 1 status and ongoing efforts to transfer the function of the office
- 2 of racing commissioner to the Michigan gaming control board
- 3 pursuant to Executive Order No. 2009-45. The report shall be
- 4 submitted on or before September 1, 2010 to the house and senate
- 5 appropriations subcommittees on agriculture and general government
- 6 and the house and senate fiscal agencies. The report shall include,
- 7 at a minimum, the following:
- 8 (a) Efforts to reform, streamline, and utilize the most
- 9 efficient and effective methods of regulating and promoting the
- 10 horse racing industry.
- 11 (b) Efforts to promote and support the horse racing industry
- 12 with the goal of increasing employment and expanded economic
- 13 activity associated with the horse racing industry.
- 14 (c) A comparison of Michigan with other states regarding both
- 15 regulation and promotion of the horse racing industry.
- Sec. 213. (1) The Michigan gaming control board shall use
- 17 actual verifiable cost data in determining the regulatory costs of
- 18 conducting racing dates and shall provide that data to each
- 19 certified horsemen's organization, the house and senate
- 20 appropriations subcommittees on agriculture and general government,
- 21 and the house and senate fiscal agencies. The Michigan gaming
- 22 control board shall not charge more than the actual cost of
- 23 conducting race dates. In determining actual costs of racing dates,
- 24 the Michigan gaming control board shall take into account the
- 25 regulatory requirements specific to each type and breed of horse
- 26 racing.
- 27 (2) If a certified horsemen's organization has paid for

- 1 additional race dates, and it is subsequently determined that
- 2 payment was greater than the actual cost, the Michigan gaming
- 3 control board shall refund to the certified horsemen's organization
- 4 the difference between the amount of payment and the actual cost.
